# SUNSET LAKE ASSOCIATION

## ANNUAL MEETING

OCTOBER 15, 1998

The Annual Membership Meeting was held on Thursday, October 15, 1998 at the Sunset Lake Hall for the first year and started at 7:30 P.M. with all Board Directors present, except Pete McCoy. President Lou Long stated that a quorum had been reached with 61 members present, plus 25 members represented by proxy, making a total of 86 Class "A" members eligible to vote.

**President's Remarks.** Pres. Lou Long thanked John Schwandner #22 and Bob Thompson #220, for being Volunteer Lake Patrolmen. He announced that Bill Hohimer has been in the employ of Sunset Lake for 10 years and thanked Bill for his dedicated service to the Association. The President also thanked those members who continually mow adjacent lots, so Bill doesn't have. He stated that tonight we need to approve the Budget, elect 3 Board members, plus 1 Board member to finish the one-year term vacated by Dave Beck, who was temporarily replaced by Ken Volz in May 1998.

Lou Long stated that there are several new members present since last Oct. and asked them to stand and identify themselves: #284 Jim & Margaret Dorr, #159 Ron & Penny Richison, #128 Charles C. & Dorothy Jones, #221 John & JoAnn Munchalfen, #287 Tom & Joyce Erickson.

**Approval of the Minutes of the 1997 Annual Meeting.** The motion to accept the Minutes was made by #219 Jim Rice, and seconded by #22 John Schwandner. The motion carried.

**Aquatic Control, Recreation & Water Safety Committee.** Chairperson Pete McCoy #131, was unable to attend, and Bob Hanauer, #50, read Pete's report for him. "The USDA came out 3 times and dipped and/or took 200 goose eggs. Continuing this process should get the goose population under control. The beaver problem, for the present, seems to be solved but the muskrats are still a big problem. Over 100 muskrats were trapped this year. Bill Hohimer made new buoys this year out of PVC pipes which worked very well and all marker buoys will be made of this type in the future. At the end of this month 755 8" Walleyes and 755 8"-12" Channel Catfish will be added to the lake. The stocking of these fish should be continued in the future. For those who aren't aware Yellow Bass or Stripers and Green Sunfish eat the same food as Bluegill and Red Ears, so please don't throw them back into the lake. I would like to thank the membership for electing me (Pete McCoy) to the Board of Directors, and I hope I have contributed to the administration of the Association, but due to health reasons, I am unable to run again for the Board." Bob Hanauer added that Pete and Paula are both good friends and are both very ill, so he asked the members to say a prayer for them.

**Building & Construction Committee.** Chairman Ed Smith reported that since Oct. 16, 1997, 1 cabin and 1 of the oldest houses on the lake were torn down. There have been 4 permits to build new homes: #112 Larry & Janet Duke, #49C Greg & Linda Carpenter, #249 Larry & Carla Royer, and #253 Vince & Nell Zerante. There have also been permits issued for 2 covered boat docks, 11 boat docks were built or repaired, 1 boat house, 3 garages, 5 additions to homes, 1 gazebo, 7 sheds and 4 decks, 1 deck addition, and 1 screened-in patio. This all makes more permanent homes on the lake.

**Farm Management.** Chairperson John Earley brought visual aids to illustrate the conditions of the soil on the farm. He explained that we had the first crop planted since 1994, after the burm was taken down. A wheat crop was planted for excellent winter cover to prevent erosion into the lake. He said conservation tillage is the goal. We got 39 bushels per acre which is a little low due to the condition of the soil and compaction. He showed the KSI Lab Reports taken from an ATV with an on-board global positioning computer which locks into a satellite showing the 29.7 acre farm ground conditions. A grid map was set up for soil sampling in 23 locations to determine the condition of the soil, which shows high variability. He showed the PH map which illustrates where lime is needed, the Phosphorous map showed deficiencies in the southern and central part of the farm, and the Potassium was low over all. He showed the Soil Test Results chart. All this information allows the ground to be treated with whatever is deficient where it is exactly needed. This will allow us to manage the ground most efficiently.

For Budgeting reasons, John continued, the farm will be cash rented this coming year. Since we don't own farm equipment, profitability is low. The contracts will be sent out soon. Bob Slagle#55,57 asked who pays for the fertilizer? John answered that SLA will have to pay for the lime and some land leveling, but everything else is paid by the tenant. John Luparell #166A asked why the farmer couldn't do the land leveling? John Earley answered that they do not have the proper equipment.

**Legal & Insurance.** Chairman Al Tretter reported that there were no legal expenses in the past year, and nothing is coming up in the foreseeable future. On Insurance, we had Builder's Risk on the Community Center, which rolled over to our regular coverage when the building was completed. We have Commercial Inland Marine, Auto, Property & Liability, the Umbrella and Workers Compensation through American States. Safeco bought American States for \$2.8 billion. We don't see any unusual changes in the future. Our Bond is with Western Surety. We are paying less now than in the past, so the Budget was reduced this year from \$11,000

to \$10,000, even with the new building.

**Roads & Grounds Maintenance.** Chairman George Madiar said we are very fortunate to have Bill Hohimer to take care of our roads and grounds. George said that the humps in the middle of the roads that have built up over the years will require some special equipment to remedy. We will oil and rock the roads that haven't been done in 1999. He introduced Bill Hohimer to report on the different numerous projects done this year.

Bill Hohimer said this is the first year he has been asked to report in 10 years. On Oct. 16, 1997, we started on the new building and finished 100 days later. He said he worked on leaf removal last fall, a little snow removal, 18 new street signs were made, plus 6 new buoys last winter. In the spring, Bill said he planted around 70 trees on the North side and 20 bushes at the new building. We put in a new bridge on N. Circle Dr. to replace the old rusted out culvert underneath and to widen it to 30 ft. X 50 ft. It had been undermined very badly and was replaced just in time. The pipe was furnished by North Otter Township (saving SLA about \$800), and John Miller & Sons did the work on the bridge. We put in 5 new culverts on Circle Dr. and found that 2 were completely rusted out. At #22A we had a water run-off problem from the farm, so about 200 ft. of drain pipe was put in, plus a new culvert under the road, which relieved Knudson's who had water running into their driveway. We cleaned out the upper end of Birch Pond and put in a dry dam, added 50 ft. of pipe and a berm to Pine Pond. Culverts were put in on West Lake Dr. between #233 and #234 to help drain water down to the lake, and around the corner an 8" pipe was put in to help drain that area, then across from #263, 264 he cleaned out the brush around the gully and seeded it with grass. On North Lake Rd., we added about 3 ft. to widen the road from the bus turn to Willow with road pack, then rolled it, primed it and oiled it, and on West Lake the same was done from Sycamore to Magnolia adding about 2 foot to the width of the road. Twenty (20) driveways were done and the parking lot at the new Community Center. Bill said he put in 273 hours mowing grass this season.

