To all Members,

The time for the Annual Meeting of the membership of Sunset Lake Association is Thursday, October 16, 2003 at 7:00 PM at the Community Center, Hanauer Hall, 30505 East Lake Dr., Girard, IL. The purpose of the annual meeting is to elect directors, pass a budget for 2004 and receive reports from officers and committee chairpersons.

Three (3) Directors will be elected for terms of three (3) years each. There are also two seats to be filled for un-expired terms. ANNUAL MEETING on OCTOBER 16TH, 2003!

Registration for the Membership Meeting will begin at 6:00pm, and the meeting will start at 7:00pm, Thursday, Oct. 16, 2003 at the Community Center, 30505 East Lake Dr.

The election of 3 Directors for 3-year terms will be held. There will also be two seats open for un-expired terms.

A proposed Budget for the year 2004 has been prepared by the Board for the membership to vote on. If approved, the Annual Assessments will be \$250.00.

The Membership will also vote on a ByLaw Amendment. The following paragraph would be added to **Article VIII Section 1. Attorney's Fees:** Should the Sunset Lake Association undertake legal action to enforce any of the

Bylaws, Rules, or Regulations against a member or resident of such member's household, the member shall pay all costs incurred by the Sunset Lake Association, including attorney's fees.

CHANGES TO THE RULES & REGULATIONS

There have been numerous changes made to the Rules and Regulations. The Board felt it was best to send a complete copy of the Bylaws & Rules and Regulations. Please update your booklets.

The Board of Directors have made changes to the following Sections:

Section 25. All Terrain Vehicles (ATV's). has been changed to list different types of ATV vehicles.

Section 31.A. Peaceful Enjoyment of Premises was added to the Rules.

Section 34. Suspension of Membership was added back into the Rules.

Section 39. Requirements to Transfer Property was revised to include Modify Ownership of Leasehold.

FALL BRINGS LEAVES

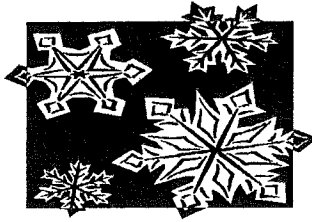
It's almost time for those fall colors. Remember to rake your leaves as often as possible to prevent them from going into the Lake.

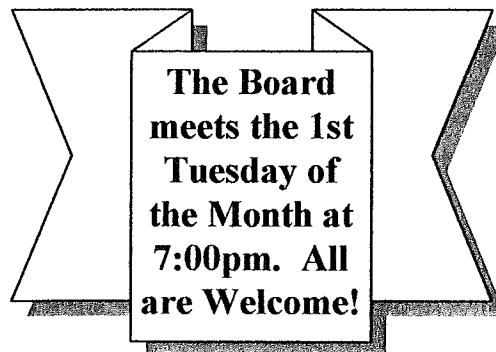

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING
OCTOBER 17, 2002**

CALL TO ORDER - President Jim Dorr called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. at the Sunset Lake Community Center, Hanauer Hall. All Directors were present. President Jim Dorr stated that a quorum had been reached with 56 votes, entitled to be cast, present plus 18 votes represented by proxy.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE 2001 ANNUAL MEETING - President Dorr asked for any additions or deletions to the minutes as mailed to the members. Ray Reardon said that under Conservation & Water Quality the second sentence in the second paragraph was misstated and asked that every thing in the sentence after "Moss, or scum, is his biggest concern" be deleted. There being no further changes a motion was made by Roxine Burch, seconded by John Schwander to approve the minutes as amended. The motion carried.

PRESIDENT'S REMARKS - President Jim Dorr said there were a series of resignations during the year beginning with Directors Dennis Denney and Ken Volz and ending with our Secretary/Office Manager Peggy Volz. He acknowledged the efforts of Peggy and Ken on behalf of Sunset Lake and expressed his appreciation that Dennis Denney has seen his way clear to come back. President Dorr introduced our new Office Manager Kyla Tanner and said that she has been a most welcome addition to our staff.

Jim also acknowledged our commitment to the Girard Rescue Squad and said we would be taking up a collection later in the meeting. He said for those who wished to make a donation but did not come prepared they could send it to the office later.

He thanked Bill Hohimer for the extra time he spent on the weekends completing work on the East side of the dam. He said he believes we have accomplished much this year but said his one regret, which he takes responsibility for, is that we have not made any progress with the lawsuit in connection with the mobile home. He said we would be making a renewed effort at moving the suit to a hearing by the end of the year.

