#### Fr. Gabriel's Reflection-4th Sunday of Easter Yr B

Beloved Parish Family of St Anselm,

On the Fourth Sunday of Easter – the Good Shepherd Sunday – in all three cycles of the Lectionary readings, the gospel is from the Johannine allegory of Jesus as both Door to the sheepfold and Shepherd (John 10). Then, until Pentecost, the gospels switch from appearances of the risen Jesus to selections from the farewell discourses in John 13 to 17.

In the days of Jewish civilization, the figure of the Shepherd was familiar: Abraham, Moses, and King David were all shepherds. Thus, biblical civilization, especially in the Psalms, and in the book of Exodus, recounts the Jewish experience of a God that leads His people to pastures, defends them from enemies, leads them to safety through the dangers of the desert and guides them toward the fulfillment of His promises in the Promised Land.

In the Gospel text for this Sunday, Jesus twice describes himself as the Good Shepherd who knows the sheep and gives his life for them, contrasting Himself with unfaithful leaders in Israel (cf. bad shepherds in Ezekiel 34) who abuse and neglect the flock. Jesus emphasizes that HE is the true Shepherd, who – unlike the mercenary –is present to his sheep in good and bad times, in the daytime and at nighttime, in sickness and health, from cradle until they are fully grown.

A good Shepherd is a dedicated guardian of the salvation of souls (1 Peter 2:25) and acts like Jesus, who says, "I am the gate," since true shepherds did lie across the gate to prevent intruders and wolves from entering. Instructively, today's Gospel passage also describes the behavior of the sheep, who are called by name to follow their Shepherd. The following is the result of a call ("He calls his sheep by name"), implying a sense of belonging (the sheep are his) and requiring listening ("hear his voice"). Part of the sheep's safety requires their *rejection* of any other shepherd and strange voice ("a stranger will they not follow but will flee from him").

There is a particular need and longing for good shepherds, particularly in our Catholic Church today, where there is so much confusion about the true doctrine of the Church and morals. For political expediency, bishops, and priests are afraid to teach the faith in all truth and clarity. We have become ambivalent for fear of the media, public opinion, and political correctness.

In the week ahead, let us pray for vocations to the priest-hood and religious life, asking God for shepherds who care for the well-being of God's children and not personal gains. We ask God's forgiveness for bad shepherds and healing for those sheep wounded. We also remember that we are all called to be shepherds in our little ways as parents, spouses, sisters, and brothers, one to the other after the example of Jesus, the Good Shepherd; amen.
