
WHAT ARE DRUGS?

Drugs are chemical substances that affect both your mind and your body. The prolonged use of drug may lead to **physical** and/or **psychological** dependence. An overdose of any drug may lead to **death**.



FFFFFFS ON FHF BRAIN

- The chemicals travel through bloodstream and attach to special places on brain's nerve cells (receptors)
- THC disrupts nerve cells in part of brain where memories are found, making it harder for user to recall recent events and hard to learn while high.






8 DRUGS THAT EXIST IN NATURE



Ори́м рорру (<u>HEROIN, MORPHINE, CODEINE</u>) Heroin is a super-strong, quickly absorbed form of morphine, and the most intense use of opium.



BLUE AGAVE (TEQUILA)

Tequila, named for the Mexican town where it originated, the sugar comes from the beautiful blue agave. After it's roasted and mashed, it provides the sugar that, once properly rotted, leaves behind alcohol.



COCA LEAVES (COCAINE)

Coca leaves, mostly grown in South America, have to go through some pretty ugly steps to become cocaine. Steps involving powdered cement, gasoline soaks, and battery acid baths are all needed to condense the naturally occurring leaves into an illegal narcotic.



EPHEDRA SINICA (SUDAFED, METH)

This scraggly little bush, also called ma huang, has been used in Chinese medicine for centuries. The alkaloids in the plant can be abused, most commonly in the form of weight-loss drugs and meth production.



PSILOCYBIN MUSHROOM (SHROOMS)

the naturally occurring compound that causes the euphoria and psychedelic trips associated with shrooms, can be found in over 200 species of mushrooms



WILLOW BARK (ASPIRIN)

Salicylic acid, found in willow bark, has cooled fevered brows across the world for millennia. Even Hippocrates, the father of medicine, used to recommend chewing the bark to reduce fevers and inflammation in his patients



SASSAFRAS ROOT (ECSTASY)

Root beer and sarsaparilla used to have actual sassafras oil in them for flavor. It is the treatments with formaldehyde, paint thinner, and drain cleaner that make sassafras oil such a delightful thing to put inside your body.



PENICILLIUM MOLD (PENICILLIN)

Penicillin: The mighty, moldy world changer. It was the first drug to effectively combat bacterial infections, leading to cures of an untold number of afflictions, from strep to syphilis







Like Alcohol and Depressants, Narcotics will slow you down. Take too many and they will slow you down permanently. Because of their strength narcotics will inflict heavy damage on your internal organs.


The withdrawal may not be quite as life threatening as a depressant withdrawal but with the extreme cramps, nausea etc. you may wish you would die.

Overdosing is a very real concern especially if you combine narcotics with other downers.





AMPHETAMINE

- Amphetamines are central nervous system (CNS) stimulants.
- They are used to treat ADHD and narcolepsy.
- Adverse effects include restlessness, acne, and blurred vision.
- Rarer side effects include seizures, heart problems, and psychosis.
- Amphetamines are used for recreational purposes. They are addictive.

THE EFFECTS OF LSD USUALLY BEGIN IN 30 – 45 MINUTES AND CAN LAST FOR 4 TO 12 HOURS

- Confusion and trouble concentrating

One of the greatest dangers of binge drinking is the fact that it is an acceptable behavior in many social circles, especially on college campuses. Despite this, binge drinking is very dangerous and could place a person closer to ADDICTION.

DRINKING TO COPE CAN CAUSE ALCOHOL ADDICTION

for approval

By using alcohol to overcome emotional distress and to produce a positive mood, a



person may be at risk for addiction. In certain cases these psychological traits or feelings may be symptoms of a more serious mental health problem. Some of the following mental illnesses have been linked to an increased risk for alcohol addiction:

Panic disorder










CRACK COCAINE

Other Names: Crack, rock, freebase What It Looks Like: White to tan pellets or crystalline rocks that look like soap How it's Administered: It's smoked.