**Sanitation, Shoreline & Boat Docks.** Lou Long informed the meeting that Ken Volz was appointed to fill the unexpired term of Dave Beck. Chairman Ken Volz reported that this is the second year of chlorine inspections on the lake and we have improved considerably. This being an ecologically sensitive area in that the lake comes to everyone's front door, so what goes into the lake affects everyone else on the lake. Ken thanked the members for their cooperation. He said that many of us came from communities that had waste management plants, and that we need to learn how to protect ourselves from septic contamination in the lake. Lake Springfield has found out what a concern it is for everyone on a lake if there is a problem, to the point of reducing their property values by 1/3. Last year, we discovered that we were not protecting ourselves very well, or the future of the lake. Those with chlorine in their tanks went from 66% in 1997 to 86% this year. This is a significant improvement, but we need to do better in the future. The News.Net will continue to publish ways to keep our septic systems functioning properly and give tips to help us all keep down costs, like preventative maintenance. The chlorine tablets and bottles will be on hand at the office for the members' convenience. Ken thanked all those who have taken an interest in this issue to improve our lake's quality.

**Water Quality, Soil Conservation & Restoration.** Ray Reardon said that Bill Hohimer covered several of the Conservation projects done this year. In addition, SLA split the cost of 3 dry ponds on Elmer Hays' property on the northeast end of the lake. This project was in the best interest of Sunset Lake to help prevent silt from coming back into the lake. At #166,166A, the dry pond failed, and was repaired, again to prevent silt from reaching the lake. On water quality, Ray thanked the volunteers who take the samples; Paul & Shirley Erley #89 and Pete McCoy #131. The free IEPA sampling test on the average clarity was 36", which ranked Sunset Lake at 84 out of 164 lakes that participate. On suspended solids, Sunset Lake was 5 milligrams per liter which is minimal, and volatile suspended solids or algae was 2 milligrams which is less than half or very low. We also tested for two types of nitrogen, nitrate was at .07 and ammonia was .27 which is very good. We have to watch nitrogen and phosphorous very closely because of detergents and fertilizers that run into the lake. The phosphorous level was at .106 per liter, which is a little higher than last year, so Ray encouraged members to use only low phosphate detergents and fertilizers. There were no reports of blue-green algae from anyone on the lake. The three chlorophyll levels and the eutrophic (ability to support plant growth) levels were just over the "slight" category, which is good. Concerning the leptosclorosis problem in Springfield, the testing is expensive and inexact, and he was told to only test if it is found. On atrazine, he was informed that the levels would have to be very high to affect the recreational uses of the lake. He contacted the Seba Gigi Lab and they will do 2 tests for us for free; one in the fall and one in the spring. Normally they will only do tests for lakes that are used for drinking water like Otter Lake. Ray reported that there is no sign of zebra mussels in the lake. Jim Rice #219 asked about the mussel die off this past summer. Ray answered that it was a normal lake cycle and is not unusual.

**Finance.** Chairman Bob Hanauer reported that we have 2 loans. The Silt Loan which will be paid off in the spring of the year 2000, which 101 members are still paying on annually. The second loan is on the new Community Center building for \$38,000 at 8% for 15 years with a 5-year balloon. Bob said he hoped it would be paid off in 8 years, instead of 15. We have \$11,000 in Equipment Reserve for a new truck or

other equipment. This year it was moved into CD's at 6% instead 2%. We have enough reserve to get us through January 1999 with \$4000 left over. Ron Bormida #85, asked why we didn't buy a backhoe attachment for ditches, culverts, etc., instead of paying someone else? Bob Hanauer answered that Miller and Clark do real good work very fast because they use the equipment all the time. Bill Hohimer said that there are only 4 culverts left that haven't been replaced and at \$40-50 per hour, we can't afford to have a backhoe just sitting and doing nothing. Bob Hanauer said that the truck needs to be replaced in a couple of years and that is really what we are saving for, without raising assessments.

**1999 Budget** - Bob Hanauer reported that this is the second year assessments have not been raised, and unless there is an unforeseen emergency, such as a lawsuit or repair to the dam, the assessments won't be raised in the future. Fred Gates #159, asked how we can get \$8700 from the farm and spend \$5600? Bob answered that the Board decided to Cash Rent the farm to one of three farmers, which they will vote on in the Executive session. John Earley said either way, it comes out to be around \$3200 income from the farm. Ron Rice #237,237A, asked how the Board came up with the salaries for the two most important people on the lake; the employees? Bob answered that the Board gave them a 4% raise. Ron Rice said that they deserve a bigger raise. Lou Long said that we can't raise the assessments to pay them more, but he agreed that they are underpaid. Ron Rice said if we can afford a new building, then the Board can surely come up with more money for the employees. Ron Rice made the motion to raise Bill Hohimer's salary to \$24,000 and Peggy Volz' salary to \$11,000. Bob Hanauer said he agreed that the employees are underpaid, but each Committee Chairperson decides how much they think they will need. John Earley said the members have the right to raise the salaries. Bob Slagle, #55,57, asked how much of a percentage raise does that come to? Lou Long answered that it is an extra \$800 for Bill and \$200 for Peggy. Ron Weller seconded the motion to raise salaries. There was a hand vote, with the majority voting yes and 4 voting no. The motion passed. Jim Perry, #26, asked if there wasn't a special assessment since 1996 for the roads? Lou Long answered that Fred Gates made a motion to raise assessments to \$250 so that 1/3 of the roads could be done for three consecutive years. Bob Hanauer said it was not a special assessment, and that 3 years ago, we were almost broke, so we needed the extra funds to get all the roads done. Ken Lazzaro, #12, asked where the extra money would come from for salary increases? Bob Hanauer answered that the Budget will be adjusted \$200 here and there. Jodie Seman, #16, said she wasn't against the raises, but the average American only gets a 3% raise, and half the membership isn't here to vote. Lou Long answered that our employees don't get any retirement or medical benefits, so they have to set up their own retirement and pay their own medical. Ken Lazzaro, #12, said they can go get jobs somewhere else. Bob Hanauer asked him if he would like Bill Hohimer's job? Bob Hanauer said the membership has no idea how much money Bill and Peggy have saved us over the years in expenses. Ron Bormida #85, suggested paying Bill the original salary in the Budget, then pay him hourly for snow removal. Bob Hanauer said it has already been passed by the membership. Bob Slagle, #55,57, made the motion to approve the 1999 Budget, MariAnn McAnarney seconded it. It passed overwhelmingly.

