

I believe that Jesus has the final word and will heal me in this life or heal me by taking me home to the Father's house in heaven. I believe Jesus will have the final word and call me by name from my grave on the Last Day, giving me a new and glorified body that will never perish. I believe that Jesus will one day wipe every tear from my eyes and put an unending song of praise to God on my lips.

I may root for a favorite team in any sport. I may celebrate their winning or lament their losing, but my life will not be greatly changed either way. But as you and I gather to celebrate Jesus' victory on Easter Sunday, His victory makes all the difference for our lives, both here in time and hereafter in eternity.

#### Food Shelf Report

Such a blessing to be blessed! The needs of our neighbors were met through our food donations and monetary gifts. One hundred fifty (150) non perishable food items were donated and electric bill assistance was provided.

Love INC shared the success story of "Ms. N" who moved from homelessness to having a place of her own and Christ Lutheran was a part of that success story!

Some highly needed items follow. The full list of items and "level of need" can be found on the food shelf in the Narthex. **Food items needed:** bottled water, spaghetti noodles, pasta sauce, canned soup, spaghetti-o's; single-serve fruit cups and snacks (crackers, trail mix, chips); shelf-stable milk and shelf-stable microwave meals.

**Dignity items needed:** antibiotic cream, sunblock; travel size hand sanitizer, shampoo, conditioner, and body wash.

## National Grant MENTAL HEALTH TRAINING AND OUTREACH,

LCMS LIFE MINISTRY | \$96,500 Upheld by God's Hand — Mental Health Outreach

Care for mental illness was a concern prior to the pandemic, but now it has become critical. LCMS church workers have expressed concern about the rise of anxiety, depression, and other mental disorders. Our teachers, youth leaders, pastors, and other church workers are continually requesting resources and training to be equipped for outreach and Christian care. Millions of people in the United States and around the world are suffering with mental illnesses and disorders. There is a tremendous need and opportunity for Lutheran outreach to both the people struggling with mental issues and their family, so that they may receive the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Public health researchers have conducted studies that indicate people with mental illnesses or disorders are more likely to approach a pastor or professional church worker than a medical doctor or counselor.

The LCMS Task Force for Mental Illness, Health, and Wellness collaborating with expert LCMS contributors will develop the materials, resources, and training programs. LCMS Life Ministry will coordinate the production of materials and rollout of the training for church workers.

Just a few tips to listen for when you are talking to someone you are concerned about. **Tone:** Do they sound friendly, intense, worried, or sarcastic. **Pitch or Volume:** A monotone can be a sign of sadness or boredom. Speaking loudly might indicate anger. A soft voice may mean that they are feeling insecure or unsure. Deep Sighs may indicate they are feeling down.

**Crying:** Listen for sniffling or catches in breathing. A crack in their voice may also be a sign of crying.
