### From Fr. Mike's Desk

Today David asks Nathan whether he should build a temple for God. He was living in a nice house of cedar, while the Ark of the Covenant was kept inside a tent. Nathan, God's prophet, who spoke directly to the king, says that God will go along with his plan. He was God's anointed one and God had done wonderous deeds for David and Israel. Surprisingly, God told Nathan that David was not to be the one who would build a temple, but his son Solomon would, as we see in the Second Book of Samuel. While David is disappointed, God does give him some comfort, when He tells David his house will remain forever, and go beyond the state of Israel and beyond all who held Israel captive. The promise to David is fulfilled in the Birth of Jesus, and David's Kingdom is superseded by the Kingdom of God.

God has indeed surpassed David's hopes, desires, and plans, and even the Great Temple of Solomon. For the greater Temple and Ark of the Covenant, is spoken about in today's Gospel: Our Dear Blessed Mother. "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. Behold, you shall conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name Him Jesus. He will be great, and He will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give Him the throne of David his father, and He will rule over the house of Jacob forever and of His Kingdom there will be no end." As the Archangel tells her, she is the perfect dwelling place for the Most High. On the 4<sup>th¹</sup> Sunday of Advent, we are almost at the moment we have been waiting for (in fact today it begins at 4 PM). Humanity will be brought to a new level we never expected, and we will be made whole. For as God dwelled in a wonderful way in the womb of the Blessed Mother, we must keep in mind that He dwells forever in His new Temple the Church, and we are the Church!

Now as we come close to the end of this period of waiting, we must ask ourselves; are we providing the Holy Spirit a dwelling place in our Soul? Are we allowing the Spirit to be our Soul's constant guest or is He just someone you invite over for the holiday and then he must leave? Please allow the Spirit to work in your heart and Soul to make the new year a time of peace, love, and Christ.

Our Christmas Eve and Day Schedule go as follows: **Sunday, December 24**<sup>th</sup> **the Fourth Sunday of Advent** we will have our usual Saturday Night/Sunday Morning Masses. Namely Saturday at 5:00 PM, Sunday Morning at 7:30, 9:30, and 11:30. As we move into the day the Masses will be for

Christmas Eve and Day. Sunday, December 24<sup>th</sup> Christmas Eve.: 4 PM Mass with Children's Choir in the Church, likewise we will have 4 PM Mass in the Gym. 6 PM Mass, 8 PM Mass, and Midnight all in the Church. On Monday Christmas Day, our Mass Schedule will be 7:30 AM, 9:30 AM, 11:30 AM, and the final Mass being 1 PM all in the Church. There will be no Evening Mass on Christmas Day.

As you know, the Christmas Collection is one of the most important collections here in our beautiful parish. Through this collection and your extreme generosity, we can pay many of the bills that we incur during the year. In the past, you have been exceedingly kind to our dear parish, and I thank you from the bottom of my heart. This year we are especially in need, and we cannot keep ourselves going without your help. Thank you for your generous heart and helping us.

In Luke's Gospel we hear that Mary and Joseph bring the infant Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem to be presented and consecrated to the Lord. When, according to custom, they handed Jesus to Simeon, he immediately recognized that he was holding the salvation of the world and praised God.

Now that Christ has come into the world, do we recognize and accept Him as our Savior and our salvation?

To the People of God of the Diocese of Rockville Centre:

Merry Christmas to you and your families!

In recent years at Christmas, I have meditated on the relationship between the Nativity of the Prince of Peace and the Parable of the Good Samaritan.

I have been especially inspired by Pope Francis' analysis of the Parable of the Good Samaritan in the second chapter of his 2020 encyclical *Fratelli Tutti*. It is powerful and provocative, and I would recommend it for your mental prayer.

The short phrase in the Christmas Gospel narrative in the second chapter of the Gospel of Luke reads: "She wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn."

"No room for them in the inn." No Good Samaritan stepped up to help the Holy Family. They were ignored and treated perfunctorily and impatiently. Some passed them by. Some pretended not to notice their plight.