**Approval of Updated Bylaws** - Lou Long explained that the Board cannot change any of the Bylaws without membership approval. Ron Bormida, #85, asked about Article IV, Section 2 which gives the Board the right to establish rules. Bob Hanauer said to read Art. VII in the old Bylaws, Rule Promulgation, where it says the same thing. He continued that these are the Bylaws, not the Rules and Regulations, and the Board has had this power since 1964 or earlier. He explained that the Bylaws were re-worded or updated to get rid of outdated language. Lou Long said the Board must have the right to make day-to-day changes in the rules. John Luparell, #166A, asked what the difference is between bylaws and rules. Bob Hanauer explained that the Bylaws are like the Constitution, and the Rules and Regulations are like laws. Lou Long added that the Board is like a City Counsel, which has the right and responsibility to pass laws. Bob Hanauer added that the Board must notify the membership before a rule-change is enforced. Ron Bormida said that this is too much power to give to the Board. Bob Hanauer added that it has always been like that, and the Board is not asking for any new authority. Jim Power, #256, asked why the Board has the power to make or change rules. Ken Lazzaro, #12, made the motion to accept the revised Bylaws. Jodie Seman, #16, seconded the motion. Fred Gates, #159, said he has lived here since 1970, the Board has changed a lot of rules and no one ever said that it was wrong. Jim Power said that the membership should decide on rule changes, like the ski hours. Fred Gates said that you can't run the day-to-day business if you have to get a vote from the entire membership, that this should be left to the Board or there would be chaos. He added that you either trust the Board or not. Ingrid Hansen, #29, said that in the City of Springfield there are public hearings before rules are changed. Fred Gates said the members are welcome to come to any regular meeting. Ray Reardon, #256A,257, said the Board has the duty and the power to change rules, but if it is controversial then it should be brought up at the Annual meeting or at the regular meetings. John Earley, #8, said that the Board has mostly deleted archaic language in the Bylaws, and this does not pertain to the Rules and Regulations. He went on to say that some members seem to be uneasy about changes, and as a Board, we need to be careful before changing rules. Lou Long stated that the Rules and Regulations are going through the same process of cleaning out archaic language, or rules that are not pertinent anymore. The President called for a vote, which was overwhelmingly approved with none opposed.

**The Election of Three Directors of the Board for 3 year terms & 1 Director for a 1 year term.** Pres. Lou Long said that Ray Reardon, Bob Hanauer and Pete McCoy (not running for re-election) are up for election to 3-year terms and Ken Volz is up for election to fill a 1 year term. Bob Slagle, #55,57, nominated Bob Hanauer, #50, and Marvin Wingo, #51, seconded. Ed Burg, #101,101A, nominated John Schwandner and Bob Hanauer seconded. Earl Haynes, #28, nominated Ron Bormida, #85, and Laverne Harvey seconded. Bob Sons, #277, nominated Ray Reardon, and Ed Snell, #286, seconded. Lou Long asked for nominations for the unexpired one-year term of Dave Beck filled by Ken Volz. AnnaMae Hanauer, #50, nominated Ken Volz and Ben Chase, #9A, seconded. Bob Slagle, #55,57 made the motion to close the nominations, and John Luparell, #166A, seconded. The motion carried. Lou Long asked those nominated to stand and he introduced them. Lou Long added that the newest Board member will be the Lake Patrolman, and Ken Volz is elected for the one year term since he was the only nomination. Ken Lazzaro, #12, objected and wanted to make another nomination, but Lou Long said that the nominations had been closed and seconded. Lou Long read Article IV, Sec. 6 on Vacancies. Jim Rice, #219, made the motion to close nominations for the one-year term again, and Mariann McAnarney, #52,52A, seconded again. Lou Long stated that Ken Volz, #9B had been elected. The vote for three 3-year terms are as follows: Bob Hanauer- 75 votes, Ray Reardon- 79 votes, John Schwandner- 65 votes, and Ron Bormida- 29 votes. Bob Hanauer, Ray Reardon, and John Schwandner were elected.

Lou Long told the membership to contact the Secretary to sign up for the Am. Red Cross CPR class for \$39.50. The classes will be held on Tues. and Thur. nights. He also asked everyone who hasn't signed, if they would be interested in signing the Petition to move the Polling place to the Community Center Hall, to please do so before leaving.

Fred Gates, #159, asked if a list could be printed with the new addresses on it? Lou asked the Secretary to report. Peggy said that she is waiting until all the address changes have been made due to errors, then she will call Miller Management for a new list. The one that Miller sent her did not list the addresses for those not living on the lake, other than as occupants with no lot number, so it is impossible to determine what those addresses are. She also told the members that the Post Master said to call Miller Mgmt. for a new map, since we can't fit 5 digits on most of the lots on our map, and Miller is supposed to have a satellite map with the new addresses on it. John Earley asked why we need to put the new numbers on our map, since they aren't in sequence, and that we will continue to use our numbering system. Lavern Harvey, #242, agreed that the new numbers made no sense.

Ron Rice, #237,237A, asked if the Hall is for rent to non-members? Lou Long said no, unless the membership changes it.

Earl Haynes, #28, made the motion to adjourn, and was seconded by Jim Perry, #26. The Annual meeting adjourned at 9:25PM.

## ORGANIZATIONAL BOARD MEETING

October 15, 1998

Lou Long called the Executive Session to order at 9:35 PM with the following Board Members present:

Ken Volz, #9B

Lou Long said to vote on the Cash Rent contract first. The bids were as follows: Dave Drake- \$2227.50, Farley Cole- \$3787.92, and Gary & Ron Hays- \$3200.00. Lou told the Board that John Earley will abstain from voting due to a conflict of interest. John Earley said there is more to consider than just the total bid. Lou Long pointed out that Gary Hays is our closest neighbor and to give him the bid would be the best political move. Bob Hanauer said he would love to see Gary Hays and Sunset Lake work together, and that we are only talking about a \$600 difference between the highest bid and Gary Hays' bid. John Schwandner asked what the advantages would be if the bid went to Gary Hays? Lou Long answered that his farm is adjacent to Sunset Lake, and we need to improve the relationship between SLA and Hays, and he is also willing to do a conservation project on an area that allows silt into the lake. John Earley said Gary Hays farms most ground around the lake, he cash rented the buffer strip on the East side, he has a waterway behind his house to the lake which he is willing to work to stop silt run-off with government aid. Ken Volz said he will get ½ paid for by the government. John Schwandner asked where Farley Cole lived? John Earley answered that he lives north of Chapel Union about one mile. Ed Smith made the motion to accept Gary Hays' bid, and Al Tretter seconded it. The vote was unanimous for Gary Hays, with John Earley abstaining. Lou Long asked if it would be proper to write to Cole and Drake. John Earley said yes, but we need to get a signed contract first, get a lime application, plus a minor surface adjustment in about a year.

Bob Hanauer made the motion that Secretary Peggy Volz and Superintendent Bill Hohimer be re-hired, and Al Tretter seconded the motion. It carried by consensus with Ken Volz abstaining. Bob Hanauer made the motion to re-elect Lou Long #223, as President and Al Tretter seconded it. The motion carried by consensus. Lou Long made the motion to re-elect Bob Hanauer as Vice President, and John Earley seconded it. The motion carried by consensus. Bob Hanauer made the motion to re-elect George Madiar as Treasurer, and Al Tretter seconded it. The motion carried by consensus. Bob Hanauer made the motion to re-elect Peggy Volz as Secretary, and Al Tretter seconded. It passed unanimously with Ken Volz abstaining.

