

From Fr. Mike's Desk

Today John tells us a narrative that does not appear in the three other Gospels. It starts with, "Some Greeks, who had come to worship at the Passover Feast came to Philip... and asked him, 'Sir, we would like to see Jesus.'" Now this was not surprising that people wanted to see Jesus, but what is surprising is they were not from Israel. We were told that they came to Jerusalem to worship at the Passover Feast, and it shows us that Jesus was known in many places in the Greco-Roman But none before ever approached the disciples asking to speak to Jesus. believed they went to Philip first because Philip is a Greek name and they thought he might be a Greek. Some believe that John relays the account because he wants the Church to see that Jesus' message is growing throughout the known world and has indeed touched the hearts of many, even when His people refused to know Him truly.

The request of the Greeks to see Jesus occurs after two major events, the Raising of Lazarus, and the Cleansing of the Temple. They were so moved by what Jesus said and did, that they had to know more. However, when Jesus agrees to see them, He offers a strange answer.

He tells them that now has come the time for His mission on Earth to end, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Amen, amen I say to you unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains a grain of wheat, but if it dies, it produces much fruit." "Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life." Jesus then adds that whoever serves Him must follow Him and He says, "The Father will honor whoever serves me."

What is Jesus telling us? First, that His mission is for the entire world, and second to complete His mission (so it will become ours) He must give up His life for the life of the entire world. Like a grain of wheat, He must die to this life to become something greater. Just like one grain of wheat which when planted in the soil dies to being a grain of wheat and rises to be a stalk of wheat with numerous grains. As we continue, John tells us that Jesus (like any of us) wishes He could avoid this fate and this hour. But Jesus turns to the Father to gain strength. So instead of asking to be

saved from the Cross, He asks God to glorify His name (the Father's name). We are then told that a voice from Heaven says, "I have glorified it and will glorify it again." The crowd gathered and heard the voice but did not know what to make of it.

God the Father told the Son, that He will glorify His name through the actions of the Son, and through our actions which we carry out in following the Son. By our desire to die, living only in this world and by living for the Kingdom that is to come. The very same Kingdom that Pilate asked Jesus about when he asked Him if He was a King! As we approach the last two weeks of Lent, let us focus on how we look at life and how we seek out Jesus. Let us be like the Greeks who sought out Jesus and look to learn all we can and share the Good News always.

Happy Fifth Sunday of Lent and Happy St. Patrick's Day!

Next Week's Gospel Question

Mark's Gospel will recount the final stages of Christ's passion culminating in His physical death and burial. Joseph of Arimathea petitioned Pilate for Jesus' body, took Him down from the cross, had His body wrapped in linen, and placed His body in a tomb. Lastly, "he rolled a stone against the entrance to the tomb."

As Joseph of Arimathea was a follower of Jesus, what do you think Joseph felt as he sealed the tomb?

The Ancient Christian Tradition of Tenebrae

"Watch and pray," Jesus tells his apostles in the garden of Gethsemane, "that you may not enter into temptation." He invites them to pray for courage and strength as they will be confronted with His betrayal, arrest, false condemnation, passion and crucifixion. We, who are baptized into Jesus' death and resurrection, also hear His call, especially in Holy Week, to watch and pray as we commemorate these most sacred and life-giving days in our own lives and in the history of the world.

The major liturgies of The Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, the Good Friday Service and the great Easter Vigil are our principal ways of prayerfully commemorating the events that won our salvation. But our Tradition also offers other ways to watch and pray during these holy days. The Liturgy of the Hours is prayed with great intensity and beauty during Holy Week. Many of you join the Office of Morning Prayer which our parish celebrates on Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday mornings.

As we did last year, we will again be praying an evening office in the ancient Christian tradition known as *Tenebrae*. The word is Latin for *darkness*. The office commemorates the growing darkness enveloping Jesus as he faces the betrayal and arrest that lead to his passion. As the psalms are prayed and the scriptures are read, the candles of the church are extinguished one by one until the church is left in darkness. A loud thunder sound is heard. One lit candle remains, hidden away, as a sign that the darkness cannot completely overcome the Light, that the Cross leads to Resurrection.

Tenebrae is one of the most moving services of Holy Week. It offers a wonderful opportunity to "watch and pray" as we enter into these sacred days. Join us on March 27th, the Wednesday night of Holy Week at 7:30 PM and enter into this great prayer experience.



Liturgical Minister Training-Spring 2024

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training in Spanish and English for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for all those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for all Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One must attend Part A training prior to Part B training. A Lector Workshop is available for both new and experienced lectors.



In the midst of our neighbors' chaos, let us work together to be the face of God to each other. Peace and God's blessings! We are grateful for your continued and generous support!


