

#### **Expanding capacity**

In October, we celebrated the arrival of our long-awaited **new walk-in freezer**. The freezer provides an additional 180 square feet of freezer space for meals and bulk items.

The freezer was the first of many steps our team is taking to expand and grow. Our partnership with the **Rescue Kitchen**Network, powered by La Soupe has continued, allowing our teams to connect with and learn from similar organizations. A significant funding opportunity from the State of Ohio, via La Soupe, will support further expansion of the kitchen and other facility upgrades.







#### **Garden & Composting**

In the summer, we revived our **composting program**. Thanks to our partnership with The Foodbank, we can compost our food scraps. We also began growing fresh herbs on our **patio garden** to give our meals an extra burst of flavor.





#### **Staff Development**

Our team spent **236 hours on training and development** in 2023. Topics included racial equity, fundraising, board development, strategic planning, Neighborhood Leadership, physical and mental health first aid, and more.

#### **Raising Awareness**

We collaborated with numerous local businesses to host four **food drives**, which collected a total of 6,833 pounds of food, and nine **fundraising events**, which raised more than \$33,000 to support our mission.





#### Global Cuisine, Local People

In an effort to better serve the diverse communities of Dayton, our team spent time learning about global cuisines and cooking techniques, including African, Ahiska Turkish, Korean, and Ecuadorian cuisines. Welcome Dayton guided this effort.

In March, we launched a line of **spice blends**, specially crafted by three of our chefs. These blends are produced and sold by Big Axe Spice to raise additional funds for our mission.




#### **Financial Summary**

- Earned income & other revenue




#### 2023 Expenses

Financial information is current as of March 2024 and will be professionally audited in fall 2024. Assets which are to be reclassified in this audit are not present in the calculation.
