# September 2022

The event was marked with a festive cocktail reception during which all were able to mingle while enjoying passed hors d'oeuvres and enjoyable piano music followed by a sumptuous dinner buffet. The evening's agenda included the opening with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Past Commander Hank Warnke, singing of the National Anthem, and an opening prayer by the Chaplain and Past Commander, the Rev. Bill Schmidt, SMP. The remembrance of the Table for the Missing Soldier/Sailor was read by the Chaplain.

DeFranco.



The main event for the evening was the presentation of the RADM Samuel Eliot Morison Award for Naval Literature to its 2022 winner, Paul Stilwell. Stillwell served as the first-ever Editor-in-Chief of Naval History magazine in the 1970s and '80s. His new book, Battleship Commander: The Life of Vice Admiral Willis A. Lee Jr., is the first biography of Vice Admiral Willis A. Lee Jr., who served a key role during World War II in the Pacific.

Stillwell is an independent historian and retired naval officer. In addition to being *Naval History* magazine's inaugural editor, he worked as the U.S. Naval Institute's oral historian. He is the author or editor of a dozen books, including four on battleships, including *Battleship Arizona*, and an award-winning volume on the Navy's first African American officers, *The Golden Thirteen*.

The Award was presented by Morison Award Committee Co-Chairs Daniel Thys, MD, and Past Commander Bill Schmidt.

#### December 2022

He discussed the writing of his new book *From Across the Sea: North Americans in Nelson's Navy*. His presentation was well-received and was followed by many questions and an active discussion.

CAPT Rodgaard is the Past Commander of the National Capitol Commandery, covering Washington D.C. and Northern Virginia.


The commandery also held a remembrance for the 81st Anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor.



The February luncheon kicked off with the Pledge of Allegiance and Invocation, followed by a remembrance for the USS Maine, given by Commander-Elect John Cupschalk. Guest speaker John Glusman spoke about his book "CONDUCT UNDER FIRE - Four American Doctors and Their Fight for Life as Prisoners of the Japanese". The book recounted his father's experience as a U.S. Navy medical doctor who was captured in 1942 and held by the Japanese as a POW for 3 1/2 years. The presentation and slideshow were excellent triggering a lively question and answer period.

# **March 2023**

The New York Commandery's March luncheon was opened by Commander-Elect V. Cupschalk. CDR John F. Commander Hank Warnke led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance followed by the Invocation by past Commander and Chaplain, the Rev. Bill Schmidt, SMP. CDR Cupschalk then led a remembrance for the USS Houston with a moment of silence for the 700+ sailors who lost their lives at the Sunda Strait in 1942. Past Commander Don Schuld introduced New York Commandery Companion and Treasurer/Judge Advocate Richard P. Kaye, Esq., who spoke about his scratch-built model large warship collection. He related that his father, a U.S.

officer, had received medical Army treatment by Navy Corpsmen aboard a destroyer escort during the Korean War, and afterwards built a small wooden model of that DE. That led to Richard's lifelong interest in naval history, including building Navy wooden warship models from scratch. Over the years he has built a wellbalanced fleet of hundreds of ships from aircraft carriers to a wide range of surface combatants and auxiliaries of all types and entertaining Power Point presentation catalogued the "Fleet" how the models were built, and was followed by an entertaining discussion for this well attended event. A representative group of models from the collection was also on display.






### **OUR COMPANIONS OUTSIDE THE COMANDERY**


