



GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

APPLICABLE TO ALL EXHIBITORS:

1. All exhibitors agree to accept these regulations and any regulations pertaining to a department when entering. Please call (928) 899-6056 if you have any questions.
2. All exhibits must conform with special regulations of the proper department. Agriculture, Horticulture, and Floriculture must be grown by the exhibitor. Any entry (except livestock) that has been previously shown at the Yavapai Fair shall be disqualified. A "professional" is anyone who sells said item from his home or business and makes 50% or more of his income from said activity. "Junior" or "Youth" is a person 18 years or younger as of the first day of the fair, unless otherwise specified within the department.
3. Online Entry is available at (www.yavapaifair.com), In Addition to Online Entry we can accept Entries at the Fair office from Aug 1st – Entry Deadline. (Excluding All Livestock)
4. Every entry shall be entered in the name of the owner and/or the person who created the item and be residents of Yavapai County. You also must have planted and grown in Yavapai County for Floriculture/Horticulture.
5. All judges will be selected by the Fair and the awards of the judges will be accepted by entrants. **JUDGES will make no award where, in their opinion, the exhibit is not worthy, regardless of number of exhibits in the Division or Class.** No exhibitor shall interfere in any way, either by making suggestions or arguing with a judge. In any violation of this rule, the exhibitor will be barred from exhibition and will forfeit premiums and entry fees. In the event of a dispute, the decision of the Fair Committee **of Yavapai County Fair** will be final.
6. All exhibitors will be expected to remove their exhibits or plan for removal with the coordinators of the proper department on Sunday of the Completion of Fair **NOT BEFORE 6:00 P.M AND UP TO 7:00 P.M** (Picking Up your Item prior to the Pickup Times
7. THE FAIR WILL TAKE EVERY PRECAUTION TO GIVE PROPER CARE AND PROTECTION OF EXHIBITS BUT WILL NOT ACCEPT RESPONSIBILITY FOR LOSS OR DAMAGE TO ANY EXHIBIT OR PERSON. Any property left over two (2) days after closing of Fair becomes the property of the Yavapai Fair and may be disposed of.
8. **Premiums will be paid by the Yavapai Fair. Unclaimed monies & Checks not cashed within 90 days of the Date of Check Issued will be forfeited.**
9. Online Entries are allowed 1 FREE Yavapai County Fair pass. The pass is to be used only by the exhibitor. One pass only will be issued regardless of how many entries you have.
10. Open School Exhibits will NOT be given a free pass for students, teachers, or Administrators of the School
11. Judging will be in the Danish style. Which means there may be more than 1 blue, red, white, and honorable mention ribbon per class and division. 5 or more entries in one class can be split to a separate Division upon discretion of the Fair Committee of Yavapai County Fair
12. Check-Out – NO EXHIBIT can be picked up or removed prior to 6:00pm on the Sunday of Fair. There is no EXCEPTION – Removal of an exhibit early can cause for future disqualification.
13. Premium Book updates will be made at the discretion of the board as needed. Changes will be reflected on the website. The website most current changes will supersede any printed copy of the Premium book.

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

Exhibits must have been grown in Yavapai County by a Yavapai County resident.

Each person may make as many entries as desired, but only one entry in each class: for example, as many onions in the Onion division as desired, but only one each in Class 1 Pearl, Class 2 Bermuda, Class 3 Red, etc.

Each exhibitor will be entitled to ONE fair entry pass regardless of how many entries the person has.

There are no entry fees in the Horticulture Department.

All entries must be free of disease and insect injury. Superintendents or the Fair will not be held liable for loss or damage to exhibits left after this time. Any entries left become the property of the Fair and may be discarded

Exhibits will be displayed on uniformly sized plates furnished by the Fair. All exhibits will be cared for in an efficient manner but in no case will the Yavapai Fair be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.

All classes are judged on market standards of size, uniformity, and presentation. If there are not enough entries in a class to provide adequate competition, closely related classes may be combined at the discretion of the Judge and Superintendents. It is the sole discretion of the Judge whether the exhibits are awarded first, second, or third ribbons. No exhibitors may be present during judging.

Awards:

Awards: Judging will be in the Danish style. The Danish Judging System is Judged on Merit of Standards. So, all Blue-Ribbon quality will receive a Blue Ribbon, Red Ribbon quality will receive a Red Ribbon, White Ribbon quality will receive a White Ribbon. Then a Best of Class will be award for Each Class, Best of Division for Division Winners, then a Best of Show for Common Areas. 5 or more entries in one class can be split to a separate Division upon discretion of the Fair Committee of Yavapai County Fair
