

Impersonal opinion - The Spanish Subjunctive (b1/b2)

The subjunctive is also used after impersonal expressions followed by 'que'. Impersonal expressions that indicate doubt, uncertainty, disbelief, emotion, necessity, denial, etc, require the subjunctive in the dependent clause. They are called impersonal expressions because they do not have a specific subject and most of them are formed with the third-person singular of the verb 'ser' and an adjective that is always in the masculine form:

'Es bueno que hagas ejercicio todos días'

'Es necesario que salgamos pronto de casa hoy'

Note that sentences with impersonal expressions that indicate certainty require the indicative and not the subjunctive: *'Es cierto que volvemos hoy'*, *'Es seguro que lloverá mañana'*.
