

Father Gabriel's Reflection for the 1st Sunday of Lent Yr B

Beloved Parish Family of St. Anselm,

We are celebrating the first Sunday of the Lenten season that encourages Christians to set out on a path of preparation for Easter. The Gospel reminds us that Jesus, after being baptized in the river Jordan and impelled by the Holy Spirit, withdrew for 40 days into the Desert of Judea, where he overcame the temptations of Satan (cf. Mk 1: 12-13). Christians also enter the Lenten desert in Spirit to join Jesus in the "fight against the spirit of evil."

The image of the desert is a very eloquent metaphor for the human condition. The Book of Exodus recounts the experience of the People of Israel who, after leaving Egypt, wandered through the desert of Sinai for 40 years before they reached the Promised Land. During that long journey, the Jews experienced the full force and persistence of the tempter, urging them to lose trust in the Lord and to turn back. Nevertheless, at the same time, thanks to Moses' mediation, they learned to listen to God's voice calling them to become his holy People. We all experience some desert in our journey of life in one way or another: sickness, crisis, emptiness, loss, and disappointment.

St. Mark's brief narrative of the temptation of Jesus has two vital ideas: (1) no matter how filled with the Spirit we may be, we are not immune from the temptations of the evil one. Moreover, (2) sometimes, as a person seeks to grow spiritually, there are dry periods, periods when a person feels as if God has abandoned them- a desert period. In meditating on this biblical passage, we understand that to live life to the fullest in freedom, we must overcome the test that this freedom entails, that is, temptation. Only if he is freed from the slavery of falsehood and sin can the human person, through the obedience of faith that opens him to the truth, find the whole meaning of his life and attain peace, love, and joy.

For this reason, Lent is not only about doing charity to others, but also a favorable time for a diligent revision of life through recollection, prayer, and penance. I invite you, beloved brothers and sisters, to the beautiful devotion of the Stations of the Cross, which I will lead in our Church in the evening of each Friday of Lent.

Lent invites us to remove some distractions that clutter our lives and focus more on Jesus and our faith. The scene of Jesus going to the wilderness for 40 days to reflect and pray is a powerful image of this invitation. One sure way to help in this reflection is the sacrament of penance with an examination of conscience. I just saw my Spiritual Director for confession last Tuesday. During weekdays of Lent, before or after Mass, you are welcome to approach me for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. I will be available.
