YCRCC in Action

Most YCRCC members helped us get ready for our Lincoln Dinner. These efforts included selling tables, gathering many donations, putting together baskets, working the silent auction, bank, and check in

tables. Obtaining special commemorative glasses, tablecloths, nice eating plates and utensils, and table decorations. Selling swag, drink tickets, and special glasses. It also included coordinating with licensed gun dealers, the event center, security, bartenders, the caterer, video specialist, auctioneers, printers, VIP table waiters, and assigning YCRCC and other county Central Committee folks to work the many different jobs during the dinner. Starting with an empty building, it took 2 days to get it ready for the dinner. The setup included setting up tables and chairs for the displays, games, and guests, pressing the new tablecloths, and then decorating and setting 73 tables with 8-place settings per table. After the dinner, we had only a few hours to pack up and return the building to the same empty state as it was before.

Johanna Lassaga and Rebekah Carlson worked at the Yuba County Elections office for several weeks after the March 5 election to complete the counting of votes.

YCRCC is continuing to gather signatures for three initiatives to be placed on the November General Election Ballot. The three initiatives are:



- 3. Recall Gov. Gavin Newsom.