Remember too that in the Parable of the Good Samaritan an "inn" is also mentioned. Luke 10 reads: "But a Good Samaritan while traveling came near him, and when he saw him, he was moved with pity. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn and took care of him."

The inn that the Holy Family approaches on the way to Bethlehem is a sign of rejection and indifference.

The inn in the Parable of the Good Samaritan is a sign of the Good Samaritan's compassion and commitment to go the extra mile and to make sure that the wounded man is taken care of until he is completely healed.

Contemporary literary criticism might very well emphasize that the use of "inn" by the Gospel writer in both the Nativity in Luke 2 and the Parable of the Good Samaritan in Luke 10 is not by accident.

In a sense, the phrase "there was no room at the inn" in the Nativity foreshadows and connects with the phrase in the Parable of the Good Samaritan describing the callous indifference of both the priest and the Levite toward the wounded man on the side of the road: "[H]e passed by on the other side."

As Pope Francis says in Fratelli Tutti: "Each day we have to decide whether to be Good Samaritans or indifferent bystanders."

Our Lady, St. Joseph and the unborn Christ Child experienced the reality of people who decided to be indifferent bystanders.

The Christmas Gospel narrative from Luke 2 poses a question which is posed again later in the Parable of the Good Samaritan in Luke 10.

Will we be Good Samaritans?

Or will we be indifferent bystanders?

As the Holy Father reminds us, we make that choice every day.

May our prayer, silent contemplation and creative family catechesis of the Nativity scene help us to be instruments of a Nativity Mystery. May the Good Samaritan Gospel revolution of humility, charity, mercy, tenderness and peace unite us in solidarity with the sick, the poor and the suffering, especially in the Middle East, Ukraine and all war-ravaged areas of the world.

May our commitment to "holiness and mission" bless our contemplative Synodal listening and our Eucharistic Revival and Evangelization.

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year to you and your families!

May the Light and Love of the Christ Child animate and guide our global Catholic Missionary Spirit on this Christmas night and throughout the New Year.

#### Where there is kindness there is goodness; where there is goodness there is God.

The goodness of the parishioners of St. Edward Confessor Church and the Syosset community has changed the lives of so many here in Syosset and beyond. For many of our pantry families, the increasing cost of living has made their difficult life circumstances more of a burden. Between the financial hardship and ongoing health related issues, life leaves them feeling hopeless and abandoned by God. The volunteers in both the Parish Social Ministry and our St. Vincent DePaul Conference help the less fortunate to witness the goodness of God.

Goodness is needed in the today's world. The world is full of need and longing. A gentleman from the neighborhood called me asking for a coat after we already gave away all the coats. I remembered him from the time we were open during the pandemic. I told him I would get him a coat. Two weeks later, he came by to pick up the new coat and he said "I am going to cry. I was so surprised to get a phone call from you about the coat. At first I thought it was a prank call." I also gave him a warm hat and offered him some food. I told him if he needed any assistance to please come by, we are here for you.

Another neighbor in need is helping her mentally ill sister to keep food on the shelves and to keep her apartment. I had not seen her either since the pandemic. I welcomed her back. We talked a while about the challenges of caring for a sibling with a disability. She was grateful for the food and especially to have someone who would listen to her. The power of simple goodness is astonishing.

The kindness of the parishioners continues to change lives by comforting someone who is sick or grieving, with prayers and with handmade prayer shawls. We are so fortunate to have parishioners who continue to volunteer their time to bring Communion to the Sick in Syosset Hospital, the elderly living in the nearby nursing homes and the homebound. We visit Cold Spring Hills Nursing Home with a small group of dedicated volunteers. Residents warmly welcome us and greet us with joy to receive Jesus and hear the Word of God. In October, we brought back the Hot Lunch Program for the residents living in the TOB Housing in town. Volunteers cook and serve the hot lunch. Residents come to the community room to enjoy a delicious meal and fellowship. We have an amazing outreach ministry here at St. Edward Confessor Church; every volunteer works tirelessly to give of their time to help our neighbors in need.


Let's continue to allow God to fill us with His goodness so together we can go out and astonish the world with more kindness and compassion. Unleash your goodness!
