

Coronavirus Updates

Ontario International Airport is actively monitoring information and developments regarding the coronavirus (COVID-19) and its impact on air travel. For the latest health-related information, we are looking to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (as well as our state and county public health officials) for guidance, and we encourage you to do the same. Up to date information is available at cdc.gov/COVID19. We regularly review our policies, procedures and practices in order to provide a first-rate, stress-free customer experience. Last year, we incorporated new passenger screening trays treated with powerful antimicrobial technology to inhibit the growth of bacteria on the surface of the bins used by travelers at TSA checkpoints in our terminals. Ontario was the first U.S. airport to receive the new trays from SecurityPoint Media in partnership with Microban International. More recently, we increased the frequency and intensity of efforts to disinfect washrooms and other public areas with cleaning agents intended to kill germs while also adding to the number of stations where passengers and employees can access free hand sanitizer.

Travel from Train to Plane

Travelers can take up to \$35 off Lyft rides between Ontario International Airport and Metrolink stations: Ontario-East, Montclair, Upland, and Rancho Cucamonga. Thanks to the San Bernardino County Transportation Authority (SBCTA), together with Metrolink, Omnitrans and Lyft, this program is available through November 2020. Redeeming your ride is easy:

- Download the Lyft app and create an account
- Log into the Lyft app upon arriving at any of the select stations
- Tap the menu on the top-left corner before requesting a ride
- Select 'Promos'
- Enter code: GOSBCTA
- Take your free ride!

If you require a wheelchair-accessible vehicle, call 866-946-4938 and request an on-demand ride.
