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# JOHNSON CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT MISSION STATEMENT



The mission of the Johnson City Police Department is the safeguarding of all citizens lives and property, the preservation of their constitutional rights, and to maintain a high standard of quality of life for all of Johnson City's residents and visitors. The police department will strive to develop a police service that meets unique neighborhood needs by combining law enforcement activities with progressive crime prevention strategies.



## UNIFORM PATROL DIVISION

The Uniform Patrol Division functions as the primary enforcement and crime prevention branch of the Police Department. The Patrol Division is the largest branch of the Department, and serves as the backbone of all police functions.

The Patrol Division is overseen by the Captain and is comprised of 2 Lieutenants, 3 Sergeants, and 19 Patrolman. In 2015, the Patrol Division handled over 13,000 calls for service, 4,300 officer-initiated services, and made over one thousand arrests.


The Uniform Patrol Division is first to respond to citizens' calls for assistance, and usually first to arrive at the scene of an occurrence requiring police action. The Patrol Division is deployed 24 hours a day divided into three 8 hour shifts.

Most citizens' only contact with the police is with a member of the Patrol Division. The public's perception of the effectiveness and professionalism of the Department is largely shaped by these contacts.






## UNIFORMED PATROL DIVISION QUICK CALLS & CALLS FOR SERVICE

## **NEW PATROL CAR GRAPHICS**



In early 2015, the JCPD Administration wished to re-brand the Department and introduced new car graphics. Several designs were drafted and the vote was casted by the Officers of the Department, which is the design seen on the streets today.

The new design bears several of the original markings, so that our cars are still 'familiar' however the most noticeable re-branding is the word "POLICE" on the doors which now incorporates the 'Thin Blue Line', a symbol common to Law Enforcement nationwide. The black background of the lettering commemorates fallen officers, which resonates with Johnson City due to the line of duty death of Officer David W. Smith, Jr. on March 31, 2014. The Thin Blue Line over the black background represents what our Officers work to protect for Johnson City residents every day, the barrier between anarchy and a civilized society, order and chaos, respect for decency and lawlessness. Together, the design elements symbolize the camaraderie we share as officers, and our dedication to preserving the peace for Johnson City residents.



## K-9 UNIT

The Johnson City Police Department's K-9 Unit is comprised of two K-9 teams. The K-9 Unit is used to conduct searches of buildings, wooded areas and other places to search for criminal suspects or missing persons. They are also used to detect the unlawful possession of narcotics, to assist with crowd control, and to retrieve articles of evidence.

In 2015, K-9 C.J., who had served with the JCPD since 2010, retired from Patrol Duties after his handler, Patrolman Berdine was reassigned to the Detective Division. Shortly after C.J.'s retirement, C.J. became ill and succumbed to his illness.





## **BIKE PATROL**

In 2015, Chief Dodge reinstated the Department's Bike Patrol detail. JCPD's first Bike Patrols started in 1994, but due to staffing reductions over previous years, the Bike Patrols were no longer assigned. Chief Dodge recognized that Bike Patrols are an effective tool that allows officers to get out of the patrol car and into the community face to face thus deterring and reducing crime and improving community policing efforts with residents, business owners, and the many visitors that come to Johnson City. The bike patrols are highly visible, and are able to move about the congested urban area more freely. They are also able to access Village Parks where motorized patrol cars cannot go.

In June 2015, three officers successfully completed a vigorous five-day Police Mountain Bike School in Ithaca, NY. Bike Patrol details are now being assigned during summer months when shift staffing permits. The Bike Patrols pay special attention to the Main St business district and also patrol the Johnson City Parks.





### **DETECTIVE DIVISION**

The Johnson City Police Department's Detective Bureau is comprised of a Detective Lieutenant who oversees the Criminal Investigations Division, the Narcotics Division, the Juvenile Division, and the Evidence Division.

## **Criminal Investigations:**

The Criminal Investigation Division consists of a Detective Sergeant, three Detectives, and an administrative assistant all overseen by the Detective Lieutenant. The Division is responsible for a wide range of tasks. Detective duties include the investigation of all serious felonies including homicides, felony assaults, white collar crimes, sex crimes, and felony property crimes. The division also investigates misdemeanor crimes and offenses that require more investigative time and manpower that can't be fulfilled by the Patrol Division. The Detective duties also include subpoena service, background investigations, internal investigations, warrant service, and other ancillary duties.

#### Notable 2015 Cases:

## **JULY 2015**

In mid July, the Johnson City Police Department responded to a parking garage collapse on Baldwin Street at the United Health Services Wilson Memorial Hospital complex. The second floor of the two story garage collapsed onto the lower level thereby crushing numerous vehicles. It was unknown at the time whether or not anybody had become entrapped, injured, or killed as a result. Johnson City Police officers secured the area and established incident command. Members of the JCPD tracked down and made contact with the owners of numerous crushed and trapped vehicles to verify that everyone who could have been in those vehicles was accounted for. Numerous private and public entities responded to assist at the collapse. Fortunately, this catastrophe only caused substantial property damage and no loss of life or injuries were sustained.

