Greetings from the Assistant Director

Welcome friends and families to the My Place Spring Newsletter!

This Spring I am asking all teachers and families to really focus on literacy. Early literacy plays a key role in enabling the kind of early learning experiences that research shows are linked with academic achievement, reduced grade retention, higher graduation rates and enhanced productivity in adult life. Early literacy means helping children develop a rich vocabulary, self expression, and reading comprehension-all tools they need to become successful readers and lifelong learners. It is so important to build vocabulary at an early age and with your help each week we will have these kiddos on the right path for success! Please take note of the weekly vocabulary words listed on the classroom lesson plans. The classrooms will be adding these into their daily conversations and have them around the classroom, we hope that you too can talk at home about these words each day.

With the weather changing be sure that you are sending in weather appropriate clothing (and lots of extras). Per OCFS we are required to go outside daily even if it is a shortened amount of time. Please be sure that your child has a snowsuit/pants, jacket, gloves, hat, etc. each day, each classroom has room to keep these items if you have the extras to leave.

We are diligently working on active communication with families, please be sure that all of your information is up to date within our ProCare app. It is important that you have an active and working app, to sign your children in and out daily as well as communicate with the classroom staff, Kris, and I. We have moved our staff tablet to the lobby for your convenience. If you are unable to use your phone you can clock your child in and out with your pin there. Kindly let me know if you are having any issues with the app.

We are required to have all up to date physicals and immunizations on file for all children. When your child receives a yearly physical or any immunizations, please provide me with a copy for their file.

Summer Enrichment Program 2024

The My Place After School Program, which is licensed through the Office of Child and Family Services will be offering a Summer Enrichment Program for ages 4-12. We will be operating Monday-Friday at the Watkins Glen Elementary School from 7am-6pm. We will be accepting limited enrollment for \$258 weekly or \$60 per day. Each additional child per family will receive an 8% tuition discount.



My Place does accept the Childcare Assistant Program through your local DSS. Please use the QR below for the application.


