Neighborhood Speed Limit

The speed limit in residential neighborhoods is **30 mph** unless otherwise indicated. Some places (e.g., speed bumps) have a speed limit of **20 mph** posted on yellow caution signs.



Our neighborhood is a wonderful place to walk, jog, ride a bicycle, and exercise pets. Slow down and drive safely, and remember to **STOP** at STOP signs.



Keep Bike Lanes Clear for Bike Riders

Recently Woods of Shavano residents contacted the Association asking for our help in keeping bike lanes clear of parked cars. The WOSCA has no legal authority to force people to comply. We are asking your cooperation in making this a safer neighborhood. There are other places to park cars – driveways and garages. Many people in the neighborhood have been inside for quite some time and are enjoying being outside – walking, jogging, walking babies in strollers, and biking. If cars are parked in the bike lanes, pedestrians are forced into traffic lanes. Be respectful of your neighbors and park in unrestricted areas. Keep our community safe.



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About This Summer at the Pool

Board members have heard from several residents of the Woods of Shavano. Some have been supportive of the careful approach taken to protect the health and safety of the community. Some have not been as complimentary, questioning why we have taken such a conservative position about opening the pool.

The Board's **overriding concern** has been the **health and safety** of the community. Acknowledging that people are ready to break loose from the confines we have all experienced over the past several months, Board members have frequently met to decide how to safely open the pool.

Some people decided to join pools in other neighborhoods. While we would have preferred they wait until the Woods of Shavano Pool could safely open, we understand that children are ready for activity. We hope those who left will return in 2021.

We also had the ever-present issue of income for the Association. As you know, we are a voluntary Association that, unfortunately, has only about 1/3 of eligible residents join.

This year the Board voted to make a \$5,000 contribution to replacing the large pool deck. For the past several years, money was invested every summer just to replace rotted, splintered wood. That depleted much of our reserves for special projects. The deck was needed, and we had an opportunity to have the building completed through an Eagle Scout project and the able voluntary assistance of Board Vice-President John Haines.

Then the possibility of a key card system was raised. Bids ranging from \$1,000 - \$8,000 were obtained. Lack of funds as well as the lateness of securing bids were factors in the Board's decision not to move forward at this time. We will reconsider it next year.

To be fully informed, please consider the following:

- Other neighborhoods have key card systems that allow swimmers to come and go at their convenience. Most of those neighborhoods have mandatory Associations and much greater income than the Woods of Shavano.
- The Woods of Shavano is one of only a few pools that still has lifeguards on duty. We have taken pride in offering the safety

that lifeguards provide, and distressed young swimmers have been helped by them.

- Most pools with key card systems do not have lifeguards. They post signs saying "Swim at Your Own Risk". Woods of Shavano Board members feel a moral responsibility to our members. If anyone is hurt, we would feel some responsibility, even if we had a sign posted saying "Swim at Your Own Risk".
- Some assert that a key card system will pay for itself. It can. Members who use the pool would be charged \$25 for a key card. For it to pay for itself, 160 key cards at \$25 each would have to be purchased for even a medium-priced key card system of approximately \$4,000. In addition, the Association will have to pay a company to monitor and service it. We don't **currently** have the money in the budget.
- In 2020 membership fees were raised. A majority of Board members felt we could not add another \$25 to membership fees for key cards for people who use the pool this year.
- Currently some members have chosen to join other pools. They not only have joined other pools, but they have also chosen not to renew their yearly memberships. We've explained repeatedly that the pool is **not** the only community asset supported by membership fees. We also have a park, tennis courts, basketball courts, a clubhouse, and a community entrance. If you chose not to renew your membership, we hope you will make a contribution to the Association to support the other community assets.

All current **Full** and **Outside** members of the WOSCA are eligible to use the Parkside Woods tennis courts or the resurfaced Indian Woods courts. Codes are needed for entry. 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Modifications to Existing Pool Rules for 2020 Pool Season

(Subject to change as needs arise)

- No alcohol permitted
- Tables are provided; please bring your own chairs
- Large Inflatable floats are NOT allowed
- Swimming assistance devices (water wings, puddle jumpers, etc.) are allowed
- Privately owned toys for personal use are allowed
- WOSCA community toys are NOT available
- Personal items left at the pool will NOT be collected/stored in "Lost and Found"
- Guests are asked to sanitize tables and other common surfaces after use
- WOSCA pool staff may ask guests to leave and/or close the pool for non-compliance of rules

(According to guidelines, pool capacity is limited to 50% at this time. As long as entrants do not exceed the capacity, they will be admitted. If the number exceeds capacity, members will be asked to return at a later time.)

For your health and safety, we have made the following changes:

1. Guests are encouraged to follow city, state and public health experts' recommendations.
2. Maintain a minimum of a 6 foot distance from non-household members
3. Wear a face mask when walking around the pool area, but NOT in the pool.
4. If you're sick, especially running a fever, you must not enter the pool area.

For Your Pleasure – A limited selection of concessions will be available. Credit cards will be accepted.
