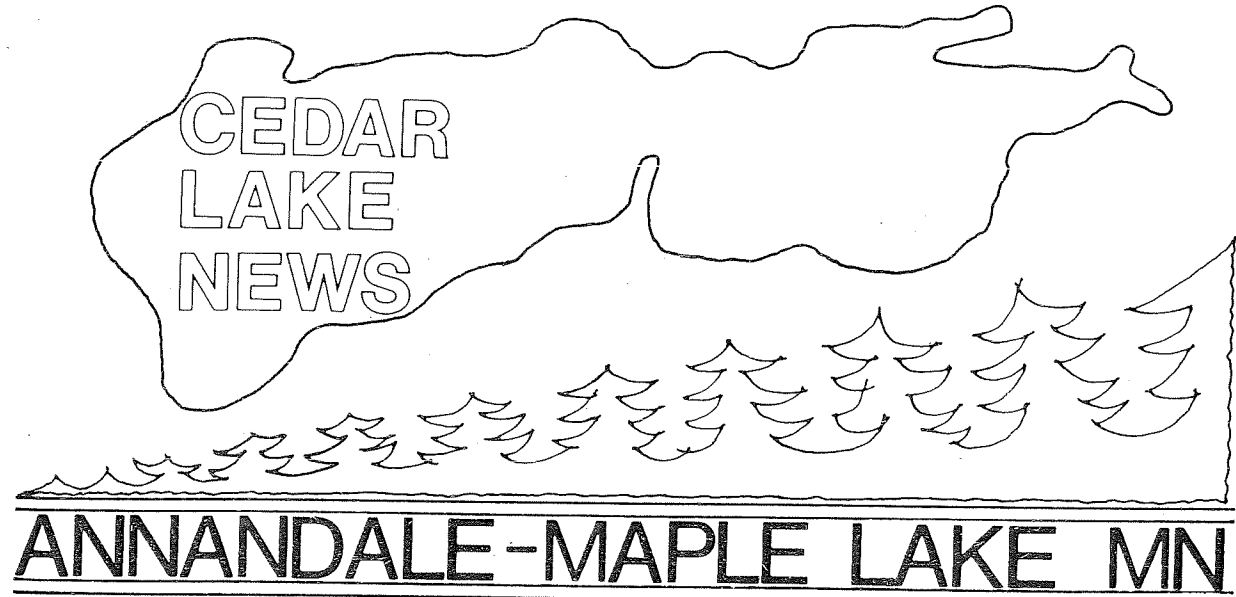

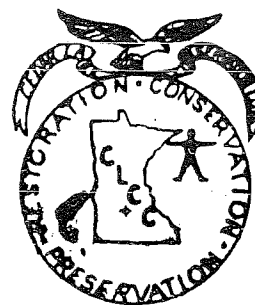

THE PRESIDENT SEZ - - - - -

UPON INVITATION, I ATTENDED THE MEETING OF THE CLEARWATER PROPERTY OWNERS ASSOCIATION ON JUNE 19, 1976, AT SAINT IGNATIUS CHURCH. SENATOR JOHN BERNHAGEN WAS THERE TO ANSWER QUESTIONS ABOUT THE LEGISLATION HE INTRODUCED IN REGARDS TO THE CLEARWATER RIVER WATERSHED. JOHN BERNHAGEN IS OPPOSED TO THE FORMATION OF THE WATERSHED. AS YOU MEMBERS MAY RECALL IN 1975 THE CEDAR LAKE CONSERVATION CLUB BOARD OF DIRECTORS VOTED TO SUPPORT THE FORMATION OF THE CLEARWATER RIVER WATERSHED. THE WATERSHED HAS BEEN THE SUBJECT OF MUCH CONTROVERSY. ONE OF THE MOST VOCAL POINTS OF OPPOSITION HAVE BEEN THE FARMERS AND RESIDENTS WHO OPPOSE THE MILL INCREASE AND ALSO INDIVIDUALS WHO OPPOSE THE NEW LEVEL OF BUREAUCROCY A WATERSHED CREATES. SEVERAL REPRESENTATIVES FROM LAKE SYLVIA AND OTHER SURROUNDING LAKES WERE ALSO PRESENT. IT WAS AN INTERESTING PRESENTATION AND I WAS IMPRESSED BY THE LARGE TURNOUT AT THIS MEETING. I HOPE WE WILL HAVE AS GOOD A REPRESENTATION AT OUR SUMMER MEETING IN JULY.

