**SUNSET LAKE ASSOCIATION
MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING
OCTOBER 21, 2004**

CALL TO ORDER - President Jim Dorr called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. at the Sunset Lake Community Center, Hanauer Hall. All Directors were present. President Jim Dorr stated that a quorum had been reached with 66 votes in present plus 29 votes represented by proxy.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE 2003 ANNUAL MEETING -

President Dorr asked if any questions or changes needed to be made to the minutes of October 16, 2003 which were mailed to the membership. Jim stated he would like to note on page 2 in paragraph 3 where he was talking about stickers and stated the current IL stickers would show the horsepower. Jim said that was not true, all registrations will not show the horsepower, and he was mistaken when he made that statement. A motion was made by Don Burgess to approve the minutes and seconded by Marv Wingo. The motion carried.

PRESIDENT'S REMARKS - President Jim Dorr stated it has been his job to service as president for the last 3 years and he thanked the board members past and present for all their help. Jim said the association is in good shape at this time. Jim stated financially we have been able to stay within our budget and we've got a lot accomplished. Jim said on our proposed budget we are asking for an additional \$20.00 taking the assessments to \$270.00. Jim stated most of that will be used for roads, oil, rock, culverts to be replaced and ditch work that needs to be done. Jim said there might need to be some additional work done on the East side of the spillway; we've noted there are some increased cracks and movement in some of the concrete. Jim stated we need to think about increasing our funds if something needs to be done. Jim also noted we will eventually replace chainsaws, lawnmowers, weed eaters, tractor tires, etc.

Jim said he'd like to recognize at this time our two outstanding employees. Jim said he couldn't credit them enough, the hours that are put in and the complaints that are handled in the office. Jim said the work that Bill does for individuals; some of the duties are over and above his job description. Jim noted he gets up at 2:00 in January to plow snow so you can get to work.

President Dorr stated he wanted to take a few moments to recognize a past board member, Tom Erickson. Jim noted Mr. Erickson served as Vice-President for 2 ½ years and reluctantly had to say goodbye when he moved off the lake. Jim stated Tom had done a lot to help straighten out our finances and cleanup the bookwork associated with it. Jim noted Tom also prepared the budget the past 2 years and assisted him greatly.

President Dorr stated most members have been very cooperative when receiving letters for riprap needed, cleaning up their lots or taking care of their dogs. Jim stated one thing that really needs some attention is chlorine; this needs to be checked often. Jim said another thing he'd like to bring to our attention is speed. Jim said speed on the roadways and on the lake; 6 miles is not very fast so watch closely. Jim stated also at the North entrance road there is a lot of trash thrown out so if you see someone doing this please talk to him or her. Jim mentioned burn piles are just that; not garbage dumps. Jim said if you have items such as iron, concrete, metal, etc. there is a means to get rid of it rather than dumping it on the burn piles.

President Dorr read a list of the new members who moved to the lake during the year and recognized those at the meeting.

AQUATIC CONTROL & WATER SAFETY-BOB SONS: President Dorr stated Joe Dinora was the chairperson of this committee but felt compelled to resign from the Board so Bob Sons will give the report. Bob Sons stated with Jeff Pontnack's (DNR) advice, he contacted Gary from Opel's Fish Hatchery and we are going with 750 Walleye and 350 Hybrid Redear. Bob said the fish would be delivered in a couple of weeks; it needs to be a little colder. Bob stated anyone wanting to watch the fish go in please contact him. Bob noted Jeff would be out in the spring to shock the lake again and give us a report on fish.

BUILDING & CONSTRUCTION COMMITTEE- GEORGE TOEPFER: George stated this year we had 4 permits for new homes; 2 of which are completed. George said there was 1 garage, 1 garage extension, 3 covered boat docks, 2 screened-in porches, 1 sunroom, 2 carports, 1 porch and 3 decks for a total of \$815.00 in revenue. George noted this was a good year.

DAM & GROUNDS COMMITTEE- JOHN SCHWANDNER: John stated our engineers from Greene & Bradford were out in June to inspect the Dam and Spillway. John said their report shows 1 or 2 inches of movement on the east wall and a few minor cracks that were insignificant. John stated the Board was concerned with the 1 or 2 inches and although they said to just watch it, we are in the process of contacting another consulting engineer firm for a second opinion.

