The Town of MacGregor and Rural Municipality of North Norfolk is an aging community. The population need is growing for Handi Transit service. At this time, there are no available services to support an individual's transportation needs therefore, relying solely on the kindnesses of neighbours and family. It has become increasingly important for seniors and mobility challenged individuals to have access to community programs and ease of access to health care within and beyond the immediate area.

By supporting individuals within the community, the Normac Handi Transit Committee's goal is to overall increase the wellness and connectedness of the community as a whole.

The RM and Town were surveyed by the Normac Handi Transit Committee in November, 2011. The results indicated the majority of our community was in favour of this project to meet the transportation needs for the residents of the area. In addition, the residents of the MacGregor and District Health Centre (care home) would benefit by having local access to transportation to increase the amount of community inclusion opportunities.

Handi-transit services will allow individuals to maintain their dignity and to foster independence as they continue to age in place.

Support has been obtained through the provincial government's Mobility Disadvantaged Transit Program and the Small Community Transit Fund. The committee has received overwhelming local support and leadership from the North Norfolk—MacGregor Foundation Inc. and the MacGregor Health Foundation. The North Norfolk-MacGregor Foundation gifted its largest donation to date to this project. The NorMac Handi Transit Committee is extremely proud to be chosen as the recipient of this sizeable donation. The MacGregor Health Foundation gifted a multi-year generous donation to exhibit its

desire for the ongoing success of this project. The committee's gratitude knows no bounds to both of these organizations.

Also donations from the RM of North Norfolk, Town of MacGregor, MacGregor Lions, Austin and Area Lions, MacGregor and District Kinettes, Austin and Area Leisure Club, Sommerfeld Church, Thomas Sills Foundation, MacGregor Health Centre Auxiliary, Manitoba Community Service Council Inc. indicated the support and a strong desire for these services to be created. Individuals in the community are coming forward with personal donations which we are grateful.

It is through the leadership and the partnership of these organizations and individuals within the area that we have been able to finalize the purchase of the vehicle. The committee ordered the Ameritrans Handivan from our local dealership in mid-September with an expected arrival by end of 2012 which indicates that our service could be started by January, 2013.

Thank you for all your support and we will make this happen.

Retirements and New Beginnings

In October the board of The North Norfolk- MacGregor Foundation celebrated the retirement of two long time and very valued members.

Vivian McGregor and Danny Rintoul were founding members.

The Macgregor Foundation was established with the profits from the village of MacGregor's centennial celebrations (1981). It was not a formal foundation, and the money was left in trust with the village.

The broader North Norfolk- MacGregor Foundation was formed when the Thomas Sills Foundation required the MacGregor Foundation to be broader in scope. Vivian and Danny were on the board when the foundation was incorporated in 1996. For the last 17 years they have dedicated their time, talents and energy to the organization. They worked tirelessly to build and establish the Foundation. Their exemplary dedication and determination helped the Foundation grow from a humble \$16,000.00 to the \$1 million we are pres-

New Building for Sprucedale!

Clients, staff, board members, and the executive director of Sprucedale Industries at Austin are excited to announce that preliminary plans have been finalized and construction of the new Sprucedale work and learning centre will begin in the spring of 2013.

Before construction can start, two storage buildings must be moved to new locations on the yard. Cement pads on which to set the buildings will be poured in October 2012.

Plans began in 2009, when it was agreed that a new modern facility was needed to provide a safer, more comfortable environment for the Sprucedale clients and staff.

A fundraising committee was formed, consisting of members of the board of directors, the office manager, and the executive director. The committee meets monthly to discuss ideas and plan upcoming projects. The past three years have been extremely busy, with an average of ten fundraising events per year. MacGregor Ski Room


Have you ever wanted to try cross-country skiing but haven't had the chance? Now you can due to the support of the North-Norfolk Foundation and Manitoba in Motion.



A ustin Elementary School is pleased to announce the opening of their new multi sensory environment. The purpose of the multisensory room is to provide an environment of stimulating activities and experiences to increase awareness and positive behaviors.

The room has a timeless quality, totally removing one from the outside world and generating an atmosphere of peace and calmness. It aims to provide a "failure-free" experience, allowing pleasurable stimulation without the need for verbal abilities or requiring specific outcomes. The room includes lighting effects, sensory activities, tactile experiences and cause and effect items. Students who have difficulty responding to environmental stimuli benefit from spending time in our sensory room.

By learning how to appropriately respond to stimuli and keep their emotions in check, students can improve their social skills while strengthening their ability to focus on academic learning opportunities.





- a timeline for the program or project
- your charity number, if applicable
- a contact person

Grant applications are taken at any time of the year for a program or project in the catchment area of North Norfolk and MacGregor or that would benefit residents of the same area.

Generally grants are not awarded to operational costs or ongoing expenses. A possible exception would be a sudden loss of a secured form of funding.

Community Foundation: Q and A

ommunity foundations provide financial support to charitable causes and organizations within a geographic region. Thanks to donors from all walks of life, these foundations improve lives, strengthen families and build stronger communities - today, tomorrow and forever.

How does a community foundation work?

A community foundation is a colection of monetary gifts, conributed over time by donors from all walks of life, that benefits the entire community forever. These gifts are permanently invested and the annual interest is used to support local charitable projects.

What's an endowment fund?

An endowment fund may be made up of one or many monetary gifts from a single donor or group of donors. It may bear the name of the person or people who establish it, or the organization or cause it supports. The money in each endowment fund is prudently invested by the community foundation and the amount generated annually for distribution is allocated according to the donors wishes. For example, one fund might support a local church, another might benefit youth recreation programs, and still another might be for a range of community projects at the discretion of the foundation's board of directors. Together, these endowment funds make up a community foundation.

Who gives to community foundations?

Individuals, families, businesses and groups of like-minded people make gifts to community foundations. Donors need not be wealthy to support their community through their local foundation; contributions come in all sizes and each one is valued.

Why give to a community foundation?

There are many reasons to give to your community foundation: to provide lasting support for the community in which you live or were born, to create a legacy for you and your family, and to have a wide range of giving options, to name just a few.

Is there a community foundation near me?

Most likely! Manitoba is home to 48 community foundations more than any other region of the country. Visit www.endowmanitoba.ca to find one near you!