President Dorr read a list of the new members who moved into the lake during the year. He also noted that there are some 10 lots currently for sale and 15 or so homes for sale.

AQUATIC CONTROL & WATER SAFETY-BOB SONS: Bob said there were only minor problems this year on the Lake. He said that we are expecting delivery of 500 10-inch walleye in November. He also noted that our proposed budget for 2003 was increased to \$2,000.

BUILDING & CONSTRUCTION COMMITTEE- DENNIS DENNEY:

Dennis said he received 26 requests for building permits during the year: 1 on-lot house built, 3 garages, 6 covered boat docks, 4 new boat docks, 7 new decks or porches, and 2 sheds. We had \$900.00 budgeted this year for building permits and we took in \$975.00.

DAM & GROUNDS COMMITTEE- JOE DINORA: Joe said that a permit for the dam was issued by the State of Illinois. He said the permit is good for five years but the dam would be inspected every year. He said we have completed work on the East side of the dam and are still considering the need to do anything further on the West side. He also noted that additional rip rap was placed around the shoreline at the boat ramp.

LEGAL & INSURANCE COMMITTEE-ALLAN SHARP: Allan said we have had difficulty getting hold of our attorney Randy Blue and as a result have not really accomplished anything this year in connection with the mobile home lawsuit. He recently met with Jim Dorr, Tom Erickson, Ernie Neumann, George Madiar and Bill Hohimer to discuss the case. He said a decision was made to visit with some attorneys practicing in Macoupin County and then consider our options. With regards, our insurance premiums we are in good shape through February 2004.

ROADS COMMITTEE-GEORGE MADIAR: George said it was a good year for roads because we were able to get them taken care of early. North road was completely overhauled. Took the crown out, black patched and oiled the road from lot 102 to Willow Lane. Starting from Willow Lane going West and all around North Lake Drive, including Circle Drive, the bus route was oiled and rocked. Sycamore Lane also was oiled and rocked. Seventeen private driveways were oiled and rocked. Riprapping was done on East Lake Drive in connection with the repair of a culvert. Some work will have to be done on West Lake Drive.

SANITATION, SHORELINE & BOAT DOCKS COMMITTEE –

RICK WHITEHEAD: Rick said there are 251 septic tanks; 180 sand filter systems, 30 aeration systems and 41 laterals. He said his recent checks for the presence of chlorine showed only 87 % compliance. He appealed to the membership to be vigilant in checking to make certain they have adequate chlorine in their systems.

WATER QUALITY & CONSERVATION-ERNIE NEUMANN: Ernie reported that most recent water clarity tests at three different locations are showing 36-40 feet. He said this is a drastic improvement from earlier in the year. He said the heavy rains in the spring reduced the clarity to 4 feet.

Ernie stated samples from the 11 locations were taken to the Environmental Control Lab for an analysis and we fell well between our parameters. Also, there was never a test that was taken that showed high enough reading of human waste to have a statistical reading so this was very positive.

He said a test of a semi-clear silicone-like substance that has been appearing around the lake was the result of the hot weather. This was not alive but a by-product of algae. It is not dangerous to the lake other than it consumed oxygen and it would dissolve if laid up on the shore. He talked to some of the members that had this substance originally around their area and at the present time it's gone.

FINANCE (APPROVAL OF 2002 BUDGET) – TOM ERICKSON: As Chairman of the Finance Committee Tom said he was pleased to report our financial condition has improved since this same time last year. He said we estimate finishing the calendar year ending December 31, 2002 with approximately \$21,000. He said our only debt might be some \$2,000 in old outstanding bonds, which had been issued years ago.

He said the Board approved the proposed budget for 2003 unanimously. It is a balanced budget in that projected revenues equal projected expenditures. It again includes the Special Assessment, which was first approved last year. He said he believed this would allow us to build a new equipment shed and help us to replenish our reserves. He noted that over \$26,000 was spent to repair the dam in 2001 and there was nothing in the budget for it. This depleted most of our reserves.

Tom noted several expenditure accounts which were reduced from the 2002 budget, such as professional fees from \$7,000 to \$4,000, roads from \$8,000 to \$5,000, and repairs and maintenance/dam from \$7,800 to -0-. He said fish stocking was increased from \$1,000 last year to \$2,000. Tom concluded by saying the Board believed this to be a realistic budget and recommended the members vote of support.