John also noted we did a riprap inspection on all the lots and found 12 lots not up to par. John said we sent letters to those members and 11 out of 12 complied with the riprapping. John said as a reminder it's leaf-blowing season so keep your lots cleaned up and the leaves out of the lake. John noted the weekend after Thanksgiving we'd be going around checking lots to see that everyone is doing his or her job.

LEGAL & INSURANCE COMMITTEE-ALLAN SHARP: Allan stated there were a couple of things that happened this year; Ron Bormida's debt of \$287.00 was settled. Allan noted we settled with Town & Country Bank for \$250.00 instead of the expense of a lawsuit. Allan stated the lawsuit with Chris and Kristen McCaskey is in progress; it's in our attorney's hands.

Allan noted our insurance this year was again signed up for three years. Allan said when he took it over several years ago it was going to run around \$11,000; we cut this in half the 1st year. Allan stated due to the major problems in the country it's now at \$7,049.00; we've averaged a savings of \$4,000 each year for the past 4 years.

President Dorr stated he wanted to thank Allan for the numerous hours spent with the insurance companies and our legal attorney. Jim said this has taken a lot of his time; we've rewritten some rules & regulations and each time we did that we had it approved by the attorney to make sure we were in compliance.

ROADS COMMITTEE-BOB SONS: Bob said with the cost of rock and oil going up we hope to maintain 1/3 of the roads again next year. Bob stated Bill does a good job getting us deals and we appreciate that. Bob said this year 1/3 of the roads were done for approximately \$7,000; 11 driveways were done and part of the parking lot. Bob said we laid 600 foot of black patch on Beachview and West Lake. Bob noted on Magnolia Drive we spent approximately \$2,100; cleaned ditches, replaced culverts and ran 225 foot of 8" pipe to take water from Magnolia Drive down to lake. Bob stated next year we plan to do some work on the North side; on Circle Drive

we need to clean some ditches and there will be some culvert work that needs to be done also. Bob said he'd be out in his truck helping Bill with snow plowing again this year.

SANITATION, SHORELINE & BOAT DOCKS COMMITTEE--RICK WHITEHEAD:

Rick stated as John mentioned, we had sent out a few letters on riprap and everyone is doing pretty good with that. Rick said most members know when they need riprap so the shoreline doesn't wash away, so keep up the good work. Rick said everyone is doing really good about keeping chlorine in the bottles/tubes. Rick stated last year there was only 80% of the membership in compliance and this year it's at 92% so that is a lot better. Rick noted we have 184 sand filters, 33 aerations, and 33 lateral systems. Rick stated laterals are the only type of system that does not have chlorine but the system will have to be replaced with a sand or aeration system if the property sells. Rick stated we prefer a sand system because aerations require the system to be ran most of the time and it's hard for those members that are part-time out here.

WATER QUALITY & CONSERVATION-ERNIE NEUMANN: Ernie thanked Paul & Shirley Erley for continuing to assist as they have for many years with Illinois voluntary lake monitoring program where they take clarity test twice a month for 6 months out of the year. Ernie also thanked Steve Kolsto who is member here, works for EPA and with water quality. Ernie said it's nice to have a professional to call when you have a question. Ernie noted on the monitoring program, the last test measured 36 to 40 inches clarity just before all the rain. Ernie stated we conducted the fecal strep test where we look for sewage and animal waste in the lake. Ernie said all the tests were very good again and in fact most of them were so low that they were significantly insignificant. Ernie stated at the beginning of the year there was some members concern about the increase number of muskrats. Ernie said he talked to several members that are on the lake fishing a lot and they don't seem to think we have any more than in the past but if you think they're a problem, notify the new board because muskrat season starts November 10th.