Pres. Lou Long said there would be no changes on the Chairs of the Committees, except John Schwandner, who will be Chairman of Aquatic Control and Water Safety, and therefore also the Lake Patrolman.

Bob Hanauer made the motion to adjourn and John Earley seconded it. The motion carried by consensus. The meeting adjourned at 9:50PM.

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**Aquatic Control, Recreation & Water Safety Committee.** Chairperson Pete McCoy #131, was unable to attend, and Bob Hanauer, #50, read Pete's report for him. "The USDA came out 3 times and dipped and/or took 200 goose eggs. Continuing this process should get the goose population under control. The beaver problem, for the present, seems to be solved but the muskrats are still a big problem. Over 100 muskrats were trapped this year. Bill Hohimer made new buoys this year out of PVC pipes which worked very well and all marker buoys will be made of this type in the future. At the end of this month 755 8" Walleyes and 755 8"-12" Channel Catfish will be added to the lake. The stocking of these fish should be continued in the future. For those who aren't aware Yellow Bass or Stripers and Green Sunfish eat the same food as Bluegill and Red Ears, so please don't throw them back into the lake. I would like to thank the membership for electing me (Pete McCoy) to the Board of Directors, and I hope I have contributed to the administration of the Association, but due to health reasons, I am unable to run again for the Board." Bob Hanauer added that Pete and Paula are both good friends and are both very ill, so he asked the members to say a prayer for them.

**Building & Construction Committee.** Chairman Ed Smith reported that since Oct. 16, 1997, 1 cabin and 1 of the oldest houses on the lake were torn down. There have been 4 permits to build new homes: #112 Larry & Janet Duke, #49C Greg & Linda Carpenter, #249 Larry & Carla Royer, and #253 Vince & Nell Zerante. There have also been permits issued for 2 covered boat docks, 11 boat docks were built or repaired, 1 boat house, 3 garages, 5 additions to homes, 1 gazebo, 7 sheds and 4 decks, 1 deck addition, and 1 screened-in patio. This all makes more permanent homes on the lake.

**Farm Management.** Chairperson John Earley brought visual aids to illustrate the conditions of the soil on the farm. He explained that we had the first crop planted since 1994, after the burm was taken down. A wheat crop was planted for excellent winter cover to prevent erosion into the lake. He said conservation tillage is the goal. We got 39 bushels per acre which is a little low due to the condition of the soil and compaction. He showed the KSI Lab Reports taken from an ATV with an on-board global positioning computer which locks into a satellite showing the 29.7 acre farm ground conditions. A grid map was set up for soil sampling in 23 locations to determine the condition of the soil, which shows high variability. He showed the PH map which illustrates where lime is needed, the Phosphorous map showed deficiencies in the southern and central part of the farm, and the Potassium was low over all. He showed the Soil Test Results chart. All this information allows the ground to be treated with whatever is deficient where it is exactly needed. This will allow us to manage the ground most efficiently.

For Budgeting reasons, John continued, the farm will be cash rented this coming year. Since we don't own farm equipment, profitability is low. The contracts will be sent out soon. Bob Slagle#55,57 asked who pays for the fertilizer? John answered that SLA will have to pay for the lime and some land leveling, but everything else is paid by the tenant. John Luparell #166A asked why the farmer couldn't do the land leveling? John Earley answered that they do not have the proper equipment.

**Legal & Insurance.** Chairman Al Tretter reported that there were no legal expenses in the past year, and nothing is coming up in the foreseeable future. On Insurance, we had Builder's Risk on the Community Center, which rolled over to our regular coverage when the building was completed. We have Commercial Inland Marine, Auto, Property & Liability, the Umbrella and Workers Compensation through American States. Safeco bought American States for \$2.8 billion. We don't see any unusual changes in the future. Our Bond is with Western Surety. We are paying less now than in the past, so the Budget was reduced this year from \$11,000

other equipment. This year it was moved into CD's at 6% instead 2%. We have enough reserve to get us through January 1999 with \$4000 left over. Ron Bormida #85, asked why we didn't buy a backhoe attachment for ditches, culverts, etc., instead of paying someone else? Bob Hanauer answered that Miller and Clark do real good work very fast because they use the equipment all the time. Bill Hohimer said that there are only 4 culverts left that haven't been replaced and at \$40-50 per hour, we can't afford to have a backhoe just sitting and doing nothing. Bob Hanauer said that the truck needs to be replaced in a couple of years and that is really what we are saving for, without raising assessments.

**1999 Budget** - Bob Hanauer reported that this is the second year assessments have not been raised, and unless there is an unforeseen emergency, such as a lawsuit or repair to the dam, the assessments won't be raised in the future. Fred Gates #159, asked how we can get \$8700 from the farm and spend \$5600? Bob answered that the Board decided to Cash Rent the farm to one of three farmers, which they will vote on in the Executive session. John Earley said either way, it comes out to be around \$3200 income from the farm. Ron Rice #237,237A, asked how the Board came up with the salaries for the two most important people on the lake; the employees? Bob answered that the Board gave them a 4% raise. Ron Rice said that they deserve a bigger raise. Lou Long said that we can't raise the assessments to pay them more, but he agreed that they are underpaid. Ron Rice said if we can afford a new building, then the Board can surely come up with more money for the employees. Ron Rice made the motion to raise Bill Hohimer's salary to \$24,000 and Peggy Volz' salary to \$11,000. Bob Hanauer said he agreed that the employees are underpaid, but each Committee Chairperson decides how much they think they will need. John Earley said the members have the right to raise the salaries. Bob Slagle, #55,57, asked how much of a percentage raise does that come to? Lou Long answered that it is an extra \$800 for Bill and \$200 for Peggy. Ron Weller seconded the motion to raise salaries. There was a hand vote, with the majority voting yes and 4 voting no. The motion passed. Jim Perry, #26, asked if there wasn't a special assessment since 1996 for the roads? Lou Long answered that Fred Gates made a motion to raise assessments to \$250 so that 1/3 of the roads could be done for three consecutive years. Bob Hanauer said it was not a special assessment, and that 3 years ago, we were almost broke, so we needed the extra funds to get all the roads done. Ken Lazzaro, #12, asked where the extra money would come from for salary increases? Bob Hanauer answered that the Budget will be adjusted \$200 here and there. Jodie Seman, #16, said she wasn't against the raises, but the average American only gets a 3% raise, and half the membership isn't here to vote. Lou Long answered that our employees don't get any retirement or medical benefits, so they have to set up their own retirement and pay their own medical. Ken Lazzaro, #12, said they can go get jobs somewhere else. Bob Hanauer asked him if he would like Bill Hohimer's job? Bob Hanauer said the membership has no idea how much money Bill and Peggy have saved us over the years in expenses. Ron Bormida #85, suggested paying Bill the original salary in the Budget, then pay him hourly for snow removal. Bob Hanauer said it has already been passed by the membership. Bob Slagle, #55,57, made the motion to approve the 1999 Budget. MariAnn McAnarney seconded it. It passed overwhelmingly.

