The Battle of Conashaugh, Delaware Township

During the Revolutionary War, many Indians aligned with the British forces against the Colonials who were fighting for the independence of America. The following is an account of a local battle of record, taken in part, from the report of John VanCampen of Walpack, N.J., 4/24/1790.

The Revolutionary War fighting ended approximately 1781, however the actual peace treaty was not enacted until two years later. On approximately April 17, 1780, word came to Major Samual Westbrook and Captain Peter Westbrook of the Militia at their New Jersey Fort, that Indians were seen at the house of Manual Gunsaleyes by the sons of James McCarty who had gone to tend their cattle on the Pennsylvania side of the river. After learning of the situation, The Major and Captain gathered their best men and crossed the river. About sunrise the next day, the Indians were located and the battle began. The enemy appeared to consist of approximately fourteen Indian men. The Major's forces suffered no initial wounded and the Indians retreated to the woods. The Major was reinforced by Captain Johannes VanEtten, with three of his sons and his son-in-law. The force pursued the Indians by following a blood trail left by their injured and after about two miles, came upon them. Fierce fighting ensued but Capt. VanEtten held his ground.

The Indians ran into the woods while the Major and VanEtten secured the retreat of the enemy. Of the enemy killed, one was a white British officer. Found in his pocket was his Journal stating that 390 had marched from Niagara and had divided into separate parties. Of the Militia killed were Captain Peter Westbrook, Lt. Benjamin Ennis, son-in-law to Capt. VanEtten, and Pvt. Richard Rosencrance. Wounded were Lt. Helms and James VanEtten. This battle was considered by some to be the last battle of the Revolutionary War.

The site of the conflict was the McCarty farm, two miles below Milford. Capt. VanEtten lived in Delaware Township, one mile below the McCarty farm. The VanEtten property was originally owned by William Allen before being acquired by the VanEttens and later was sold, in part, to John Zimmerman in 1882.

Committee Descriptions

- 1. <u>Audit</u>: The Audit Committee of two members, who are not officers, will be appointed by the Executive Committee in October to audit the Treasurer's accounts, and submit a written report at the first Executive meeting of the New Year and the March general meeting.
- 2. <u>Budget</u>: The Budget Committee will include the President, Treasurer, and Ways and Means Chairperson. The committee will prepare the annual budget to be presented in writing at the first Executive Committee meeting of the New Year. After approval by the Executive Committee, the budget will be voted on by the general membership at the March general meeting.
- 3. **Bylaws:** The Bylaws Committee will include the President and 3 other members appointed by the Executive Committee. It shall, periodically review the bylaws and recommend any necessary changes to be voted on by the General Membership.
- 4. <u>Genealogy</u>: The Genealogy Committee shall trace the ancestry of settlers and pioneers of Dingmans Ferry-Delaware Township and vicinity.
- 5. <u>Historian</u>: The Historian is the keeper of records and archives connected with the history of Dingmans Ferry-Delaware Township and vicinity.
- 6. <u>Hospitality</u>: The Hospitality Committee prepares refreshments for various meetings as directed by the Chairperson of Hospitality Committee.
- 7. <u>Library</u>: The Library Committee shall catalogue, maintain and preserve the books, manuscripts and other printed/literary matter of the Society. It shall record information about donations and confirm acknowledgments to donors of gifts. Loaned objects shall be so marked and recorded with the name of the donor.
- 8. <u>Membership</u>: The Membership Committee shall include the Vice President as Chairperson, who will keep an accurate record of members including the date of membership, address, phone numbers and email addresses; send dues notices, collect dues and inform delinquent members of their status. Bylaws are posted on the website under Member Only pages. Members create a unique login to access these documents.
- 9. <u>Museum</u>: The Museum Committee shall be responsible for the museum building, tours and displaying Society items at various locations. The Maintenance team will work with the Museum Committee to maintain and improve the building.
- 10. <u>Nominating</u>: Every two years at the September general meeting, the President shall appoint a Nominating Committee of three members, including the Immediate Past President. This committee shall nominate candidates for offices to be voted upon at the November Annual General Meeting.
- 11. **Photography**: The Photography Committee shall catalogue and maintain and preserve the Society's collection of historic photographs. The costs charged to those wishing duplicate prints shall be periodically reviewed by the Executive Committee.
- 12. <u>Publicity</u>: The Publicity Committee shall oversee the printing and publication of materials pertaining to the Society, and posting events on local bulletin boards and to weekly and monthly publications.
- 13. **Program**: The Program Committee shall arrange for speakers, trips, walking tours and similar programs for the benefit of the Society.
- 14. <u>Ways and Means:</u> The Ways and Means Committee shall raise revenue for the Society through fundraising, donations and grants.
