Kids are Back in School - Follow Regulations around School Buses

The Texas Department of Public Safety reminds drivers that they must stop for school buses that are loading or unloading.



With the beginning of school, drivers are reminded of the slogan:

Avoid Harm, Obey the Stop Arm

Texas State law requires drivers to stop when school buses are stopped and have activated their alternating red flashing lights and/or stop signs. Drivers should not proceed until the school bus resumes motion, the driver is signaled by the bus driver to proceed, or the visual signal is no longer activated.

Also note, after the end of the school day, many children are outside riding bikes and skateboards, playing basketball, and chatting with friends. Please watch out for their safety. Abide by speed limits and keep an eye out for children playing outside.

Drivers should take special care because in most cases children cannot judge vehicle speed or distance.

Our children are precious, and it's up to all drivers to help ensure their safety.

The drought continues and so do Stage 2 watering rules

As a reminder, under Stage 2, landscape watering with a sprinkler, irrigation system or soaker hose is allowed only from 7-11 a.m. and 7-11 p.m., one day a week, based on the last number of your street address. You can still handwater with a hose-end nozzle any time.

SAWS water enforcers are patrolling neighborhoods, including gated communities, and issuing fines — not warnings. So make sure your irrigation system is set to water only on your day between 7 and 11.

And if you were thinking about planting new grass this year, please don't. This could be another challenging summer for lawns.

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Walking Safety Tips

With summer coming to a close and the return to somewhat cooler temperatures, more people will resume their morning or evening walks. Additionally, students recently returned to school for the 2023-2024 school year. Many ride buses to and from school,

but because of our neighborhood's close proximity to their school, others choose to walk. Remind your children and teens of these safety precautions to keep in mind if they walk.

- Always be aware of your surroundings and the people who are around you – don't be distracted by talking or texting on your cell phone or listening to loud music through earbuds or headphones.
- Avoid walking alone. Either walk with someone or in areas where people are nearby.
- Stay in well-lighted areas.
- Avoid shortcuts through alleys, drainage ditches, parks, vacant lots, or deserted places.
- Walk in the middle of the sidewalk, *facing traffic*.
- Never accept rides from strangers.
- If the driver of a car stops and harasses you, walk in the opposite direction.
- If you have a cell phone, carry it with you when walking and be prepared to call for help. Know the numbers to call and be prepared to give your exact location to the emergency operator.

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Hummingbirds in Your Backyard

More than 17 species of hummingbird visit the state of Texas. Most are only passing through (or migrating), but some stay almost the entire year.

In San Antonio and surrounding areas, the most common species of hummingbird is the Black-chinned hummingbird. At first glance, these hummingbirds seem drab. But males, while dull green from the rear, have an iridescent blue patch underneath their bills. That's the easiest way to tell if the hummingbird at your feeder is Black-chinned.

Another common hummingbird in this area is the Rubythroated hummingbird. The males of this species are exquisitely colored, with red bands encircling their throats. This species is the subject of many artistic depictions. Most of the time, when you see a drawing of a hummingbird, it resembles this species.

While hummingbirds generally consume nectar from plants, they also eat a lot of pesky insects such as gnats and mosquitos. During the winter, when insects and nectar are scarce, most hummingbirds in Texas fly south, where it's warmer.

To help hummingbirds before and during migration, you may want to consider setting up a hummingbird feeder. Hummingbird feeders use a sugar water mixture to attract the birds and come in a variety of colors. The color yellow may



attract bees, so you may want to choose a different color for your hummingbird feeder.

No matter what type of feeder you choose, you will need to clean the feeder frequently. Some sources recommend cleaning the feeder every two or three days, while others recommend cleaning the feeder daily. Unfortunately, mold grows quickly in the sugar water and can make the hummingbirds sick, or even kill them. So, cleaning the feeder isn't optional.

If you have no interest in maintaining a hummingbird feeder, but still want to see hummingbirds in your yard, try planting flowers that they enjoy! The best flowers to attract hummingbirds have colorful blossoms and are almost shaped like little funnels.

