...spell out the full name (Arlee Rehabilitation Center) the first time it's used in a document. After that, it can be abbreviated ARC.

Font Guidelines

Consistently using the same typefaces gives us a "look" that's the same for all of our documents.

Alegreya

Use lighter weights for body copy in printed documents, heavier weights for headlines online.

Alegreya is an elegant typeface designed for use in literature. It has a soft, classic look.

Alegreya Sans

Use thin or light weights for body copy online, and heavier weights for printed headlines.

The italics stand out more than most sans-serif fonts, making them great for emphasis.
