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

Cold Weather Threatens Man's Best Friend

Taking a walk or run on a brisk morning or evening is enjoyable, but it's equally wonderful to go inside and enjoy a warm fire or a nice cup of hot chocolate. Animals, like people, need shelter in cold weather. Animal Control Services state that they will have zero-tolerance for weather related violations. They offer the following advice:

- The best option is to bring animals indoors. If that isn't an option, purchase an insulated doghouse or build a protective enclosure that shelters your pets from the elements, giving them a safe, warm place to rest.
- Protect pets from harmful chemicals, paints, and especially antifreeze (which is deadly) if you keep them in a garage.
- Some pets should never be left outside: very young animals, short-haired dogs, older pets, no cats

• No pets should be left outside in a storm.

Always provide clean water and food for pets. Check it daily.

Animals are vulnerable and depend on us to protect them. Violators of city ordinances can receive fines for their negligence. If you see an animal you believe is not being properly cared for, call 311 to report an animal ordinance violation.

Brush Pick-up Scheduled for January 2023

Trees provide beauty and curb appeal to homes, increasing property values. In hot Texas summers they also provide much-needed shade. To maintain their beauty and value, pruning (removing dead or overgrown branches) is necessary. The preferred time to trim or prune trees is when they are in their dormant state, especially the winter months of January and February. Those that flower in the spring, such as redbuds and mountain laurel, are best trimmed right after they bloom, not in winter. Areas from which branches have been trimmed should be covered with a sealant or paint, lessening the possibility of infection such as oak wilt.

The Woods of Shavano is scheduled for brush pick-up in January. Flyers will be distributed at least a week in advance with specific dates and information.

Some important guidelines to keep in mind:

Piles SHOULD BE:

- Left at the curb by 7:00 AM on the Monday of collection week.
- No more than eight cubic yards and placed within eight feet of the curb.

Piles should NOT be:

- Obstructed, in front of parked cars, near fences, or mailboxes.
- Under low-hanging tree limbs or overhanging wires.
- Placed on top of water meters.
- Placed on vacant lots.

NOTE: Collections can take up to a week to complete.

Make plans now to engage the services of a qualified tree trimming company if your trees need pruning. Well-maintained trees increase the curb appeal and beauty of homes and contribute to a home's value.



Recently, some residents have asked if blowing leaves and grass clippings into the street is a code compliance issue. The City of San Antonio discourages the practice, but the code (34-703) refers to bulk discharges of grass clippings and leaves, not incidental discharges created through lawn maintenance. The code was written because leaves and grass blown into the street eventually end up in storm drains on municipal streets, clogging pipes, resulting in street flooding. Please help keep our storm drains clear. If you have concerns about illegal dumping of leaves and grass clippings into the street, contact 311.





Oak Wilt

Oak wilt is an infectious disease caused by a fungus,

affecting all types of oak trees and damaging thousands of acres of Central Texas oaks. Oak Wilt impacts entire communities if it infects just a few trees, spreading through

interconnected root systems and by beetles feeding on diseased trees. It can spread as rapidly as 75 feet per year and has infected many trees in neighboring communities.

As you trim trees for Brush Pick-Up in January, there are important facts to keep in mind to protect your trees and those of your neighbors:

- Avoid pruning oak trees from February through June.
- Make proper pruning cuts and immediately paint all oak wounds/cuts with sealant or any type of paint.
- Sterilize tools with a 10% bleach solution between each tree you trim.
- Consult a trained and licensed arborist if you are concerned about oak wilt having invaded your trees.

Protect these beautiful assets to our community by taking precautionary steps.

Good Practices for Safe Walking at Night

Many residents of the Woods of Shavano are health conscious, and walking is a popular method of exercise. Darkness, however, comes earlier in the winter, and some people don't get home from work until later in the day. Their evening walks don't begin until after sunset. Concerned residents have reported seeing people dressed in dark, non-reflective clothing walking in the streets after dark. This can be dangerous. Motorists cannot see walkers wearing dark clothing until it may be too late to prevent an accident.

PLEASE, PLEASE, PLEASE

Wear Light-Colored/Reflective Clothing and/or Carry and Use a Flashlight!

If walking with a pet, put reflective gear or lighting on your pet as well.

Additional guidelines for safe walking, day or night:

- If there is a sidewalk, use it.
- If there is no sidewalk, walk as close to the curb as possible, facing oncoming traffic.
- Walk no more than two abreast. If the roadway is narrow, walk single file.
- Cross at corners or after carefully checking for traffic.
- Be aware of bikers and joggers.
- Keep your cell phones and earbuds in your pocket. Concentrate on walking. Listen for oncoming cars. Talk later.
- Be aware of stranger danger. Always keep alert and aware by using well-lit routes frequented by other walkers.


