
ANNUAL MEETING 2021

And on camera, John-Luke Eyestone is quickly learning the art of how to present a visual representation to those who cannot attend. Without these people, our online presence would be impossible. We are indebted to each and every one of you for all that you have done during our COVID-19 period.

And we are committing to get better at our online presentation. But, as thankful as I am that we have been able to put our services online and will continue to try to improve the product, this isn't church. Church is not about some music and a sermon. It is about the interconnection of people, something that we haven't been able to have over the past year. Church is about discussing life, not just the Bible, over a coffee. Church is sitting with other people in the family room and sharing what is important. Church is all about the hugs and the community that we share together. And I will be looking to you and us, as we gather before the Throne of God in our prayers, to figure out what it is that God has for our next chapter together.

I am excited by what is ahead, but I don't think it will be easy. But to be a real church, we need each other. So, as the COVID-19 pandemic draws to a close and we prepare for what comes next, let me quote from a modern-day prophet named David Letterman. Letterman, on his first show after the events of September 11, 2001, said this:

And it's very simple, there is only one requirement for any of us, and that is to be courageous. Because courage, as you might know, defines all other human behavior. And I believe, because I have done a little of this myself, pretending to be courageous is just as good as the real thing (David Letterman).

2021 Annual Report

As the Community Connections Committee, our mission is to take the Church's mission and put it into action. We are here to spread God's Love and His hope to others. This mission starts with our community right here in Edmonton. As a committee, we are community outreach focused. We believe that our ministry goes far beyond the walls of our church building and that our congregation is much bigger than those who occupy the seats on a Sunday Morning. This past year has looked different, as I am sure it has for everyone else. Typically, we have community events going on almost monthly, but we have had to cancel a lot of events because of the pandemic. We are excited for the day we can return to our monthly events and celebrations. I did just want to take a moment to highlight two events.

1) Party at the Point 2019

Party at the Point is our largest community event, and in 2019 we had an event that broke all records. And in 2019, it was also a celebration for our 10th anniversary as a church family. It was a fantastic event that saw an increase in attendance, from usually an average of 300 ppl to an estimated 400-450 ppl in attendance throughout the day. As in past years, we handed out school supply packages to all the kids from Kindergarten to Grade 12 that were in attendance. We had made 135 bags, and we ran out. This is an amazing problem to have and something that we will be looking to increase in future events.





It broke our hearts to have to cancel in 2020. Still, we look forward to continuing this event in the future and continuing to bring a wonderful, wholesome, free event for the whole family to this community and surrounding areas.

2) Trunk and Treat 2020

In 2020, we were able to continue our annual Trunk and Treat event. While it did look a bit different, we were blessed to serve this community. In past years, aside from handing out candy, we would be handing out hotdogs/hot chocolate and have a couple fire pits going for people to warm up around. With the restrictions we opted to not include these extra elements, but we did enjoy dressing up, and handing out candy. We continue to see this event rise in numbers and many people commented on how thankful they were that we were there, putting on this event, despite all that was going on. We even saw some people pull up beside us and be apart of what we were doing.

Trunk and Treat is a pure fun event where our goal is to just be a presence, to build relationships and to say we love you and this community. We will continue to put on this event, and we pray that God will use this event for His glory.





As a committee, this past year has looked different, and we are itching to get back to our events and reaching out to our community. It has been my honor to serve as acting director of this committee for the past two years, and I can not wait to see what God has in store for the years to come.
