Youth Group News: Make Mats. Help Others Sleep Better. Bring your clean plastic grocery bags to church!

LYO Advisor Kelli Snyder has lined up a special event for the whole congregation. On Sunday, April 14th, Rus DeBonis, founder of the free clinic that our church and youth group have been

so generous to, will be at St John at 9:00 to guide us through making sleep mats (see photo.)

The youth group is making a donation to Midwest Mission so we can keep a loom of our own. The sleep mats are distributed locally at the free clinic and are also sent to locations throughout the world.

People in developing countries, who often have no choice but to sleep on the ground, greatly benefit from these mats. Being off the ground helps prevent parasitic infection and also helps the body retain moisture.

Mat-making day will be a collaborative day for Sunday school and youth group; all in the congregation are invited to join in.

The mats are made from plastic grocery bags, so the congregation is invited to bring their plastic bags to church between now and April 14. The grocery bags will need to be cut to make the plarn (plastic yarn) from which the mats are made, so any extra hands to help the kids with scissors would be great:)

Because we will have a loom here, this will then be an on-going project we can work on at St. John's.

March 17 council meeting. President Mixdorf called the meeting to order. Pastor Olson provided an opening devotion.

Trustees: Jerry M will take care of spraying for weeds. Discussion about the fans in the Faith and Life Center: best option to deal with aging fans Also, with dumpster onsite Trustees desire to get rid of burn barrel. No objections. Trustees to also more clearly mark the road into the cemetery.

April 2024 – From Sheep to Shepherd: An LSI Early Childhood Services Story

Amid the COVID-19 pandemic, a mother, recently released from treatment, found herself in her new empty apartment with her son. She felt lost and needed a shepherd to guide her. So, Hali contacted LSI's Early Childhood Services, and Gretchen O'Brien, a Family Support Worker, answered the call. Gretchen began virtual home visits using the Healthy Family America home-visiting model.

For the next three years, Gretchen connected Hali and her son to community resources, served as a support system and a shoulder to cry on, and celebrated Hali's sobriety milestones with her.

Even when Hali doubted herself, Gretchen guided and believed in her. "I just remember sitting in that empty apartment crying, but I had Gretchen on the phone. You guys believed in me when nobody else did," shared Hali.

Today, Hali serves on the Healthy Family America (HFA) National Parent Advisory Committee, the first of its kind. The group is composed of 10-12 parents from around the country who have graduated from their local HFA program, each participant with their own story to share.

Hali needed a shepherd in her time of trouble and self-doubt, and Gretchen answered that call. Now, Hali serves as a shepherd to thousands of parents through the National Parent Advisory Committee. The LSI Early Childhood team couldn't be more proud of Hali and Gretchen.
