

From Fr. Mike's Desk

"He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area...[saying] stop, making my Father's house a marketplace."

Many times, when we listen to this reading, we think of the back of the Church and there are some Sundays when there is too much activity going on, and we would like to do the same. Believe me, I understand and there are times I would like to do just what Jesus did. We have taken steps to make sure this happens less and less, but there is more to this reading and more to Jesus' actions than just overturning tables. Our Lord was upset because they were concerned only with making a personal profit at the expense of the people of God, and they forgot what and whom the temple represented. They did not show the slightest interest in having a relationship with God or leading the people who were their customers to a closer relationship. This is where the first reading from the Book of Exodus, God giving Moses the Ten Commandments, connects to our Gospel reading. For the Commandments, tell us all about relationships.

If you will notice, the first commandments deal with our relationship with God. They teach us to remember the Sabbath, not to use God's name in vain, and most importantly not to put false gods before Him. As we continue with the Decalogue, we are told to honor our parents, not to kill, not to steal not to covet, etc. These are all commandments that tell us how God intends for us to live peacefully with each other. During the Season of Lent, we should take the time to look at how well we follow the Ten Commandments. God gave them to us through Moses so we could keep our relationships on the right track. When we fail, we create unhappiness for others and ourselves. The Commandments are more than a list of "Thou shall nots" they are part of God's great law of love.

Of course, the greatest manifestation of God's Love is Jesus and as we continue with today's Gospel, Jesus speaks about destroying the temple and in three days, He would raise it up. He was speaking not about the building, but the temple of His body. This refers to the love Jesus will show us through the Sacrifice on the Cross, and its fulfillment in the great triumph of the Resurrection. Through these acts, God has achieved for us eternal life, but we must not be like the moneychangers who were only concerned with themselves and an earthly

profit, which in the end got them nowhere. We are given this season of Lent, so we move away from similar actions in our own lives. In short, we should be turning over the tables in our own lives that make Our Father's house a marketplace not a place of prayer. The Father's house I am referring to is you, and all of us. For in Baptism, we become God's dwelling place! It could also be said; that we must destroy the temple within us **that is not** dedicated to God. Allow Jesus to destroy that temple within you so He can raise in you the Temple of His Living Body.

We close with the following prayer -

Pour your grace into our hearts, we pray, O Lord, that we may be constantly drawn away from unruly desires and obey by your gift the heavenly teaching you give us. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, forever and ever.

Amen.