Fortunately, many native Texas plants fit the bill. For instance, Scarlet sage attracts hummers in my yard. Coral honeysuckle is another favorite. For more recommendations, visit your local nursery. They should have plenty of recommendations for flowers that attract hummingbirds.

Hummingbirds are a small joy for many of us. Their amazing flights can keep us watching for hours. Hopefully, these tips will help your yard to be hummingbird friendly, so you can enjoy watching these animals for years to come.

Back to School Recipes

Cheeseburger Cups

Ingredients:

- 1 pound ground beef
- 1/2 cup ketchup
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon mustard
- 1 tube (12 ounces) refrigerated buttermilk biscuits
- 1/2 cup cubed Velveeta



Directions:

In a large skillet, cook beef over medium heat until no longer pink, breaking it into crumbles; drain. Stir in the ketchup, brown sugar, and mustard. Remove from the heat; set aside.

Press each biscuit onto the bottom and up the sides of a greased muffin cup. Spoon beef mixture into cups; top with cheese cubes. Bake at 400° for 14-16 minutes or until cups are golden brown.

Bean Burritos

Ingredients:

- 1 can (16 ounces) vegetarian refried beans
- 1 cup salsa
- 1 cup cooked long grain rice
- 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese, divided
- 12 flour tortillas (6 inches)
- Shredded lettuce, optional



Directions:

Preheat oven to 375°. In a large bowl, combine beans, salsa, rice and 1 cup cheese. Spoon about 1/3 cup mixture off-center on each tortilla. Fold the sides and ends over filling and roll up.

Arrange burritos in a greased 13x9 inch baking dish. Sprinkle with remaining 1 cup cheese. Cover and bake until heated through, 20-25 minutes. If desired, top with lettuce.

We are OVER THE MOON that this year's Annular Eclipse will pass right over San Antonio, creating an out-of-this world ring of fire in the sky! Join us Saturday, October 14, for our eclipse-viewing party!

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Action Items to Improve Your Home's Survivability:

- **REMOVE** leaves, pine needles, and other flammable material from the roof, gutters, and on and under the deck to help prevent embers from igniting your home.
- **SCREEN** areas below decks and porches with 1/8" wire mesh to help prevent material from accumulating underneath.
- **COVER** exterior attic and soffit vents with 1/8" wire mesh to help prevent sparks from entering your home.
- **ENCLOSE** eaves to help prevent ember entry.
- INSPECT shingles or roof tiles. REPLACE missing shingles or tiles. COVER ends of tiles with bird stops or cement to help prevent ember penetration during a wildfire.

Tips for Landscaping Around Your Home

- **REMOVE** dead vegetation and other flammable materials, especially within the first 5 feet of the home.
- **KEEP** your lawn hydrated and maintained. If it is brown, cut it down to help reduce fire intensity.
- **PRUNE** tree limbs so the lowest branches are 6 to 10 feet above the ground to help reduce the chance of fire getting into the crowns of the trees.
- MOVE construction material, trash, and woodpiles at least 30 feet away from the home and other outbuildings.
- **DISPOSE** of branches, weeds, leaves, pine needles, and grass clippings that you have cut to reduce fuel for fire.

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- 1. Don't overload a washer. An overloaded washer strains the motor and transmission, shortening their lives.
- 2. Always mix fabric softeners with water before dispensing. Undiluted, they can gum up the works. If your machine has a built in dispenser, add the recommended amount and top it off with water. Otherwise, dilute the liquid in a 3 to 1 ratio..
- 3. Regularly clean or replace the intake water screens where the hoses screw into the back of the machine. Replacement screens are available at hardware stores.
- 4. Avoid a disaster and replace original rubber water supply hoses with the braided-jacket stainless steel type. The hoses are under constant water pressure and rubber hoses will fail someday, most likely at 3 a.m. or when nobody's home.
