Pastor's Portion—An Easter Surprise

Life is full of "surprises." But not all of these unexpected events are good, such as a shocking turn for the worse as far as our health; a major car repair we had not budgeted for; or conflict with a family member or friend that had been simmering underneath the surface but suddenly erupts in the open. Where do we turn when developments like these overwhelm us? We turn to our faithful God and Father and to His Son Jesus, who will "never leave us or forsake us" (Heb. 13:5). Our Lord and Savior will surprise us with His help!

No one was more "down in the dumps" than the disciples, when they gathered behind closed and locked doors that first Sunday evening after Jesus' death. Though Jesus had told them at least three times that He must go to Jerusalem and there be betrayed into the hands of sinful men, be crucified, and rise again on the third day, they had forgotten both His warnings and His promises. They all forsook him and fled, when He, their Good Shepherd, was struck (cf. Matthew 26:31). They could not believe that this Good Shepherd, who was laying down His life for all the world's straying sheep, would take his life back up again in the resurrection (John 10:17-18).

Jesus surprised the disciples by coming right where they were gathered in that upper room. He would appear more than once to them, overcoming even the doubts of someone like Thomas. He would breathe on them His Holy Spirit, both to comfort them and to empower them for His service. He surprised them by loving them with an everlasting love.

May Jesus surprise you during this season of Lent, leading up to Easter. May He surprise you by reassuring you of His love and forgiveness. May He surprise you by causing all things, even the difficulties and setbacks of your life, to work together for your good and God's eternal glory (Rom. 8:28-30).

Please take note of all the special Lenten services remaining on Wednesdays at 12 and 7 p.m. We'll save a place for you on Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter as well!

MARCH FOOD SHELF MINISTRY REPORT

The floodgates have opened and God's blessings are overflowing!

Several opportunities to assist our neighbors with rent and electric bills were met in January/February. We were also able to provide Code Purple assistance for those experiencing homelessness during the winter months. Essential items such as several backpacks, thermal underwear, gloves, socks and boxes of hand and foot warmer packets were purchased and delivered. A monetary donation to support the overnight emergency shelters was given and a thank you note from Love, INC, Code Purple is posted on the bulletin board in the Narthex.

Two hundred sixty-five (265) non-perishable food items were donated in February and more than \$300 was raised by the LWML "Soup"er Bowl luncheon free-will donation. LWML increased this amount to \$500. Thanks to all for your generosity!

National Grant EXPANDING GOSPEL PROCLAMATION WORLDWIDE - CONCORDIA SEMINARY, ST. LOUIS, MISSOURI -\$100,000

Concordia Seminary is committed to furthering the Great Commission with its Graduate School's ongoing acceptance and preparation of highly qualified international students and addressing the significant shortage of well-formed pastors in most countries. Many of these students, after earning their advanced theological degrees, will become master's and doctorate level professors at their countries' seminaries. They will assume key roles in raising up the next generation of pastors to proclaim the Gospel among their people. They also will serve as leaders involved in further organizing and growing their church bodies, helping ensure that those living in every region of their nations will hear and learn of the wonderful message of salvation through Christ. This grant of \$100,000 will assist with the cost of education for these international students.
