About Our Program

We play an **essential** role in the effort to reduce hunger by **collaborating** with food suppliers and social service organizations to reduce food waste and provide a readyto-eat option for individuals and families experiencing food insecurity.

By providing our partner organizations with free meals, we bolster their food inventory and free up resources for their other programs, such as providing shelter, healthcare services, addiction recovery programs, and other assistance.

Our Reach

This map shows the total reach of our prepared meal program in 2022, stretching from Vandalia to Hamilton, Ohio.

Throughout the year, we served a total of **74 partners** in **25 zip codes**. The top five zip codes served were 45406, 45402, 45417, 45324, and 45342.


More Highlights

- In July, we officially **purchased our building** and its 1.1 acre plot of land thanks to support from a local donor
- In September, we hosted our first large-scale fundraiser, **Diced in Dayton**, raising more than \$20,000 to support our mission
- In October, we joined the La Soupe Kitchen Network, a collaborative network of like-minded kitchens focused on rescuing, transforming, and sharing food for the greater good
- In October, our board of directors approved a new strategic plan for 2023-2024, focusing on a renewed vision for the organization and increased internal development and financial sustainability
- In November, we hosted our third Thanksgiving Turkey Takeaway, in which we distributed more than 11,000 meals to residents