**Approval of Updated Bylaws** - Lou Long explained that the Board cannot change any of the Bylaws without membership approval. Ron Bormida, #85, asked about Article IV, Section 2 which gives the Board the right to establish rules. Bob Hanauer said to read Art. VII in the old Bylaws, Rule Promulgation, where it says the same thing. He continued that these are the Bylaws, not the Rules and Regulations, and the Board has had this power since 1964 or earlier. He explained that the Bylaws were re-worded or updated to get rid of outdated language. Lou Long said the Board must have the right to make day-to-day changes in the rules. John Luparell, #166A, asked what the difference is between bylaws and rules. Bob Hanauer explained that the Bylaws are like the Constitution, and the Rules and Regulations are like laws. Lou Long added that the Board is like a City Counsel, which has the right and responsibility to pass laws. Bob Hanauer added that the Board must notify the membership before a rule-change is enforced. Ron Bormida said that this is too much power to give to the Board. Bob Hanauer added that it has always been like that, and the Board is not asking for any new authority. Jim Power, #256, asked why the Board has the power to make or change rules. Ken Lazzaro, #12, made the motion to accept the revised Bylaws. Jodie Seman, #16, seconded the motion. Fred Gates, #159, said he has lived here since 1970, the Board has changed a lot of rules and no one ever said that it was wrong. Jim Power said that the membership should decide on rule changes, like the ski hours. Fred Gates said that you can't run the day-to-day business if you have to get a vote from the entire membership, that this should be left to the Board or there would be chaos. He added that you either trust the Board or not. Ingrid Hansen, #29, said that in the City of Springfield there are public hearings before rules are changed. Fred Gates said the members are welcome to come to any regular meeting. Ray Reardon, #256A,257, said the Board has the duty and the power to change rules, but if it is controversial then it should be brought up at the Annual meeting or at the regular meetings. John Earley, #8, said that the Board has mostly deleted archaic language in the Bylaws, and this does not pertain to the Rules and Regulations. He went on to say that some members seem to be uneasy about changes, and as a Board, we need to be careful before changing rules. Lou Long stated that the Rules and Regulations are going through the same process of cleaning out archaic language, or rules that are not pertinent anymore. The President called for a vote, which was overwhelmingly approved with none opposed.

## ANNUAL MEETING

OCTOBER 15, 1998

The Annual Membership Meeting was held on Thursday, October 15, 1998 at the Sunset Lake Hall for the first year and started at 7:30 P.M. with all Board Directors present, except Pete McCoy. President Lou Long stated that a quorum had been reached with 61 members present, plus 25 members represented by proxy, making a total of 86 Class "A" members eligible to vote.

**President's Remarks.** Pres. Lou Long thanked John Schwandner #22 and Bob Thompson #220, for being Volunteer Lake Patrolmen. He announced that Bill Hohimer has been in the employ of Sunset Lake for 10 years and thanked Bill for his dedicated service to the Association. The President also thanked those members who continually mow adjacent lots, so Bill doesn't have. He stated that tonight we need to approve the Budget, elect 3 Board members, plus 1 Board member to finish the one-year term vacated by Dave Beck, who was temporarily replaced by Ken Volz in May 1998. Lou Long stated that there are several new members present since last Oct. and asked them to stand and identify themselves: #284 Jim & Margaret Dorr, #159 Ron & Penny Richison, #128 Charles C. & Dorothy Jones, #221 John & JoAnn Munchalfen, #287 Tom & Joyce Erickson.

**Approval of the Minutes of the 1997 Annual Meeting.** The motion to accept the Minutes was made by #219 Jim Rice, and seconded by #22 John Schwandner. The motion carried.

**Aquatic Control, Recreation & Water Safety Committee.** Chairperson Pete McCoy #131, was unable to attend, and Bob Hanauer, #50, read Pete's report for him. "The USDA came out 3 times and dipped and/or took 200 goose eggs. Continuing this process should get the goose population under control. The beaver problem, for the present, seems to be solved but the muskrats are still a big problem. Over 100 muskrats were trapped this year. Bill Hohimer made new buoys this year out of PVC pipes which worked very well and all marker buoys will be made of this type in the future. At the end of this month 755 8" Walleyes and 755 8"-12" Channel Catfish will be added to the lake. The stocking of these fish should be continued in the future. For those who aren't aware Yellow Bass or Stripers and Green Sunfish eat the same food as Bluegill and Red Ears, so please don't throw them back into the lake. I would like to thank the membership for electing me (Pete McCoy) to the Board of Directors, and I hope I have contributed to the administration of the Association, but due to health reasons, I am unable to run again for the Board." Bob Hanauer added that Pete and Paula are both good friends and are both very ill, so he asked the members to say a prayer for them.

**Building & Construction Committee.** Chairman Ed Smith reported that since Oct. 16, 1997, 1 cabin and 1 of the oldest houses on the lake were torn down. There have been 4 permits to build new homes: #112 Larry & Janet Duke, #49C Greg & Linda Carpenter, #249 Larry & Carla Royer, and #253 Vince & Nell Zerante. There have also been permits issued for 2 covered boat docks, 11 boat docks were built or repaired, 1 boat house, 3 garages, 5 additions to homes, 1 gazebo, 7 sheds and 4 decks, 1 deck addition, and 1 screened-in patio. This all makes more permanent homes on the lake.

**Farm Management.** Chairperson John Earley brought visual aids to illustrate the conditions of the soil on the farm. He explained that we had the first crop planted since 1994, after the burm was taken down. A wheat crop was planted for excellent winter cover to prevent erosion into the lake. He said conservation tillage is the goal. We got 39 bushels per acre which is a little low due to the condition of the soil and compaction. He showed the KSI Lab Reports taken from an ATV with an on-board global positioning computer which locks into a satellite showing the 29.7 acre farm ground conditions. A grid map was set up for soil sampling in 23 locations to determine the condition of the soil, which shows high variability. He showed the PH map which illustrates where lime is needed, the Phosphorous map showed deficiencies in the southern and central part of the farm, and the Potassium was low over all. He showed the Soil Test Results chart. All this information allows the ground to be treated with whatever is deficient where it is exactly needed. This will allow us to manage the ground most efficiently.

For Budgeting reasons, John continued, the farm will be cash rented this coming year. Since we don't own farm equipment, profitability is low. The contracts will be sent out soon. Bob Slagle #55,57 asked who pays for the fertilizer? John answered that SLA will have to pay for the lime and some land leveling, but everything else is paid by the tenant. John Luparell #166A asked why the farmer couldn't do the land leveling? John Earley answered that they do not have the proper equipment.

**Legal & Insurance.** Chairman Al Tretter reported that there were no legal expenses in the past year, and nothing is coming up in the foreseeable future. On Insurance, we had Builder's Risk on the Community Center, which rolled over to our regular coverage when the building was completed. We have Commercial Inland Marine, Auto, Property & Liability, the Umbrella and Workers Compensation through American States. Safeco bought American States for \$2.8 billion. We don't see any unusual changes in the future. Our Bond is with Western Surety. We are paying less now than in the past, so the Budget was reduced this year from \$11,000

to \$10,000, even with the new building.

