### **NJBBT at SkillsUSA**

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

### MARKET REPORT

**Wheat:** International wheat prices declined by 3.5 percent month-onmonth, reflecting prospects for ample global supplies in the upcoming 2023/24 season and the extension of the Black Sea Grain Initiative.

Oils: The FAO Vegetable Oil Price Index was down 8.7 percent monthon-month and standing as much as 48.2 percent below its year-earlier level. **Sugar:** The **FAO Sugar Price Index** was up 5.5 percent from April, marking the fourth consecutive monthly increase, and as much as 30.9 percent above its value a year ago.

**Dairy:** The **FAO Dairy Price Index** was down 3.2 percent from April and standing 17.7 percent below its corresponding value in 2022.
