Shasta County Recall

In the 2022 election, Kevin Crye, a true conservative, won the Shasta County District 1 Board-of-Supervisors position by only 60 votes. With only several months on the job, a recall effort has been launched to remove Kevin.

Shortly after taking office, the Board of Supervisors voted 3-2 to stop using Dominion voting machines and to go back to paper

ballots. Kevin was one of the three who voted to go back to paper ballots.

This goes against grain for



the Democrat controlled State Legislature that is pursuing mandating that all counties must use voting machines. This may be unconstitutional, as counties, not states, typically determine how votes are counted.

There are three reasons Kevin is being targeted.

First: Democrats are pushing for the elimination of paper ballots in favor of using voting machines. If Shasta County eliminates voting machines, it may serve as a precedent for other counties across the US to do the same.

Second: Of the three who voted to cease using

Dominion voting machines, Kevin is considered to be the most vulnerable because he won by a narrow margin.

Third: California Government Code Section 25060 directs: ***Whenever a vacancy occurs in a board of supervisors, the Governor shall fill the vacancy. The appointee shall hold office until the election and qualification of his or her successor.***

CA Code 25060 became law in 2021 as a result of the Recall Governor Newsom effort. If the recall is successful, Gavin Newsom will appoint someone to fill the vacancy. It is a certainty that his appointee will result in a 3-2 split that will vote to return to using voting machines. A Shasta County Recall Dinner will be held Thursday May 18.

The Search for Candidates

As an on-going effort, YCRCC is searching for candidates to run for a myriad of offices. We will have openings for the Wheatland City Council, Marysville City Council, and Yuba County Supervisor. We also have an opening on Yuba Community College Board. We also need parents to step up to run for their child's school board.

The filing dates for candidates are 11/3 to 12/8. Contact the County Clerk's office for more information regarding filing information.