**Roads & Grounds Maintenance.** Chairman George Madiar said we are very fortunate to have Bill Hohimer to take care of our roads and grounds. George said that the humps in the middle of the roads that have built up over the years will require some special equipment to remedy. We will oil and rock the roads that haven't been done in 1999. He introduced Bill Hohimer to report on the different numerous projects done this year.

Bill Hohimer said this is the first year he has been asked to report in 10 years. On Oct. 16, 1997, we started on the new building and finished 100 days later. He said he worked on leaf removal last fall, a little snow removal, 18 new street signs were made, plus 6 new buoys last winter. In the spring, Bill said he planted around 70 trees on the North side and 20 bushes at the new building. We put in a new bridge on N. Circle Dr. to replace the old rusted out culvert underneath and to widen it to 30 ft. X 50 ft. It had been undermined very badly and was replaced just in time. The pipe was furnished by North Otter Township (saving SLA about \$800), and John Miller & Sons did the work on the bridge. We put in 5 new culverts on Circle Dr. and found that 2 were completely rusted out. At #22A we had a water run-off problem from the farm, so about 200 ft. of drain pipe was put in, plus a new culvert under the road, which relieved Knudson's who had water running into their driveway. We cleaned out the upper end of Birch Pond and put in a dry dam, added 50 ft. of pipe and a burm to Pine Pond. Culverts were put in on West Lake Dr. between #233 and #234 to help drain water down to the lake, and around the corner an 8" pipe was put in to help drain that area, then across from #263, 264 he cleaned out the brush around the gully and seeded it with grass. On North Lake Rd., we added about 3 ft. to widen the road from the bus turn to Willow with road pack, then rolled it, primed it and oiled it, and on West Lake the same was done from Sycamore to Magnolia adding about 2 foot to the width of the road. Twenty (20) driveways were done and the parking lot at the new Community Center. Bill said he put in 273 hours mowing grass this season.

**Sanitation, Shoreline & Boat Docks.** Lou Long informed the meeting that Ken Volz was appointed to fill the unexpired term of Dave Beck. Chairman Ken Volz reported that this is the second year of chlorine inspections on the lake and we have improved considerably. This being an ecologically sensitive area in that the lake comes to everyone's front door, so what goes into the lake affects everyone else on the lake. Ken thanked the members for their cooperation. He said that many of us came from communities that had waste management plants, and that we need to learn how to protect ourselves from septic contamination in the lake. Lake Springfield has found out what a concern it is for everyone on a lake if there is a problem, to the point of reducing their property values by 1/3. Last year, we discovered that we were not protecting ourselves very well, or the future of the lake. Those with chlorine in their tanks went from 66% in 1997 to 86% this year. This is a significant improvement, but we need to do better in the future. The News.Net will continue to publish ways to keep our septic systems functioning properly and give tips to help us all keep down costs, like preventative maintenance. The chlorine tablets and bottles will be on hand at the office for the members' convenience. Ken thanked all those who have taken an interest in this issue to improve our lake's quality.

**Water Quality, Soil Conservation & Restoration.** Ray Reardon said that Bill Hohimer covered several of the Conservation projects done this year. In addition, SLA split the cost of 3 dry ponds on Elmer Hays' property on the northeast end of the lake. This project was in the best interest of Sunset Lake to help prevent silt from coming back into the lake. At #166,166A, the dry pond failed, and was repaired, again to prevent silt from reaching the lake. On water quality, Ray thanked the volunteers who take the samples; Paul & Shirley Erley #89 and Pete McCoy #131. The free IEPA sampling test on the average clarity was 36", which ranked Sunset Lake at 84 out of 164 lakes that participate. On suspended solids, Sunset Lake was 5 milligrams per liter which is minimal, and volatile suspended solids or algae was 2 milligrams which is less than half or very low. We also tested for two types of nitrogen, nitrate was at .07 and ammonia was .27 which is very good. We have to watch nitrogen and phosphorous very closely because of detergents and fertilizers that run into the lake. The phosphorous level was at .106 per liter, which is a little higher than last year, so Ray encouraged members to use only low phosphate detergents and fertilizers. There were no reports of blue-green algae from anyone on the lake. The three chlorophyll levels and the eutrophic (ability to support plant growth) levels were just over the "slight" category, which is good. Concerning the leptosclorosis problem in Springfield, the testing is expensive and inexact, and he was told to only test if it is found. On atrazine, he was informed that the levels would have to be very high to affect the recreational uses of the lake. He contacted the Seba Gigi Lab and they will do 2 tests for us for free; one in the fall and one in the spring. Normally they will only do tests for lakes that are used for drinking water like Otter Lake. Ray reported that there is no sign of zebra mussels in the lake. Jim Rice #219 asked about the mussel die off this past summer. Ray answered that it was a normal lake cycle and is not unusual.

**Finance.** Chairman Bob Hanauer reported that we have 2 loans. The Silt Loan which will be paid off in the spring of the year 2000, which 101 members are still paying on annually. The second loan is on the new Community Center building for \$38,000 at 8% for 15 years with a 5-year balloon. Bob said he hoped it would be paid off in 8 years, instead of 15. We have \$11,000 in Equipment Reserve for a new truck or

other equipment. This year it was moved into CD's at 6% instead 2%. We have enough reserve to get us through January 1999 with \$4000 left over. Ron Bormida #85, asked why we didn't buy a backhoe attachment for ditches, culverts, etc., instead of paying someone else? Bob Hanauer answered that Miller and Clark do real good work very fast because they use the equipment all the time. Bill Hohimer said that there are only 4 culverts left that haven't been replaced and at \$40-50 per hour, we can't afford to have a backhoe just sitting and doing nothing. Bob Hanauer said that the truck needs to be replaced in a couple of years and that is really what we are saving for, without raising assessments.