President Dorr stated Ernie Neumann has served on the board for the last 3 years but this is his last meeting because they are moving. Jim thanked Ernie for all his help and work he had done for the Association. Jim also took a moment to thank Joe Dinora and Dennis Denney who had served on the board while he was President.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT: Bill Hohimer welcomed the new members. Bill stated as far as goose control, he bothered 29 nests for a total of 192 eggs. Bill said do not attempt to destroy eggs or remove them without a permit; they are federally regulated and the association has a permit in his name so let him do this. Bill stated we exercised the dam gates last fall and will do this again this year. Bill said he has 327 hours this year of mowing and with leaves there will be probably be another 100/125 hours. Bill stated watch the leaves when you're burning, a fire can get out of hand. Bill noted some members are taking their leaves to the burn piles and just leaving them. Bill said there are so many at one of the burn piles that if they were dry he wouldn't be able to handle them all. Bill stated if you can, try to burn your own leaves. Bill said he's also had plastics, shingles, and siding thrown on some of the burn piles; there may come a day when we lose our privileges. Bill noted with odd jobs done this year he's earned the association \$1,577.00. Bill stated he planted 10 trees this year and cut down 37 dead trees. Bill noted he replaced rock in several driveways and put down riprap where some of the ditches had washed away; we also purchased a camera this year so we can take before and after pictures. Bill said if you want your driveway done when it snows this year put your porch light on; there's approximately 10 miles of road and remember driveways are done after the roads.

Bill stated on Circle Drive next year we will be doing some ditch work, culverts, taking care of drain pipe that needs to be recapped. Bill noted most of the work would be done on the north side unless an emergency comes up. Bill thanked everyone who sent thank-you notes, left zucchini bread in his truck and gives him jelly; he really appreciates it.

FINANCE (APPROVAL OF 2005 BUDGET) – CHERYL STINE: Cheryl stated the cash position as of October 1st was \$56,020.49 and we are estimating ending the year with roughly \$29,000.00. Cheryl noted the Association has \$65,350.00 at First National Bank in an Escrow Fund and accounts receivable is at \$3,241.96. Cheryl said as far as the budget for 2004 we have approximately 95% of our income; we budgeted \$100,300.00 and total income is \$95,693.80. Cheryl said expense for the year are \$76,692.91, a total of 76.5% of what we projected.

Cheryl stated everyone received a copy of the Proposed 2005 Budget in your packet. Cheryl noted we are proposing to increase general assessments by \$20.00. Cheryl said we have several road projects next year and oil prices are up; some equipment is also due to be replaced.

President Dorr stated as far as expenses for the remainder of the year we have \$2,000.00 for fish stocking, 3 months of salaries, employment tax, and 3 more months of utilities. Jim stated we should come out close to our budget. Jim said we should end the year with roughly \$29,020.49. A motion was made by John Earley and seconded by Don Burgess that the 2005 budget be approved as proposed. The motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS - President Jim Dorr stated in the newsletter each member was notified of a change to Section 5. Boats. C. Horsepower of Motors. Jim said the rule was changed to clarify the old rule that states "No permit shall be issued to any boat propelled by a motor or motors exceeding a total of 50HP. Any lessee using the lake with a motor exceeding 50HP will be fined and the boat must be removed immediately and the permit will be revoked." Jim said we received a request and the board took this under consideration. Jim noted the new rule states "Any motor in excess of 50HP must be up and out of the water with prop off. Any lessee using the lake with a motor exceeding 50HP will be fined \$100.00 and the boat must be removed from the lake immediately and lake privileges lost, no warning given." Jim said the new rule says motors larger than the 50HP can be on the boat but must be up and out of the water. Jim noted this was changed because some members use their boats at different lakes or attends fishing tournaments.

NEW BUSINESS – Bill Harris asked if a member does not have chlorine tablets in their bottle or tube when Rick Whitehead goes around checking, could he put them in and then bill the member later. President Dorr stated this has been brought up and discussed before but he does not think it's the board member's responsibility.

Fred Gates questioned if the Board had a plan for weed control. Jim Dorr stated no, it's the member's responsibility. Jim said some members want the weeds and say it's good for fishing. Fred stated years ago there was a plan because they didn't want members spraying just anything into the lake. Verna Mayes stated to keep the clarity of the water why not amend the bylaws to say don't use chemicals just manpower. John Earley stated he participated in the weed control programs when he was on the board before. John said during that period of time extensive weed growth based on two issues; we had a lot of phosphorus getting into the lake from farm ground and the septic systems were not maintained as well as they are now. John said because of the grass strips we were able to reduce the run off from farm ground plus the improved septic

