
The fun didn't stop there... Throughout the day, many members beat the heat at the WOS Pool and enjoyed food, refreshments, and music to round out the celebration!



# **Sales Tax Holiday Weekend**

Aug. 11 - 13, 2023

Save yourself some money on tax-free purchases of most clothing, footwear, school supplies and backpacks (sold for less than \$100) during the annual Tax-Free weekend. Qualifying items can be purchased tax-free from a Texas store or from an online or catalog seller doing business in Texas.

#### Start: Friday, August 11th

#### End: Sunday, August 13th at midnight

Items you buy before or after the sales tax holiday do not qualify for exemption, and there is no tax refund available. You can buy qualifying items online or by telephone, mail, custom order or any other means (including in-store purchases) tax free, when either

- the item is both delivered, and paid for, by the customer during the exemption; or
- the customer orders and pays for the item, and the seller accepts the order during the exemption period for immediate shipment, even if delivery is made after the exemption period ends.

# STAY SAFE IN THE SUMMER HEAT

#### **NEVER** LEAVE YOUR CHILD ALONE IN A CAR

Don't risk your child's life by leaving them in the car. A child's body can heat up five times faster than an adult's and even in cooler weather, cars can heat up to dangerous temperatures very quickly. On a mild day, the temperature inside a car can rise 20 degrees above the outside temperature in just 10 minutes or less.

- Make a habit of checking your vehicle before leaving it.
   Look before you lock!
- Keep a stuffed animal or other reminders next to you in the car as a cue that your child is with you.
- If you ever see a child alone in a car, **dial 9-1-1 immediately!**



#### DON'T FORGET OUR FURRY FRIENDS

Pets can get dehydrated quickly, so make sure you take precautions to keep your pet safe.

- Give your pet plenty of water when it's hot outdoors. Make sure to fill their water bowl before you leave.
- Make sure they have a shady place to get out of the sun.
- Be careful not to over-exercise your pet. Too much playtime in the hot sun is dangerous for them.
- Hot asphalt and tar can burn sensitive paw pads, walk your pet on grass or dirt when possible.
- Keep your pet indoors when it's extremely hot outside.
- Never leave your pet in a car! Pets can easily overheat. Leave them home during hot weather.

# LOCK, TAKE, HIDE

One of the easiest ways to prevent becoming a crime victim is to lock your car doors. Leaving cars unlocked in your driveway allows easy access to see what can be stolen. Please keep the crime tip of **LOCK**, **TAKE**, **HIDE** in mind. Lock, Take, and Hide is an easy 3-step plan that drastically reduces your chances of becoming a victim:



- 1. Lock your car doors.
- **2. Take** your keys and valuables with you. (This includes cell phones, wallets/purses, GPS units, computers, weapons, and jewelry).
- 3. Hide those valuables so they aren't in plain sight.

### **Household Hazardous Waste**

Not all household products can be thrown in the regular garbage. Being informed can help you make smarter, safer disposal decisions. You will likely find at least one thing you thought was safe to toss, but is on the list of common household hazardous waste materials. These items should not be mixed with your regular garbage or recyclables. Household hazardous wastes require special handling.

Household hazardous waste consists of materials that pose potential threats to people and the environment, such as:

- Flammable products
- 0il
- · Paint cans
- Pool chemicals
- Animal carcasses
- Solvents
- Household cleaning products
- Motor oil
- Mercury thermometers
- Personal care products (e.g. medicine, sunscreen, insect repellent, etc.)
- Medicine

- · Lead, acid/wet cell batteries
- · Railroad ties
- Toxic materials
- Biohazardous materials or waste
- Propane/oxygen/helium tanks
- Items containing gas or oil
- Explosives
- · Live ammunition or weapons





## **Common Lawn Mistakes**

Summertime in Texas is no joke. We've been lucky this year with a bit of rain; however, lush, green lawns don't just grow on trees. To have that prize-winning lawn it takes a lot of work, so it's best to get started early. Common lawn care mistakes are easy to make, so let's review some of the pitfalls that can occur when caring for our lawn so we can try to avoid them.

- 1. Cutting grass and watering during the day. Because the heat is so extreme, cutting or watering grass during the hottest part of the day can really pile on the pressure and stress for your lawn. Early morning or late evening is the best time to cut and water grass.
- 2. Cutting grass too short. In an attempt to limit the number of times we must cut the grass; it sounds like a good idea to cut it shorter than usual. Big mistake. Recommended grass height is 3 inches and anything shorter will cause root systems to be too shallow and result in an inability for the grass to absorb vital nutrients.
- **3.** Cutting grass with dull blades. If you notice your grass looks 'messy' after cutting, then it's probably time to sharpen those lawn mower blades. Failure to do so will result in the mower tearing your grass instead of cutting it.
- 4. Over or under-watering grass. Finding the right balance when watering the grass is not an easy task and mainly depends on the type of soil you have. Experts tell us to water our grass once or twice a week and limit water to about 2-3cm.
- 5. Controlling weeds. The best time to pull weeds is right after a good rain. Weeds are not only unsightly, but also may release chemicals that limit other plants' growth. It's important that we stay on top of the weeds and not allow them to take over our yards and gardens. Weeds grow quickly and have downward and outward root systems. Unfortunately, newly planted flowers and such do not stand a chance against them. Typically, weeds steal water, nutrients, air, space, and sunlight from healthy grass and gardens.

