Father Gabriel's Reflection for the 6th Sunday Yr B

Beloved Parish Family of St. Anselm, who are the Lepers of today?

Leprosy has pretty much been eradicated from contemporary society, but in Jesus' day, it was the most dreaded of all illnesses (like Covid-19 or HIV/AIDS). Excerpts from Leviticus 13 describe the social stigma attached to lepers as "unclean," forcing them to live at the margin of society. Today, ancient Jewish purity laws sound confusing and are often the source of anti-Semitism. Leprosy at the time was an incredibly tragic condition that isolated people from loved ones and society.

The episode in today's Gospel is altogether extraordinary. The leper was out of line when approached Jesus to seek a cure. He had no business leaving his place of exile to go where people gathered. Jesus not only welcomed the man; he reached out and touched him. This poor, disfigured person did not repulse him. Indeed, anyone who touched a leper was rendered Levitically unclean, which meant that he was unfit for worship. Jesus implicitly rejected such legislation and declared that charity is higher than any law.

In a health-obsessed culture in which the ancient attribution of illness to sin is now modernized by attributing it to a faulty lifestyle, the story of Job, a righteous sufferer, breaks the link between suffering and guilt and permits people to lament before their God. A Jesus who enacts God's reign among his time's broken and marginal people is an enduring challenge for contemporary society and the Church.

In an atmosphere of relativism and ambivalence, the interpretation and understanding of marginality can be very interesting. In the Catholic world, for example, the catch words today are mercy, inclusion, welcome. Yet, some Catholics are very hostile to other Catholics who attend the Traditional Latin Mass, and vice versa, while at the same time, preaching cooperation with Muslims and other faiths – quite interesting.

My experiences as a priest born and raised in Africa have enabled me to see the compassionate words and touch of Jesus in those people here who try to make me feel welcome rather than focus on my mannerisms and different mentality. I see the words and touch of Jesus in those who see legal immigrants from other nations not as social danger and a threat but as fellow humans who are running from war and want to find a better life just like all others who came from Europe or anywhere.

In our day, miracles of healing are often a compassionate word or touch and welcome to all by the family of the Church. As we begin the holy season of Lent in the coming week, let us pray that modern lepers will have the courage to shout for help and that we all will have the courage of Jesus to break loose and help them, especially those burdened by the leprosy of sin, Amen.

Lent Begins on February 14

Ash Wednesday is February 14, and Easter is March 31. Our Ash Wednesday Masses will be at

8:30am, 12:00pm and 7:00pm. Our weekday Mass schedule during Lent is Monday-Friday at 8:30am. Fr. Gabriel will offer the Stations of the Cross on all Friday evenings, during Lent, at 7:00pm followed by a get-to-know Fr. Gabriel opportunity in the Hall on the first Friday of Lent, February 16.

As we approach Lent, be aware of the following:

-Lenten Regulations: -Abstinence: Everyone 14 years of age and older is bound to abstain from meat on ASH WEDNESDAY, the FRIDAYS of Lent, and GOOD FRIDAY. -Fast: Everyone 18 years of age and older but under the age of sixty is also bound to fast on ASH WEDNESDAY and GOOD FRIDAY. On these two days, the law of fast allows one full meal a day, but does not prohibit taking some food during the day, so long as this does not constitute another full meal. Drinking liquids during the day is permitted. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. In doubt concerning fast or abstinence, a priest should be consulted. In the spirit of penance, the faithful should not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation.