systems, we acquired less of a problem. John noted the products used at that time for weed control are now no longer as residual; most products now are contact products so they dissipate as soon as they hit the water. John said the products now would not have an affect on the clarity of the water or contamination of the lake. John Munchalfen questioned how many members like the weeds; are we looking at a 50-50 ratio. John stated he has the opportunity to dive for the fire department and has been in several bodies of water in the surrounding area. John said the majority has quite a bit of weed growth, 2' to 3' of green weeds growing across the bottom. John noted this helps the fish eat and spawn; basically helps the water clarity. Mike King noted the weeds in the water actually help break the waves too and will save on shoreline erosion. Mike stated if you kill off all the vegetation along the shore we would have a serious erosion problem.

Patty Robson said she'd like to see when a rule is changed that the whole membership votes on it. President Jim stated the Bylaws are changed by the whole membership but the Board changes Rules & Regulations. Ray Reardon said he'd like to make a clarification; members can bring up proposed rule changes. Jim agreed and stated if there is something you want to bring up to the sitting board they can take it under consideration.

ELECTION OF DIRECTORS – President Jim Dorr stated we would start with the election of three directors for 3-year terms. Jim said the terms that expire this year are George Toepfer and Cheryl Stine. Jim stated his term also expires and he would not be a candidate to run again for re-election because they purchased a place in Arizona and will be there 4 months out of the year.

George Toepfer, Marv Wingo, Rick Robson, John Munchalfen, Kate Steigerwald, John Earley, Steve Kolsto, and Mike King were nominated. Nominations were then closed.

Alice Madiar questioned the fact that Mr. Robson was in arrears, how could someone vote when lake privileges have been taken away. Jim Dorr stated yes they do owe the Association money but when we went to court this was cut and dry, the attorneys and judge got together even before we got into the courtroom. Jim said the court order states "They shall pay the sum of \$700.00 within 20 days and upon payment of this sum the defendants' membership privileges shall be restored." Jim noted this was under court order. Ruth Turner asked when the remainder of money would be paid. Jim stated half would be paid with 2005 Assessments and the second half is due with the 2006 Assessments.

Nominees were asked to tell something about themselves. Jim stated everyone knows George Toepfer already. Marv Wingo stated he's been at the lake for 12 years and lives on the north side. Rick Robson said he's been here for 13 years and feels the rules and regulations are unequally applied. Rick noted yes he did get fined and went to the board because he thought it was an unjust fine but that didn't work out so he refused to pay his dues. Rick said we went to court and it now has been settled. John Munchalfen noted he worked on the board a few years back and would like to do this again. Jim said John has done a lot of work for us around the lake as an electrician and we appreciate that. Kate Steigerwald stated she's on the north side also and has been here about 5 years but not full-time, hopefully real soon though. Kate noted she has a various background; court reporting, broadcasting, insurance and currently works for the State of Illinois. Kate stated she was eager to become a part of the lake. John Earley stated he'd been on the board for several years and has seen a lot of changes. John said some of the areas that were pastures then are now areas currently being mowed and used as park. John stated he and Hank Sutton engineered the dredging of the lake and does not have an axe to grind and will be

objective. Steve Kolsto stated he'd been with IL Environmental Protection Agency for 11 years, he's worked with John and Shirley Erley with the voluntary lake monitoring program and believes the lake is in great shape. Mike King said he's lived here for 10 years and works as a physician's assistant. Mike noted he'd been on several boards in the past and if what he can contribute was just an objective look, he'd like to get involved. Mike said his main reason is he'd like to see the lake grow and be a better place to live.

John Munchalfen, Steve Kolsto, and George Toepfer were declared the directors for 3-year terms.

Jim Dorr stated the next order of business would be to elect two members for 2-year terms. Don Burgess made a motion to take the next members in line for the 2-year terms and so on, the motion was seconded but motion did not carry. Mike King stated according to Robert's Rules of Order this can't be done unless you've made that stipulation before the meeting. Jim said before we start the nominations he would like to take a moment and recognize Allan Sharp who has turned in his resignation. Jim noted Allan has done an excellent job with the Legal & Insurance Committee and we would like to thank him.

Cheryl Stine, Tony Rubba, John Earley, Mike King, and Kate Steigerwald were nominated. Nominations were then closed.