This summer will be much like every other summer in South Texas, hot, hot, hot. The intense heat from the sun can damage and stress your lawn, even if you do everything right. Help your lawn and garden to flourish by adhering to these tips.

# **How To Get Rid of Wasps Naturally**

Before you try to get rid of any flying yellow and black creatures, make sure you're not dealing with honeybees. Bees are incredibly beneficial to your garden and the environment in general. As a rule, bees won't nest very close to your home and they are not aggressive unless they feel extremely threatened. Once you're sure it's wasps you're dealing with, try these all-natural ideas.



is the perfect time to remove old nests and hang up a fake one so they won't come back in the spring.

Spray Nests with a Non-Toxic Wasp Killer Pesticides, even the so-called 'organic' ones, can be very dangerous for your plants, pets and children. The good news is, you don't need poison to kill all the wasps invading your space.

Attach a hose-end sprayer to your garden

hose and fill it with dish soap and water. Make sure you wear protective clothing and stand a good distance back from the nest, in case they decide to get aggressive. Let the hose run for a bit to get the suds going, then completely douse the nest in soapy water. The soap will attach to their wings and weigh them down; they'll eventually suffocate and die off. The ones that survive will leave and build a new nest elsewhere.

#### **Block-off Underground Nests**

If your wasps have an underground nest instead of a hanging one, you can kill off the colony by blocking their access to the nest. Figure out where all the entrances and exits are to the nest, sneak in at night and cover them up with a large bowl (or something similar). Make sure you work the bowl into the ground well enough that it forms a seal. Leave the bowl there for at least a few weeks.

#### Don't Draw Them In

Like many pests, wasps are attracted to food. They especially like foods that are high in sugar and meat products (including dry pet food). If you have a wasp problem, make sure that food isn't left out and that your trash cans are sealed tight. If you have any humming-bird feeders, you'll likely want to move them away from the house – as wasps will compete with the birds for the sugary nectar.

#### Put up a Fake Nest

Wasps are very territorial creatures, and they won't build a nest if they think there is another colony already living nearby. In fact, they'll likely leave if they think someone else has moved into their neighborhood. You can find a fake wasp nest at several online retailers or you can make it yourself.

#### Keep them out of the house for only 1¢

Because of their specially designed eyes, most flying bugs (including flies, mosquitoes and wasps) will stay away from your doorway if you hang up a sandwich bag filled with water and a penny. Some people claim that this looks like a dangerous spider web to the bugs, some say that the reflection off the water is too bright for their eyes. Whichever is true, this simple trick always works.


#### **Time your Attack Appropriately**

If you're going after the nest using any method, don't do it in the middle of a summer day. Wasps are much more active – and aggressive – when it's warm outside. It's always safest to go after them at night time. Even so, make sure you wear protective clothing and stand as far back from the nest as possible.

In the coldest months of the year, wasps die off all together. This







### What to do if your car is on fire

- Pull over as quickly as it is safe to do so, be sure to use your signal as you make your way to a safe location off the road such as the breakdown lane or rest stop.
- Once you have stopped, TURN OFF the engine.
- GET everyone out of the car. Never return to a burning car for anything.
- MOVE everyone at least 100 feet from the burning car and well away from traffic.
- CALL **9-1-1**.

### How to prevent a car fire

- Have your car serviced regularly by a professionally trained mechanic. If you spot leaks, your car is not running properly, get it checked. A well-maintained car is less likely to have a fire.
- If you must transport gasoline, transport only a small amount in a certified gas can that is sealed.
   Keep a window open for ventilation.
- Gas cans and propane cylinders should never be transported in the passenger compartment.
- Never park a car where flammables, such as grass, are touching the catalytic converter.
- Drive safely to avoid an accident.

# Know the danger signs

- Cracked or loose wiring or electrical problems, including a fuse that blows more than once
- Oil or fluid leaks
- Oil cap not on securely
- Rapid changes in fuel or fluid level, or engine temperature

Most car fluids are flammable. Heat and electrical sparks plus leaking fluid are all it takes to start a car fire.

# **FACT**

Most crashes do NOT result in fire. In the event of any crash, call **9-1-1**. If there is no sign of fire, wait for emergency assistance to help any injured individuals out of the car.
