	Review each of the five (5) questions: Is Your Answer Yes to Any of These Questions?
	Review verification of patient name and date of birth on vial(s) before each injection.
	Review use of oral antihistamine (Zyrtec, Allegra, Xyzal, Claritin or Clarinex) the evening before or
	morning of injection(s) as this will decrease the risk of a systemic reaction.
	Review that 30-minute wait period begins when injections are given.
	Review that it is patient's responsibility to set 30- minute timer on their cell phone.
	Review form on refrigerator with build-up schedule, supportive therapy for local reactions, and dose
	adjustment schedule for breaks in therapy for both build-up and maintenance schedules.
	Review form on refrigerator with signs and symptoms of anaphylaxis and our treatment protocol for a
	systemic:
	Bring patient back into an exam room.
	• Give a dose of epinephrine in the anterolateral thigh.
	• Observe patient for 60 min after epinephrine until all signs and symptoms have resolved.
	• Patient can come back as soon as two (2) days later.
	• Dose will be adjusted 10-fold (e.g. 0.3 mL 1:10 v/v yellow would be 0.3 mL 1:100 v/v blue at the
	next visit).
	Review that allergy shots are billed for payment every 2-3 months so there is NO need to pay at each
	allergy shot visit. We will send an account statement with any balances due and a payment portal link.
	Review that patient should use bathroom before they get their injections.
	Review annual red vial refills and need for 5 build-up visits after year 1 and cluster injections with the
	annual refills after 2 years at maintenance. Review 6 month expirations for green and blue vials.
	Review required follow-ups with Dr. Tankersley at 1 month after starting shots, 2 months after 1 st visit, 4
	months after 2 nd visit then every 6 months.
	Appointments for allergy shots are walk-in, an appointment is not required.