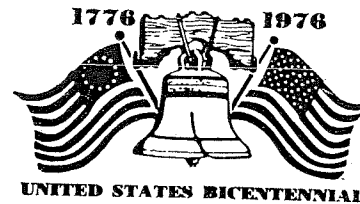

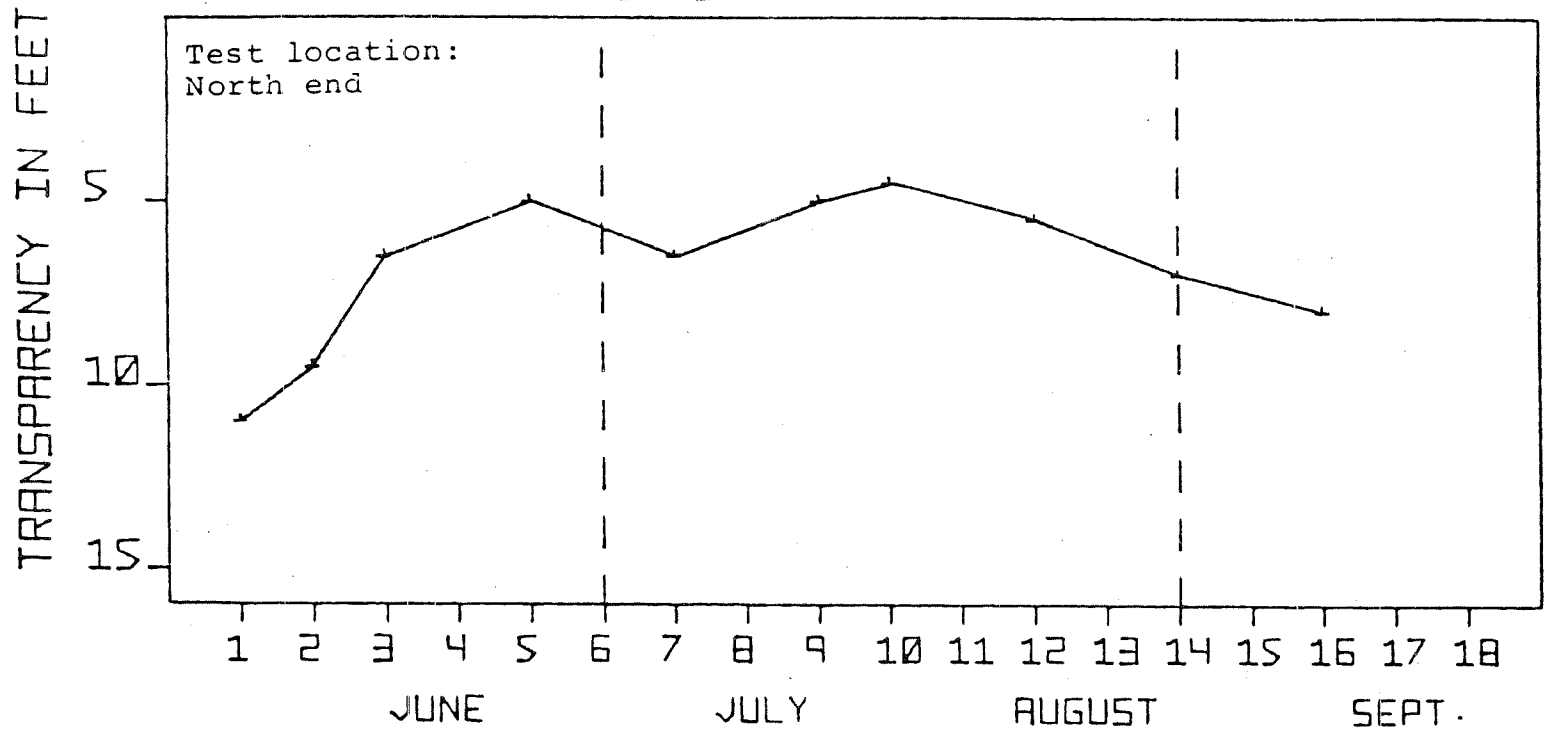

CONCLUSION OF SECOND YEAR WATER CLARITY TESTS
BY CLARENCE HEGG - JUNE 15, 1976

ALTHOUGH CEDAR LAKE SHOWED A SLIGHT IMPROVEMENT IN WATER CLARITY OVER THE PREVIOUS YEAR, THE GAIN WAS SO SLIGHT IT WAS HARDLY NOTICEABLE. TO BE SURE, A LITTLE GAIN IS BETTER THAN NO GAIN AT ALL. THE AVERAGE DEPTH AT WHICH THE SECCHI DISC DISAPPEARED, DURING THE MONTHS OF JULY AND AUGUST OF LAST YEAR AVERAGED OUT AT FIVE FEET, AS COMPARED TO 4.5 FEET IN 1974. IN COMPARISON WITH SEVERAL OTHER LAKES, NOT EXACTLY IN THIS VICINITY. OUR FINDINGS ARE ON RECORD WITH THE WATER RESEARCH DEPARTMENT OF THE U OF M AND ALSO WITH THE STATE POLLUTION CONTROL AGENCY.

