Typhoid Mary (Feature): Based on the life of Mary Mallon: the first known healthy carrier of typhoid in the United States. Mary Mallon was an Irish immigrant and professional cook, who denied being a carrier, as she had never been sick with the disease. She was arrested, isolated and held on North Brother Island for the last 26 years of her life, while male healthy carriers were allowed their freedom.