EFFECTS ON USER

- ✓ Hallucinations, hyperexcitability, irritability
- ✓ Panic and psychosis
- ✓ Convulsions, seizures and sudden death from high doses

Is abused for its painkilling effects.

It is also known to bring on a SENSE OF RELAXATION.

People tend to consume more of the drug in an effort to intensify these pleasurable effects, which is often what leads to abuse.



OxyContin is commonly abused either orally or intravenously, crushed into a powder form and snorted through the nose.



WHAT IS FENTANYLP






A synthetic opiate analgesic

Similar to morphine but significantly more potent.

Typically prescribed to cancer patients and those suffering from chronic or breakthrough pain.







BRAND NAMES AND FORMS OF FENTANYL



<u>Sublimaze</u>


Generally administered in hospitals, sometimes alongside anesthetics, Sublimaze is the infectible form of fentanyl. It is used to manage pain before and after surgeries.



Lazanda

A fentanyl nasal spray administered in the same manner as a common nasal decongestant spray. It is predominantly used to treat pain in cancer patients.

BRAND NAMES AND FORMS OF FENTANYL



Duragesic/ Durogesic

The fentanyl patch was introduced in the 1990s. It is prescribed to treat moderate to severe pain and its effects can last for up to 3 days.





Also used for opioid-tolerant patients with breakthrough cancer pain, Abstral is the quick-dissolve tablet version of fentanyl and is placed under the tongue for immediate relief.

BRAND NAMES AND FORMS OF FENTANYL



<mark>Subsys</mark>

Is a sublingual spray administered under a patient's tongue to deliver immediate pain relief. Its purpose is to treat breakthrough cancer pain



Actiq

This form of fentanyl comes as a lozenge on a plastic stick administered under the tongue like a lollipop. It is used for patients already on pain-relieving medications and has some military applications.

CARFENTANIL ABUSE

DIFFERENCE BETWEEN FENTANYL AND CARFENTANIL

Their similar names often lead people to the conclusion that fentanyl and carfentanil are essentially the same. <u>THEY'RE NOT</u>.

<u>FENTANYL</u>

Fentanyl is considered safe and effective when used and monitored in a medical setting.

CARFENTANIL

Carfentanil is used by veterinary practices tranquilize large animals (such as elephants).

KILLER METH

Methamphetamire



- It is a powerful, highly addictive stimulant that affects the central nervous system.
- > A synthetic drug with more rapid and lasting effects than amphetamine.

Used illegally as a stimulant and as a prescription drug.

WHY DO PEOPLE USE CRYSTAL METHAMPHETAMINE?

Common reasons for using stimulant drugs such as ice include:

✓ To fit in/feel part of a social group.

- ✓ Out of curiosity or to experiment
- ✓ To escape from reality
- ✓ Out of boredom
- ✓ To manage mental health issues
- ✓ To forget or help cope with problems
- ✓ To enhance work performance

✓ To enhance sexual experiences and intimacy



What Are the Signs Someone Is Using Me<mark>th</mark>



- Doesn't care about personal appearance or grooming
- > Obsessively picking at hair or skin
- Loss of appetite and weight loss
- Dilated pupils and rapid eye movement
- Staying up for days or even weeks at a time
- Erratic movements; <u>twitching</u>; facial tics; exaggerated mannerisms; and constant talking
- Borrowing money often, selling possessions, or stealing
- Angry outbursts or mood swings
- > Psychotic behavior, such as paranoia and hallucinations.



Most commonly used as a "club drug," taken while partying in night clubs or at rave parties Meth burns up the body's resources, creating a devastating dependence that can only be relieved by taking more of the drug. A poison that first acts as a stimulant and begins to destroy the body.

It is associated with serious health conditions, including memory loss, aggression, psychotic behavior and potential heart and brain damage.


OO OFTEN MANY YOUTH FOLLOW WHAT THEIR PEERS ARE DOING
