

Carmen Caruso, on the SW end of the Lake, lost an inner tube. If you found a stray tube floating by, would you call Carmen. 274-3857. Thank you.



Kale Danberg, our friend on the east side of the lake, thought we would enjoy reading about his friend who stayed all summer long at Lankinen's Resort.

A FORMER CEDAR LAKE RESIDENT NAMED FOREIGN FINN OF THE YEAR:

Robert "Bobby" Selvala, of Owatonna, MN, whose family spent their summers at a cabin on (Joe) Lankinen's Resort (east shore - middle lake east & a bit south of the sandbar), was named "Foreign Finn of the Year (1993)" by the President of Finland.

Uncle Ed, Bobby's uncle bought the two small resort cabins on the hill when Lankinen sold out. Bob still owns those cabins (for sentimental reasons he say's) but does not come up very often.

Bob Selvala, Kale Danberg's best friend when they were growing up, earned his award for developing and managing "FinnFest, USA", an annual ethnic festival celebrating Finnish culture in the United States. This festival, which attracts Finnish-Americans from all over the United States, began in Minneapolis in August of 1983, and every year meets in different places throughout the United States.

Besides Minneapolis the 4 day event has been held in Fitchburg, Mass, Suomi College (the only US college founded by Finnish-Americans) in Hancock, (upper peninsula) Michigan, Berkeley, CA, Detroit, MI (where it attracted 3500 participants), Newark, Delaware (5000 attendees), Seattle, Washington (4000 attendees) Lake Worth, FL, Duluth, MN and other major areas of the country.

With his involvement in Finn Fest, Bob has traveled to Finland several times where he has personally met the President of Finland.

During the years that Bobbie and Kale chummed around together at Cedar Lake, from 1939 through 1950, many along that shore were "Finlanders" and Finish "talk" and saunas were the rule rather than the exception. It was a time when males and females, young and old, would come charging out of the old, wood burning, saunas, totally nude and you could almost see and hear the steam as the well heated bodies hit the cold water.

Anyway - we thought you'd find it interesting and fun to learn about an earlier resident of Cedar lake who achieved the title, Foreign Finn of the year!



PERSONAL WATERCRAFT (Jet Skis) LAWS

All personal watercraft are considered motorboats and threrfore, any regulations that govern other motorboats (such as fishing boats, cabin cruisers, etc.), also govern personal watercraft.

*Anyone operating or riding on a personal watercraft must wear a U.S. Coast Guard approved Type I,II,II or V personal flotation device (PFD or life jacket). *You may not operate a personal watercraft between sunset and 8:00 a.m. the following day. *You may not travel at greater than a slow - no wake speed, within 100 feet of any shoreline, dock, swimmer, swimming raft, any moored or anchored watercraft, or non-motorized watercraft at any time. (Slow - no wake is. the slowest possible speed necessary to maintain steerage, but in no case greater than five miles per hour. *If you tow a person on water skis, or any other device, there must be an additional person on board the personal watercraft to act as an observer. (The observer does not have to be facing backward.) The skier/kneeboarder etc. must also be wearing a PFD or there must be one on board the personal watercraft for the skier.

Factory-installed or factory-specified wide-field rearview mirrors are allowed instead of an observer when pulling a skier or other device (tube,kneeboard, etc.). The mirrors must be specified by personal watercraft manufacturer. After-market mirrors, stick-on mirrors, motorcycle mirrors, etc, do not qualify for the observer exemption.

- * You may not operate a personal watercraft if any part of the spring-loaded throttle system has been removed or tampered with so it interferes with the return-to-idle system.
- * You may not chase or harass wildlife.
- * You may not travel through emergent or floating vegetation at greater than slow-no wake speed.
- * You may not operate a personal watercraft in a manner that unreasonably or unnecessarily endangers life, limb or property.
- * You may not weave through congested watercraft traffic, or jump the wake of another watercraft within 100 feet of the other watercraft. This includes other personal watercraft.

LICENSING FOR CANOES, KAYAKS, PADDLE BOATS

Is required if the length is more than 9 feet. Length is measured from the top of a pontoon to the rear of the pontoon. Example: An Arcoa paddle boat.

Also, PFD's are required. A cushion is only to sit on.


