THE FOOD PANTRY CONTINUES TO FEED FAMILIES IN OUR COMMUNITY

Fifty three families were served this week, for a total of 189 people. Gleaners and Sprouts provided plenty of produce, along with breads from Publix. Even so, our shelves are almost bare. Donations of cereal, pasta, spaghetti sauce, rice & beans, mac & cheese, peanut butter, crackers, canned chicken and fruit, and tunafish are needed. Cash donations are always welcome, and donations are easy to make online during the summer months for those who are away.

MUSIC NOTES

The closing hymn, "All creatures of our God and King" is based on a poem written by St. Francis of Assisi shortly before his death in 1225. The English version of this hymn first appeared in a 1919 English hymnal. So many stories have arisen about St. Francis that it is difficult to separate fact from fiction. St. Francis loved nature and many stories feature animals. Once while hiking through Italy, where he grew up, he came upon a flock of birds. He decided to preach them a little sermon: "My brother and sister birds," he reportedly said, "you should praise your Creator and always love Him. For He gave you feathers for clothes, wings to fly and all the things you need. It is God who made your home." St. Francis is often portrayed with a bird, usually in his hand.
