#### **Black History Month**

In recognition of Black History Month, each week we highlight and honor a Black person who has made significant contributions to our country and its people. We learn to understand and empathize with others by first learning who they are.

#### **Fredrick Douglass**

Douglass (1817 or 18 – Feb. 20, 1895) was an American social reformer, abolitionist, orator, writer, and statesman. He became the most important leader of the movement for African-American civil rights in the 19th century.

After escaping from slavery in Maryland, Douglass became a national leader of the abolitionist movement in Massachusetts and New York, gaining fame for his oratory and incisive antislavery writings. He was described by abolitionists in his time as a living counterexample to enslavers' arguments that enslaved people lacked the intellectual capacity to function as independent American citizens. Northerners found it hard to believe that such a great orator had once been enslaved, leading Douglass to write his first autobiography.

Douglass believed in dialogue and in making alliances across racial and ideological divides, and in an anti-slavery interpretation of the U.S. Constitution. When radical abolitionists criticized Douglass's willingness to engage in dialogue with slave owners, he replied: "I would unite with anybody to do right and with nobody to do wrong."

The U.S. military was finally desegregated entirely in 1948.

"Liberty is meaningless where the right to utter one's thoughts and opinions has ceased to exist.

That, of all rights, is the dread of tyrants. It is the right which they first of all strike down."