#### AUGUST 2015

In mid August, several males forcibly entered a residence on Burbank Avenue armed with a handgun, stun gun, and a machete in an effort to rob the occupants of drugs and money. After the suspects entered the residence, one of the

suspects fired one (1) shot from a handgun at the resident narrowly missing him. The suspects restrained the victims in chairs. While restrained, one of the victims was stun gunned and pistol whipped, and the other victim was able to successfully flee which caused the suspects to give chase. The suspects ultimately fled the scene after stealing a quantity of drugs, cash, and a cell phone. An investigation quickly led to the identification and arrest of four (4) males who were charged with Burglary 1<sup>st</sup> Degree, Menacing 2<sup>nd</sup> Degree and Criminal Possession of a Weapon.

## SEPTEMBER 2015

In September, the Johnson City Police Department was notified of an infant child that was brought into the Emergency Room not breathing and without a pulse. The infant was resuscitated by medical staff and transferred to an upstate Pediatric ICU for further treatment. After investigation by Johnson City Police Detectives, the father of the child, Ngozi A. Feurtado, age 20 of Johnson City NY, is accused of subjecting his infant to physical abuse thereby causing the baby to sustain a serious brain injury. Feurtado was arrested and charged with Reckless Assault on a Child. Feurtado is awaiting further Broome County Court action.

### SEPTEMBER 2015

In late September two males forcibly entered a residence on Baker Street, displayed a handgun and robbed and assaulted the occupant. Two individuals were quickly apprehended with the help of citizens and a police investigation. Johnson City Police arrested Aaron Bugayov and Joseph P. Shindyaklov. Police also recovered a .22 caliber handgun that had a defaced serial number. Bugayov was charged with Burglary 1<sup>st</sup>, Criminal Possession of a Weapon 3<sup>rd</sup> and Criminal Obstruction of Breathing. Shindyaklov was charged with Burglary 1<sup>st</sup>, Criminal Possession of a Weapon 3<sup>rd</sup> and Assault 3<sup>rd</sup>.

#### OCTOBER 2015

In October, Johnson City Patrol Officers were dispatched for an apartment building fire at 145 Floral Avenue. Upon arrival, it was found that a family in the third floor apartment was trapped by the fire. One occupant managed to escape by jumping from a third floor window; however, two small children were not able to escape and did not survive. Based on witness accounts, a fire investigation, and forensic evidence, it was determined that the fire was intentionally set. As a result of an extensive investigation by Johnson City Police Detectives, Dwight Burton, age 38 of Johnson City, was arrested and is accused of intentionally setting fire to the apartment building occupied by his ex-girlfriend and others causing the death of 2 small children and severely burning two adult females. Burton has been indicted on the following: one count of first-degree arson, three counts of first-degree murder, two counts of second-degree murder, one count of second-degree attempted murder, two-counts of first-degree assault and one count of aggravated criminal contempt. Burton is incarcerated at the Broome County Jail pending further court action.

## NARCOTICS DIVISION

The Johnson City Police Department is partnered with the Broome County Special Investigations Unit Task Force (BCSIUTF). The JCPD employs a Detective Sergeant and a Detective on the Task Force who join members of the Broome County Sheriff's Office, Binghamton Police Department, and the Endicott Police Department. Together, the investigators work together to combat narcotic crimes and to conduct other special investigations.

In 2015, the two Johnson City members of the SIU Task Force accounted for 84 arrests and executed 24 search warrants in the Village of Johnson City. (Does not account for search warrants executed or people arrested within the Village by other members of BCSIUTF).

#### **Notable 2015 Narcotics Cases:**

## February 2015

71 Endicott Ave Kenneth Jenkins and Alex Rodriguez arrested for several felonies and misdemeanors each. Cocaine, crack cocaine, MDMA, heroin, marihuana, and counterfeit money located. Rodriguez also wanted out of New Jersey for dangerous drugs warrant.

## **April 2015**

Members of the BCSIUTF executed a search warrant at a local hotel in Johnson City. Daniel L Brown of NYC was arrested for CPCS 3<sup>rd</sup> after he was found in possession of 300 packages of heroin.

## **JUNE 2015**

Members of the JCPD Patrol and Detective Divisions along with members of the BCSIUTF arrested Travis Bloch of NYC. Bloch was wanted by the NYPD for several shootings including one homicide of a 14 year old male. Acting on a tip that Bloch may be in the area; Bloch was observed by Detectives on Main St and was apprehended following a short foot pursuit.

JCPD and BCSIUTF responded to several meth lab incidents within the Village in 2015. All of the meth lab incidents which were responded to resulted in the persons responsible being arrested for numerous offenses. This area has seen an increase in methamphetamine incidents due to the rise in the manufacturing technique commonly referred to as the "One Pot Method." JCPD has taken notice of the increase and its members have received additional training relating to this topic; so that officers and detectives may sooner recognize signs of meth labs.

The JCPD remains vigilant when dealing with narcotics and wants to remind residents to contact the BCSIUTF at 607-778-3941 with any information relating to narcotic activity.

