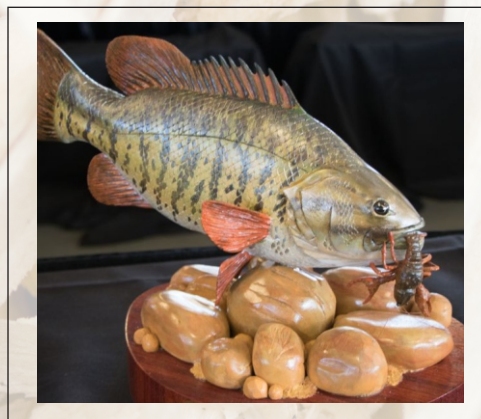

- A monthly meeting of the membership at 6:00 p.m. on the 2nd Thursday at Woodcraft, 7005 Overland Rd. Boise. It includes time for club business, announcements, "show and tell" (where carvers can display their work) and a carving project or program.
- Weekly open carving sessions provide an ideal opportunity for those who are new to woodcarving to obtain information on tools, safety, basic techniques and woods used. Club leaders are on hand to provide an orientation to the art of woodcarving. Loaner tools are available. Experienced carvers bring their own projects and enjoy the opportunity to socialize with those who share their interest. Open Carving takes place weekly on:
 1. Thursday evenings from 6:00-8:00 p.m. at Woodcraft. This time and this location favor those who have daytime work or live in the eastern part of the valley.
 2. Tuesday afternoon from 12:30-3:30 p.m. at the Senior Center at Kleiner Park, 1920 Records Way, Meridian. The Senior Center requests a donation of \$2-3 for each session attended to help defray their costs. This time and this location favor those who prefer a daytime gathering or live west of downtown Boise.
- Idaho Artistry in Wood Show - The Idaho Woodcarvers Guild is one of five woodworking groups that come together each year to sponsor one of the largest wood art shows in the west. Information on the show can be found at <https://idahoartistryinwood.org/>
- Classes and demonstrations - There are a number of classes or workshops offered by the Guild or experienced carvers which give those wishing to advance their skills an opportunity to learn. The Guild also gives public demonstrations of woodcarving at events such as the Western Idaho Fair, Woodcraft Expo, libraries and other venues.
