From Fr. Mike's Desk

How strong is your faith in God? Have you ever asked yourself that question or had someone ask you that question? You might have asked others this question, and how did they answer it, how would you answer it? This season of Lent gives us a perfect opportunity to contemplate this question, and now we are given a full forty days to produce an answer. Well, we have a lifetime to produce an answer, as some of us, if not most of us, will need that long. But Lent allows us the time to focus on these and other questions. Today the above questions are asked in our Old Testament and Gospel Readings.

The reading from Genesis tells of how God put Abraham to the test. God tells Abraham, "'Take your son Isaac, your only one, whom you love, and go up to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him up as a holocaust...'" Scripture Scholars and Tradition tell us that God asked Abraham to sacrifice his son to assess his true faith and his love of God. They believe God wanted to see if Abraham loved Him more than Isaac. This could be true, but remember God prohibited the Hebrews from offering human sacrifice, as the pagans who surrounded them conducted. So why does God ask such a thing? If it is to assess Abraham's faith and love, God does not need to see this, because He knows our hearts and thoughts better than we know them ourselves. So, God must want Abraham to see how much he loves God and how strong his faith truly is, so he can conduct all God has called him to accomplish. Abraham may have doubted his faith which explains why God decided to put him to the test at such an advanced age. This is sometimes why God puts us to the test, not to trap us, but to remind us how much we must grow in our relationship with Him. Thus, Abraham in this test sees the true strength of his faith and love of God and he acknowledges that whatever God asks of him will result in something good, even if we do not understand it now. Abraham's faithfulness becomes an example for all to follow so that he can rightly be called our Father in Faith.

Abraham's example can serve the Apostles in today's Gospel when they are tested. Peter, James, and John receive the great gift of joining Jesus in His personal prayer; they are given this invitation because of what happened six days earlier. Jesus asked the Apostles, who do people say that I am, and after they answered and He confirmed that he was the Messiah, He told them that he would go to Jerusalem, be betrayed, and would suffer and die on the Cross. Jesus also told them that three days later he would rise from the dead, but that part the Apostles did not seem to hear. At this point their faith in Jesus was tested, so to help them regain their faith, Jesus brought them up to the mountain to pray. While He was praying His appearance changed and he became as white as light. As Jesus continued in His prayer, Moses and Elijah appeared, one on His left and the other on His

right, and they were conversing with Jesus. Peter was so caught up in this wonderful event, that he wanted it to last forever, so his faith in Jesus was not as weak as he may have thought. And when it seemed that nothing more could happen on this day, the voice of God the Father tells them once again who Jesus is, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him!"

Abraham needed to see that his faith was greater than he realized, and the Apostles needed to see that they could indeed have true faith in Jesus, and they were given this glimpse of the Resurrection so that when the events of Holy Thursday and Good Friday occurred, they would believe on Easter Sunday when Mary Magdalene told them that she saw the risen Lord. They were given this boost of faith so that like Abraham they could be examples of faith and trust for all who follow including you and me.

These readings are presented to us today to help us when we lose faith, and they are present to encourage us on our Lenten Journey toward Easter. Let us use them well.





Pope at Angelus

On the first Sunday of Lent, Pope Francis took his cue from the Gospel of Mark that presents us with Jesus tempted in the desert (Mk 1:12-15). Speaking during the Angelus address, the Pope reflected on the symbolic significance of the wilderness, urging Christians to "enter the wilderness, that is, silence, the inner world, listening to the heart, in contact with the truth." In the desert, he continued, Christ "was with the wild beasts, and the angels ministered to Him. Wild beasts and angels were His company." But, in a symbolic sense, he explained, "they are our company too: indeed, when we enter the inner wildness, we can encounter wild beasts and angels there."

"In the spiritual life, we can think of them [wild beasts] as the disordered passions that divide our heart, trying to take possession of it." Warning that they "entice us; they seem seductive," the Pope said. "If we are not careful, we risk being torn apart by them." And giving a name to these "beasts" of the soul, he described them as "the lust for wealth, which imprisons us in connivance and dissatisfaction, the vanity of pleasure, which condemns us to restlessness and solitude, and the craving for fame, which gives rise to insecurity and a continuous need for confirmation and prominence." They are "wild" beasts, the Holy Father said, and as such, they must be tamed and fought; otherwise, they will devour our freedom. "We need to go into the wilderness to become aware of their presence and to face them," he stated.