YOU MAY WONDER IF THESE TESTS WILL BRING ANY CORRECTIVE MEASURES? IN ANSWER TO THAT, PURE WATER CONDITIONS WILL NOT COME ALL AT ONCE. HOWEVER, THERE ARE GOOD FORCES AT WORK CONSTANTLY, ALERTING THE PUBLIC OF HARMFUL PRODUCTS AND BAD PRACTICES AS FAR AS WATER POLLUTION IS CONCERNED. IN A FEW YEARS, GOOD RESULTS WILL BE NOTICEABLE. ALSO, WE NOW HAVE A MEASURING STICK, SO TO SPEAK, TO WHICH FUTURE WATER CLARITY CAN BE COMPARED, FOR EXAMPLE, A 10 FOOT AVERAGE IN THE MONTHS OF JULY AND AUGUST, TWO OR THREE YEARS FROM NOW, WOULD INDEED BE GOOD NEWS FOR OUR LAKE DWELLERS. ALSO, IF THE READINGS SHOULD GET WORSE WE WOULD HAVE CAUSE FOR CONCERN.

IN CONCLUSION, AS WE HAVE ALL EXPERIENCED OUR WEATHER CONDITIONS OVER THE PAST TWO OR THREE YEARS HAVEN'T BEEN CONDUSIVE TO GOOD WATER CONDITIONS. LACK OF RAIN AND LONG PERIODS OF EXCESSIVE HEAT CONTRIBUTE TO STAGNANT WATER. TO MAINTAIN FRESHNESS, A PERIODIC EXCHANGE OF WATER IS ABSOLUTELY NECESSARY. IN THE CASE OF CEDAR LAKE, MOST OF THE WATER REMAINS TRAPPED BEHIND THE DAM EXCEPT FOR THE AMOUNT WHICH OVERFLOWS AFTER A RAIN. THE DAM IS NECESSARY TO KEEP THE WATER LEVEL AT A FAVORABLE HEIGHT.

FOOTNOTE: THE SECCHI DISC IS A ROUND, FLAT, METAL DISC, 8 INCHES IN DIAMETER, PAINTED WHITE, AND FASTENED TO A CALIBRATED ROPE. WHEN LOWERED INTO THE WATER, ONE CAN EASILY READ THE DEPTH AT WHICH THE DIS DISAPPEARS.

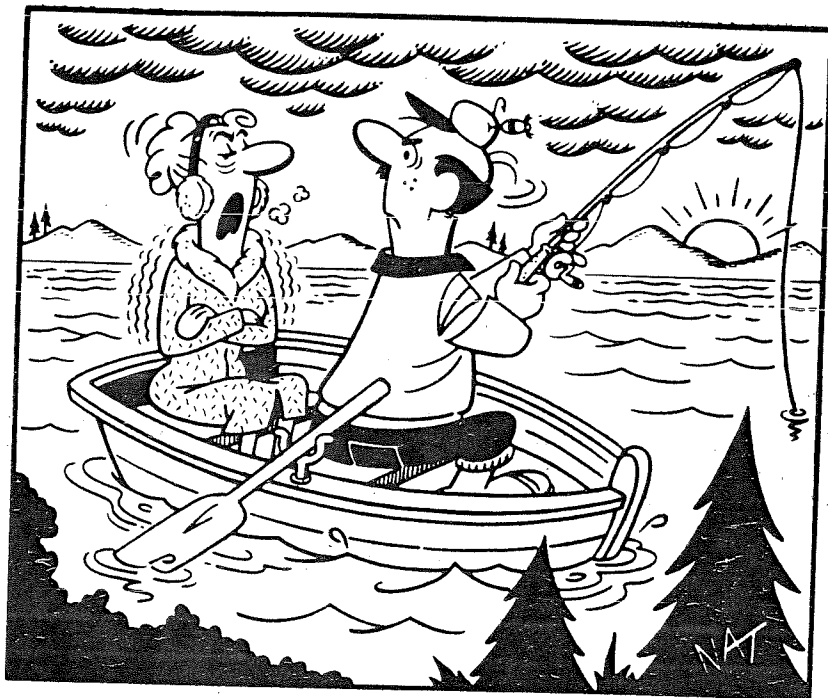
RECIPE CORNER

CHOCOLATE DREAM BARS

- 1/2 CUP BUTTER
- 1/2 CUP SHORTENING
- 1 CUP BROWN SUGAR
- 2 CUPS FLOUR
- 1 EGG
- 1 TSP VANILLA
- 1 PKG SEMI-SWEET CHOCOLATE CHIPS

CREAM BUTTER, SHORTENING AND SUGAR; ADD EGG, VANILLA AND MIX WELL. STIR IN FLOUR. PRESS 1/4 INCH THICK ON A COOKIE SHEET. BAKE IN 375° OVEN ABOUT 12 MINUTES. SPRINKLE CHOCOLATE CHIPS ON TOP. RETURN PAN TO OVEN UNTIL CHIPS ARE MELTED. SPREAD EVENLY - SPRINKLE WITH A FEW CHOPPED WALNUTS, CUT INTO BARS WHILE WARM.
