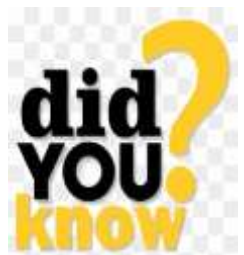

President's Report

We continue to seek those who would like to participate in this worthwhile and rewarding experience of helping those with dyslexia. In particular it would be helpful if we could attract a Psychologist to provide us with insight into the world of dyslexia from his/her perspective.

The Board is now structured along a more operational basis than it was during the period of formation of the Learning Centre which will allow it to become more involved in the setting of policy and less in the actual running of the Centre which falls under the control of the Centre Director who reports to the Board through the Chair of the Staffing Committee.

We have now completed our first full year of active operations and the Centre has experienced a satisfying period of growth. There are seven children actively being tutored by four Tutor Trainees with another three applicants to be trained this winter. Once these people have had their first set of instruction by our Tutor Trainer they will be assigned a child to commence tutoring which will probably be in March or April.

The Hamilton Wentworth District Board of Education approached us in November to see if there was some way they could cooperate with us and we are hopeful that this will bring additional teachers to us for training in the Orton-Gillingham approach to tutoring. This would prove beneficial not only for our Centre but also for the H.W.D.S.B. in their efforts to teach dyslexic children in their care.