After some discussion, primarily concerning the need for an equipment shed, a motion was made by John Schwander and seconded by Shirley Erley that the budget be approved as proposed. The motion carried. It was later decided however to use a ballot and take a secret vote to determine its passage. After the votes were collected, President Dorr appointed Ray Reardon, Carl Mayes and Tom Erickson to count the ballots. On a vote of 51 to approve the budget and 23 nays, the budget as proposed passed.

OTHER BUSINESS - President Jim Dorr stated the Craft Fair is November 16th. He talked to the County Highway engineer and the contract states that Emerson Airline is to be opened on or before November 29th. The engineer said that does not mean they would be completely finished but the contract says the road will be open.

President Dorr stated members need to take care of their leaves. Get them before they get into the lake or someone else's property.

President Dorr said anytime you have a question, comment or complaint, please fill out a form and get it to the board. Preferable before the board meeting so the proper committee can look at it and be ready to give an answer. If you present it at the meeting, it probably won't be acted upon until the following meeting. Please put it in write and get it to the board.

Jim Dorr thanked the Carol Schwandner and Donna Dinora for getting the coffee and cookies ready for the meeting.

OLD BUSINESS - Tom Mottershaw, Lot #182 stated 3 months ago he sent a letter asking for the board's permission on a split rail fence. As of today, he had not received an answer. President Dorr stated it was brought up at the meeting and the board was in agreement not to approve this. In the rules and regulations it states no fences and explained he did not receive a letter because that was the time when Peggy Volz resigned. President Dorr apologized for no letter being sent.

NEW BUSINESS -

ELECTION OF DIRECTORS – President Jim Dorr explained that there are four positions open. The first is three 3-year terms. The current directors, George Madiar, Rick Whitehead and Joe Dinora have all consented to run for reelection. When nominations were opened, all three current directors were nominated. Nominations were closed with no additional members nominated. The current directors were declared reelected. Then the two 2-year position originally vacated by Dennis Denney was opened for nominations. Dennis Denney was nominated. The nominations were closed with no additional members nominated. Dennis was declared reelected.

SOCIAL FUNCTION – President Dorr said he would like to see functions that are more social so that the members could have more of a chance to get to know each other. He asked if anyone would be interested in pursuing the planning of such interest. Roxine Burch and Carol Schwander expressed an interest and said they would attempt to get additional members to join with them.

ADJOURNMENT - Upon motion by John Schwander, second by Ray Reardon the meeting was adjourned by acclamation at 9:07 p.m.

FINANCE

As Chairman of the Finance Committee I am pleased to report to you that our present financial condition as well as the outlook for 2004 are good. We finished last year better than expected with \$34,789.66 in the bank and our only debt some old outstanding bonds, which we still believe may total approximately \$2,000.

Last year we presented a balanced budget for 2003. We estimated income and expenditures at \$117,400. Income for the 9 months ended 9/30/03 is already at \$130,244.75. This is thanks to several wind falls such as the insurance recovery on the old shed \$13,329.08 and the collection of old accounts receivable. We collected most recently \$5,521.44 from our lease #49 which was in bankruptcy.

Our expenses for the 9 months amount to \$108,438.51. We will go over our budget for the year primarily due to the capital expenditures. We have spent \$30,496 on the new equipment shed and \$2,561.70 on Sunset Drive.

Our bank balance at 9/30/03 is \$56,482.62. We have a CD for \$25,000 and most of the balance is in our money market account.

This year we estimate finishing the year again with at least \$30,000 in the bank.

This information was mailed to you with the Annual Meeting Notice.

We also sent you a projected budget for 2004. The 2004 budget does not include the Special Assessment of \$50.

This results in a decrease of \$15,700 in our estimated income for next year. This means our annual assessment is back to \$250.00.

Once again this is a balanced budget so the projected expenditures must equal the estimated income. Several expenditures reflect increases for 2004. Roads have been increased \$2,000, Insurance \$1,500 (most of our 3 year premiums expire in Feb.) and Salaries have increased \$2,400 (This represents a 5 % increase). The major decrease is in capital improvements.

We believe we have presented a realistic budget and highly recommend your vote of support. The Board approved this budget unanimously. Thank You. We will be happy to answer any of your questions.
