- 1. Please note the credit schedule above is only for those seeking a HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA from Angeles Workshop School. If you have a different school/career path, you can still be part of the school and participate. What you would instead get at the end of your tenure with us is a CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION.
- 2. There is a lot of flexibility in grade 11 &12 as most credits should have been completed by then. Our hope is that you will take the opportunity to earn college credit through community college, find an internship or job during the hours you are not in school.
- 3. Just because you have enough credits in any area does not mean that you will get kicked out of the class. For instance, if you love science and already have 3 credits you can still be in science class in 12th grade. We would make sure your transcript reflects that you did more than was required.

OTHER WAYS TO EARN CREDIT IN ANY AREA OF YOUR CHOICE:

- 1. Take a community college course. These are free for High School students (7-8th graders can apply too as long as they are 13 or older).
- 2. Is there an exciting topic we are not currently doing at school? Try an online learning program.

Suggestions:

- a. Oxford Open university- They have awesome classes!!!! Some are free. Example of a free one I just went through: From Poverty to Prosperity-Understanding Economic Development
- b. Coursera-Some courses are free. You have over 2000 courses to choose from taught by college professors. The options coursera offers is amazing- anything from astrobiology to the science of meat to the psychology of thrill seekers!
- c. Khan Academy- FREE: Math, Art, humanities, Science, Economics, Computing
- d. ALEKS (Math or English)- Not Free but I have a subscription. This is a platform for good old-fashioned drill-and-kill. If you are working on the SATs or any other standardized test, this is a good way to go.