**1999 Budget** - Bob Hanauer reported that this is the second year assessments have not been raised, and unless there is an unforeseen emergency, such as a lawsuit or repair to the dam, the assessments won't be raised in the future. Fred Gates #159, asked how we can get \$8700 from the farm and spend \$5600? Bob answered that the Board decided to Cash Rent the farm to one of three farmers, which they will vote on in the Executive session. John Earley said either way, it comes out to be around \$3200 income from the farm. Ron Rice #237,237A, asked how the Board came up with the salaries for the two most important people on the lake; the employees? Bob answered that the Board gave them a 4% raise. Ron Rice said that they deserve a bigger raise. Lou Long said that we can't raise the assessments to pay them more, but he agreed that they are underpaid. Ron Rice said if we can afford a new building, then the Board can surely come up with more money for the employees. Ron Rice made the motion to raise Bill Hohimer's salary to \$24,000 and Peggy Volz' salary to \$11,000. Bob Hanauer said he agreed that the employees are underpaid, but each Committee Chairperson decides how much they think they will need. John Earley said the members have the right to raise the salaries. Bob Slagle, #55,57, asked how much of a percentage raise does that come to? Lou Long answered that it is an extra \$800 for Bill and \$200 for Peggy. Ron Weller seconded the motion to raise salaries. There was a hand vote, with the majority voting yes and 4 voting no. The motion passed. Jim Perry, #26, asked if there wasn't a special assessment since 1996 for the roads? Lou Long answered that Fred Gates made a motion to raise assessments to \$250 so that 1/3 of the roads could be done for three consecutive years. Bob Hanauer said it was not a special assessment, and that 3 years ago, we were almost broke, so we needed the extra funds to get all the roads done. Ken Lazzaro, #12, asked where the extra money would come from for salary increases? Bob Hanauer answered that the Budget will be adjusted \$200 here and there. Jodie Seman, #16, said she wasn't against the raises, but the average American only gets a 3% raise, and half the membership isn't here to vote. Lou Long answered that our employees don't get any retirement or medical benefits, so they have to set up their own retirement and pay their own medical. Ken Lazzaro, #12, said they can go get jobs somewhere else. Bob Hanauer asked him if he would like Bill Hohimer's job? Bob Hanauer said the membership has no idea how much money Bill and Peggy have saved us over the years in expenses. Ron Bormida #85, suggested paying Bill the original salary in the Budget, then pay him hourly for snow removal. Bob Hanauer said it has already been passed by the membership. Bob Slagle, #55,57, made the motion to approve the 1999 Budget, MariAnn McAnarney seconded it. It passed overwhelmingly.

**Approval of Updated Bylaws** - Lou Long explained that the Board cannot change any of the Bylaws without membership approval. Ron Bormida, #85, asked about Article IV, Section 2 which gives the Board the right to establish rules. Bob Hanauer said to read Art. VII in the old Bylaws, Rule Promulgation, where it says the same thing. He continued that these are the Bylaws, not the Rules and Regulations, and the Board has had this power since 1964 or earlier. He explained that the Bylaws were re-worded or updated to get rid of outdated language. Lou Long said the Board must have the right to make day-to-day changes in the rules. John Luparell, #166A, asked what the difference is between bylaws and rules. Bob Hanauer explained that the Bylaws are like the Constitution, and the Rules and Regulations are like laws. Lou Long added that the Board is like a City Counsel, which has the right and responsibility to pass laws. Bob Hanauer added that the Board must notify the membership before a rule-change is enforced. Ron Bormida said that this is too much power to give to the Board. Bob Hanauer added that it has always been like that, and the Board is not asking for any new authority. Jim Power, #256, asked why the Board has the power to make or change rules. Ken Lazzaro, #12, made the motion to accept the revised Bylaws. Jodie Seman, #16, seconded the motion. Fred Gates, #159, said he has lived here since 1970, the Board has changed a lot of rules and no one ever said that it was wrong. Jim Power said that the membership should decide on rule changes, like the ski hours. Fred Gates said that you can't run the day-to-day business if you have to get a vote from the entire membership, that this should be left to the Board or there would be chaos. He added that you either trust the Board or not. Ingrid Hansen, #29, said that in the City of Springfield there are public hearings before rules are changed. Fred Gates said the members are welcome to come to any regular meeting. Ray Reardon, #256A,257, said the Board has the duty and the power to change rules, but if it is controversial then it should be brought up at the Annual meeting or at the regular meetings. John Earley, #8, said that the Board has mostly deleted archaic language in the Bylaws, and this does not pertain to the Rules and Regulations. He went on to say that some members seem to be uneasy about changes, and as a Board, we need to be careful before changing rules. Lou Long stated that the Rules and Regulations are going through the same process of cleaning out archaic language, or rules that are not pertinent anymore. The President called for a vote, which was overwhelmingly approved with none opposed.

**The Election of Three Directors of the Board for 3 year terms & 1 Director for a 1 year term.** Pres. Lou Long said that Ray Reardon, Bob Hanauer and Pete McCoy (not running for re-election) are up for election to 3-year terms and Ken Volz is up for election to fill a 1 year term. Bob Slagle, #55,57, nominated Bob Hanauer, #50, and Marvin Wingo, #51, seconded. Ed Burg, #101,101A, nominated John Schwandner and Bob Hanauer seconded. Earl Haynes, #28, nominated Ron Bormida, #85, and Laverne Harvey seconded. Bob Sons, #277, nominated Ray Reardon, and Ed Snell, #286, seconded. Lou Long asked for nominations for the unexpired one-year term of Dave Beck filled by Ken Volz. AnnaMae Hanauer, #50, nominated Ken Volz and Ben Chase, #9A, seconded. Bob Slagle, #55,57 made the motion to close the nominations, and John Luparell, #166A, seconded. The motion carried. Lou Long asked those nominated to stand and he introduced them. Lou Long added that the newest Board member will be the Lake Patrolman, and Ken Volz is elected for the one year term since he was the only nomination. Ken Lazzaro, #12, objected and wanted to make another nomination, but Lou Long said that the nominations had been closed and seconded. Lou Long read Article IV, Sec. 6 on Vacancies. Jim Rice, #219, made the motion to close nominations for the one-year term again, and Mariann McAnarney, #52,52A, seconded again. Lou Long stated that Ken Volz, #9B had been elected. The vote for three 3-year terms are as follows: Bob Hanauer- 75 votes, Ray Reardon- 79 votes, John Schwandner- 65 votes, and Ron Bormida- 29 votes. Bob Hanauer, Ray Reardon, and John Schwandner were elected.

Lou Long told the membership to contact the Secretary to sign up for the Am. Red Cross CPR class for \$39.50. The classes will be held on Tues. and Thur. nights. He also asked everyone who hasn't signed, if they would be interested in signing the Petition to move the Polling place to the Community Center Hall, to please do so before leaving.

Fred Gates, #159, asked if a list could be printed with the new addresses on it? Lou asked the Secretary to report. Peggy said that she is waiting until all the address changes have been made due to errors, then she will call Miller Management for a new list. The one that Miller sent her did not list the addresses for those not living on the lake, other than as occupants with no lot number, so it is impossible to determine what those addresses are. She also told the members that the Post Master said to call Miller Mgmt. for a new map, since we can't fit 5 digits on most of the lots on our map, and Miller is supposed to have a satellite map with the new addresses on it. John Earley asked why we need to put the new numbers on our map, since they aren't in sequence, and that we will continue to use our numbering system. Lavern Harvey, #242, agreed that the new numbers made no sense.

Ron Rice, #237,237A, asked if the Hall is for rent to non-members? Lou Long said no, unless the membership changes it.

Earl Haynes, #28, made the motion to adjourn, and was seconded by Jim Perry, #26. The Annual meeting adjourned at 9:25PM.