Cheryl Stine noted she'd been in procurement for 20 years and currently works for the State as the Fiscal and Budgetary Manager for the Bureau of Management Operations at DCEO and is also the Procurement Officer. Cheryl noted she's been on the Board of the Illinois Public Procurement Assoc. for the last 10 years. Cheryl said that she and her husband have been at the lake now for 1½ years and wants to serve her community. Tony Rubba stated he's been a certified athletic trainer for the last 33 years, spent 3 years in the National Football league and 3 years with the US Olympic program. Tony said he and his wife moved to Illinois 14 years ago from New Orleans to open a business and has lived at the lake for 4 years. Tony said he felt it was time to get involved with the Board; this is our lake and wanted to be more involved. Tony noted he had no axes to grind.

Cheryl Stine and Kate Steigerwald were declared the directors for 2-year terms.

Jim Dorr stated we would now elect one member for a 1-year term. Mike King, Tony Rubba, and John Earley were nominated and nominations were then closed. John Earley was declared the director for the 1-year term.

50/50 DRAWING

President Dorr stated Shirley Erley's name was drawn for the 50/50 raffle and she won \$147.00.

Jim Dorr thanked Carol Schwandner for getting the cookies and coffee ready for the meeting tonight.

ADJOURNMENT - Upon motion by Shirley Erley, second by Vernon Broadway the meeting was adjourned by acclamation at 9:31 p.m.

Tickets are \$1.00 for 1 and \$5.00 for 6 and can be purchased anytime between now and the Annual Meeting.

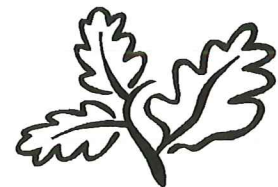
ADDING CHEMICALS TO THE LAKE

This year we've experienced problems with an unusual amount of moss on the surface of the lake. Mostly this was due to hot temperatures and lack of rainfall. Please do not try to treat this yourself.

Members are not allowed to throw copper sulfate or other chemicals in the lake without permission from the Board of Directors.

SEPTIC SYSTEMS

Regular inspections are done on the Sand Filter and Aeration septic systems. **Chlorine tablets need to be in your bottles or tubes at all times.** This is the responsibility of each member. Let's protect the lake, our public health and property values by remembering chlorine.



FALL BRINGS LEAVES

It's that time of year when leaves start falling. Generally the Board waits until after Thanksgiving to do leaf inspections. Because of problems encountered in the past, inspections will be done earlier. Remember to rake your leaves as often as possible to prevent them from going into the Lake.

A leaf fire can get out of control very easily so please be careful. Please do not burn your leaves in or on the edge of the road.

If you would need someone to take care of the leaves for you, please contact the office for referrals.

WALLEYE 101

The walleye is one of the most sought after and delicious game fish in North America. Each year anglers travel thousands of miles and spend millions of dollars on such things as fishing charters, guides, lodging, fishing equipment etc. just to bring home a trophy wall hanger or a large bag of fillets.

This is one of the things that make us lucky to live on Sunset Lake. For the past six years or so your lake board has been stocking walleye right outside your door. Besides being a fun fish to catch and good to eat, the walleye is a predator which helps keep down the population of undesirable fish such as yellow bass, green sunfish and gizzard shad.

There haven't been reports of many walleye being caught on Sunset Lake. One reason could be that walleye generally can be found in deeper water during the day moving into shallower water at night. Over by the dam would be a likely spot along points where the depth drops off quickly. Another reason could be that people aren't really fishing for walleye, catching one only occasionally, probably while fishing for crappie. A traditional method of fishing for walleye is with a jig tipped with a minnow, night crawler or leech. Vertical jigging or casting and bouncing the jig along the bottom are good approaches. In fact, a five-pound walleye was reported to have been caught last year on a deep diving crank bait. Now you know a well kept Sunset Lake secret, happy fishing and let the stories start.

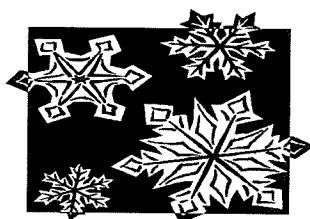
BURN PILES
