1 Peter 1:1 Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, to the strangers scattered throughout Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia, **2** Elect according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, through sanctification of the Spirit, unto obedience and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ: Grace unto you, and peace, be multiplied. NT:38 hagiosmos (hag-ee-as-mos'); from **NT:37**; properly, purification, i.e. (the state) purity; concretely (by Hebraism) a purifier: KJV - holiness, sanctification.

THAYER'S

NT:38 hagiosmos--1) consecration, purification 2) the effect of consecration: sanctification of heart and life **NT:37 hagio**zo (hag-ee-ad'-zo); from **NT:40**; to make holy, i.e. (ceremonially) purify or consecrate; (mentally) to venerate:- hallow, be holy, sanctify.

NT:39 hagion (hag'-ee-on); neuter of **NT:40**; a sacred thing (i.e. spot):KJV - holiest (of all), holy place, sanctuary.

NT:40 hagios (hag'-ee-os); from hagos (an awful thing) [compare **NT:53**, **NT:2282**]; sacred (physically, pure, morally blameless or religious, ceremonially, consecrated) (most) holy (one, thing), saint.

WEBSTER'S 1828

Holy: Properly, whole, entire or perfect, in a moral sense, hence, pure in heart, temper of dispositions; free from sin and sinful affections. Applied to the Supreme Being, holy signifies perfectly pure, immaculate and complete in moral character; and man is more or less holy, as his heart is more or less sanctified, or purified from evil dispositions. Holy is used as nearly synonymous with good, pious, godly, be ye holy; for I am holy. **Hallowed, consecrated or set apart to a sacred use, or to the service or worship of God**

Consecrate: To make or declare to be sacred, dedicate, or devote, to the service and worship of God.

Consecrated: Separated from a common to a sacred use; devoted or dedicated to the service and worship of God; made venerable

Purify: To make pure or clear, to free from pollution ceremonially; to remove whatever renders unclean and unfit for sacred services. To grow or to become pure or clear. Liquors will gradually

Sanctification: The act of making holy. In an evangelical sense, the act of God's grace by which the affections of men are purified or alienated from sin and the world, and exalted to a supreme love to God.

John 17:17 Sanctify them through thy truth: thy word is truth. **18** As thou hast sent me into the world, even so have I also sent them into the world. **19** And for their sakes I sanctify myself, that they also might be sanctified through the truth. KJV

John 10:34 Jesus answered them, Is it not written in your law, I said, Ye are gods? **35** If he called them gods, unto whom the word of God came, and the scripture cannot be broken; **36** Say ye of him, whom the Father hath sanctified, and sent into the world, Thou blasphemest; because I said, I am the Son of God? KJV

Hebrews 2:10 For it became him, for whom are all things, and by whom are all things, in bringing many sons unto glory, to make the captain of their salvation perfect through sufferings. **11** For both he that sanctifieth and they who are sanctified are all of one: for which cause he is not ashamed to call them brethren, KJV **Hebrews 10:9** Then said he, Lo, I come to do thy will, O God. He taketh away the first, that he may establish the second. **10** By the which will we are sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all. KJV