# SUNSET LAKE ASSOCIATION

## ANNUAL MEETING

OCTOBER 15, 1998

The Annual Membership Meeting was held on Thursday, October 15, 1998 at the Sunset Lake Hall for the first year and started at 7:30 P.M. with all Board Directors present, except Pete McCoy.

President Lou Long stated that a quorum had been reached with 61 members present, plus 25 members represented by proxy, making a total of 86 Class "A" members eligible to vote.

**President's Remarks.** Pres. Lou Long thanked John Schwandner #22 and Bob Thompson #220, for being Volunteer Lake Patrolmen. He announced that Bill Hohimer has been in the employ of Sunset Lake for 10 years and thanked Bill for his dedicated service to the Association. The President also thanked those members who continually mow adjacent lots, so Bill doesn't have. He stated that tonight we need to approve the Budget, elect 3 Board members, plus 1 Board member to finish the one-year term vacated by Dave Beck, who was temporarily replaced by Ken Volz in May 1998.

Lou Long stated that there are several new members present since last Oct. and asked them to stand and identify themselves: #284 Jim & Margaret Dorr, #159 Ron & Penny Richison, #128 Charles C. & Dorothy Jones, #221 John & JoAnn Munchalfen, #287 Tom & Joyce Erickson.

**Approval of the Minutes of the 1997 Annual Meeting.** The motion to accept the Minutes was made by #219 Jim Rice, and seconded by #22 John Schwandner. The motion carried.

**Aquatic Control, Recreation & Water Safety Committee.** Chairperson Pete McCoy #131, was unable to attend, and Bob Hanauer, #50, read Pete's report for him. "The USDA came out 3 times and dipped and/or took 200 goose eggs. Continuing this process should get the goose population under control. The beaver problem, for the present, seems to be solved but the muskrats are still a big problem. Over 100 muskrats were trapped this year. Bill Hohimer made new buoys this year out of PVC pipes which worked very well and all marker buoys will be made of this type in the future. At the end of this month 755 8" Walleyes and 755 8"-12" Channel Catfish will be added to the lake. The stocking of these fish should be continued in the future. For those who aren't aware Yellow Bass or Stripers and Green Sunfish eat the same food as Bluegill and Red Ears, so please don't throw them back into the lake. I would like to thank the membership for electing me (Pete McCoy) to the Board of Directors, and I hope I have contributed to the administration of the Association, but due to health reasons, I am unable to run again for the Board." Bob Hanauer added that Pete and Paula are both good friends and are both very ill, so he asked the members to say a prayer for them.

**Building & Construction Committee.** Chairman Ed Smith reported that since Oct. 16, 1997, 1 cabin and 1 of the oldest houses on the lake were torn down. There have been 4 permits to build new homes: #112 Larry & Janet Duke, #49C Greg & Linda Carpenter, #249 Larry & Carla Royer, and #253 Vince & Nell Zerante. There have also been permits issued for 2 covered boat docks, 11 boat docks were built or repaired, 1 boat house, 3 garages, 5 additions to homes, 1 gazebo, 7 sheds and 4 decks, 1 deck addition, and 1 screened-in patio. This all makes more permanent homes on the lake.

**Farm Management.** Chairperson John Earley brought visual aids to illustrate the conditions of the soil on the farm. He explained that we had the first crop planted since 1994, after the burm was taken down. A wheat crop was planted for excellent winter cover to prevent erosion into the lake. He said conservation tillage is the goal. We got 39 bushels per acre which is a little low due to the condition of the soil and compaction. He showed the KSI Lab Reports taken from an ATV with an on-board global positioning computer which locks into a satellite showing the 29.7 acre farm ground conditions. A grid map was set up for soil sampling in 23 locations to determine the condition of the soil, which shows high variability. He showed the PH map which illustrates where lime is needed, the Phosphorous map showed deficiencies in the southern and central part of the farm, and the Potassium was low over all. He showed the Soil Test Results chart. All this information allows the ground to be treated with whatever is deficient where it is exactly needed. This will allow us to manage the ground most efficiently.

For Budgeting reasons, John continued, the farm will be cash rented this coming year. Since we don't own farm equipment, profitability is low. The contracts will be sent out soon. Bob Slagle #55,57 asked who pays for the fertilizer? John answered that SLA will have to pay for the lime and some land leveling, but everything else is paid by the tenant. John Luparell #166A asked why the farmer couldn't do the land leveling? John Earley answered that they do not have the proper equipment.

**Legal & Insurance.** Chairman Al Tretter reported that there were no legal expenses in the past year, and nothing is coming up in the foreseeable future. On Insurance, we had Builder's Risk on the Community Center, which rolled over to our regular coverage when the building was completed. We have Commercial Inland Marine, Auto, Property & Liability, the Umbrella and Workers Compensation through American States. Safeco bought American States for \$2.8 billion. We don't see any unusual changes in the future. Our Bond is with Western Surety. We are paying less now than in the past, so the Budget was reduced this year from \$11,000

other equipment. This year it was moved into CD's at 6% instead 2%. We have enough reserve to get us through January 1999 with \$4000 left over. Ron Bormida #85, asked why we didn't buy a backhoe attachment for ditches, culverts, etc., instead of paying someone else? Bob Hanauer answered that Miller and Clark do real good work very fast because they use the equipment all the time. Bill Hohimer said that there are only 4 culverts left that haven't been replaced and at \$40-50 per hour, we can't afford to have a backhoe just sitting and doing nothing. Bob Hanauer said that the truck needs to be replaced in a couple of years and that is really what we are saving for, without raising assessments.

**1999 Budget** - Bob Hanauer reported that this is the second year assessments have not been raised, and unless there is an unforeseen emergency, such as a lawsuit or repair to the dam, the assessments won't be raised in the future. Fred Gates #159, asked how we can get \$8700 from the farm and spend \$5600? Bob answered that the Board decided to Cash Rent the farm to one of three farmers, which they will vote on in the Executive session. John Earley said either way, it comes out to be around \$3200 income from the farm. Ron Rice #237,237A, asked how the Board came up with the salaries for the two most important people on the lake; the employees? Bob answered that the Board gave them a 4% raise. Ron Rice said that they deserve a bigger raise. Lou Long said that we can't raise the assessments to pay them more, but he agreed that they are underpaid. Ron Rice said if we can afford a new building, then the Board can surely come up with more money for the employees. Ron Rice made the motion to raise Bill Hohimer's salary to \$24,000 and Peggy Volz' salary to \$11,000. Bob Hanauer said he agreed that the employees are underpaid, but each Committee Chairperson decides how much they think they will need. John Earley said the members have the right to raise the salaries. Bob Slagle, #55,57, asked how much of a percentage raise does that come to? Lou Long answered that it is an extra \$800 for Bill and \$200 for Peggy. Ron Weller seconded the motion to raise salaries. There was a hand vote, with the majority voting yes and 4 voting no. The motion passed. Jim Perry, #26, asked if there wasn't a special assessment since 1996 for the roads? Lou Long answered that Fred Gates made a motion to raise assessments to \$250 so that 1/3 of the roads could be done for three consecutive years.