## **JUVENILE DIVISION**

The Juvenile Division consists of Criminal Detective who, in addition to his normal duties, is also assigned to handle and investigate crimes involving suspects under the age of 16. New York State handles Juvenile Offenders and Delinquents in a different manner and with other processes than that of an adult. The Juvenile Detective has a good working knowledge of how to handle juvenile cases.

#### Notable 2015 Juvenile Cases

### OCTOBER 2015

In October, Johnson City Police Detectives investigated two separate burglaries to the Islamic Center of the Southern Tier located on Grand Avenue in Johnson City. Based on the recovery of fingerprint evidence at the scene, a positive identification of an adult male subject led to his arrest. Further investigation into the burglaries also resulted in the arrest of two (2) juveniles who were determined to be involved in both burglaries.

### OCTOBER 2015

JCPD responded to a fire at the Old Stag Hotel located at 73 Baldwin Street Johnson City, NY. That fire was later determined to be caused by arson. After a criminal investigation, JCPD detectives were able to identify and charge two (2) juvenile males with having intentionally set the fire at this location. Both juveniles were sent to Broome County Family Court to answer the charges.

## **EVIDENCE/PROPERTY DIVISION**

The Evidence Division consists of a part-time Property Clerk/Evidence Technician who has primary responsibilities but is also backed up by two other members of the Detective Division who are crossed trained and able to fulfill duties in the Evidence/Property room in the absence of the Property Clerk/Evidence Technician.


After the implementation of the new part-time Property Clerk/Evidence Technician position, the Evidence Technician has been involved in numerous investigations which resulted in several arrests based on fingerprint and/or DNA identification.

The Evidence Technician is responsible for handling and maintaining the submission of over 2,000 items of new evidence collected by JCPD Officers in 2015. In addition to the handling of newly submitted evidence, the Evidence Technician has also reviewed thousands of items of evidence from previous years to determine if the items should be retained or disposed of properly. As a result of the extensive research, the Evidence Technician was able to return over 200 items to the lawful owners, destroy over 850 items of illegal contraband, and donated or auctioned numerous other unclaimed property. This task is crucial in the ongoing maintenance of the Property Room to be able to purge evidence and property from older cases in order to free up storage space for new incoming evidence and property.


The Evidence Technician has also trained personnel in the identification of latent fingerprint evidence and how to properly secure DNA from crime scenes. This will undoubtedly result in more successful resolutions to criminal investigations. The evidence technician has also created a forensic collection kit to be used by officers in the field. This kit will enhance our ability to preserve evidence and conduct more effective criminal investigations.

The JCPD is also sending a Detective to an Evidence Technician/Photography school in 2016. This will enhance the evidence/property room efficiency by allowing a trained Detective to be available for crime scene processing 24 hours a day, which the Department has not had for the past several years.

### METRO S.W.A.T.

The Johnson City Police Department is a part of the Metro S.W.A.T. multijurisdictional team which is comprised of members of the Johnson City, Binghamton, and Vestal Police Departments. The Metro S.W.A.T. Team is the primary tactical team to respond to incidents in the Village of Johnson City, City of Binghamton, and the Town of Vestal. The highly trained members of the Metro S.W.A.T. Team respond to high-risk situations, such as hostage situations, barricaded suspects, and search warrant executions.

The JCPD has 4 members on the team. Selection for the team is competitive and based on marksmanship, physical fitness, and decision making skills. The team undergoes extensive weekly training.

In 2015, Metro S.W.A.T. Team became certified by the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services, 1 of only 5 teams to receive such certification in the State. This certification comes after a two-year application process, and means that the team has met extensive standards in command and control, physical fitness, firearm qualifications, team and individual equipment requirements, and high intensity training. The training included a four-week SWAT school, advanced sniper school, and U.S. Department of Homeland Security and incident command schools.



## **COMMENDATIONS AND AWARDS**

In 2015, Patrolman Louis Cioci received the State's highest commendation by being awarded the New York State Police Officer of the Year by Governor Andrew Cuomo. The award comes from Patrolman's Cioci's incredible bravery, presence of mind and professionalism under the extreme duress during the tragic shooting incident that occurred on March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2014 that claimed the life of Patrolman David W. Smith, Jr.

Chief Brent Dodge said, "There is no doubt in my mind or the minds of men and women who witnessed the event that Patrolman Cioci's heroic actions and unparalleled performance under some of the most stressful conditions imaginable saved the lives of many innocent New Yorkers that morning.

The Monument was purchased by the Johnson City Police Association which was made possible through donations and fundraising events. The Police Association donated the Monument to the Village of Johnson City.










## NATIONAL POLICE WEEK Washington, DC



In the weeks following graduation, Officer Furman completed her Field Training and utilized her training to serve and protect the residents and businesses of Johnson City.






## TOTAL DEPARTMENT PROPERTY CRIMES AND ARRESTS

These lock-up statistics constitute a prisoner who is lockedup for several hours or overnight after arrest awaiting arraignment, a process of which consists of the prisoner being screened for suicide risk, booking procedures, and being placed in a personal cell. A police officer is also detailed to the prisoner watch for the duration of the lock-up. The majority of our other prisoners are placed in a group holding room for a short period of time until they are either released on an appearance ticket or arraigned in court shortly after arrest.
