THE VILLAS AT FIVE PONDS BOARD would like to remind all Villas at Five Ponds residents who have registered their E- Mail address with Continental Management, to receive the community E-Blasts sometimes they wind up in your Junk or SPAM folders so you should be looking there often. (Note: If you need to register or make a change, there are blank registration slips on the front desk of the clubhouse with instructions where to send it to.)

The way to tell a genuine Villas at Five Ponds E-blast is in the subject line there will be 1 to 5 subjects separated by + signs. then a number, then the year.

EMERGENCIES

Why, if you have the unfortunate occasion and need to call 911 for an ambulance, despite our community's "complicated road and address system" they should be able to find your home quickly.

We have been told that each Central Bucks ambulance is equipped with a GPS (global positioning system) that is "tied to" the Bucks County 911 system. That should direct them to the end of your driveway where it connects to your street.

Almost a year ago Board members Larry Nodiff and Joel Mickelberg



gave the deputy chief of the Central Bucks Ambulance detailed maps of our community, one for our Phase 1 and one for our Phase 2. If you would like to see what those maps look like, go into the conference room in our clubhouse they are under the glass of the conference room table.

We have been told that those maps were loaded into the ambulance's on board computer. Thus once their GPS system gets them to end of the driveway an examination of the map on their computer shows them where a specific home/address is located up onto the driveway.

What are some things you can do to enhance that process?

- · Have some sort of light installed that shines onto the address of your home on the wall of the home at night.
- · Have some sort of solar light address sign in the mulch area near your
- · Have some sort of blinking light or lantern that can be put near a window that faces out onto your driveway.
- · Build some sort of emergency plan with your fellow close by neighbors so after you call 911, you can alert them so they could be out on the driveway to help direct the ambulance to you.

What are some of the uncontrollable things that can decreased response time?

- Problems with their 911/GPS system. Their system did have an issue not too long ago.
- How busy the Central Bucks ambulance system is, when your call comes in.
- · Have the specific people on board the ambulance been trained, to look for our maps in their on board computer when responding to a Villas at Five Ponds call? They should!



EXPECTATIONS FOR THE 2023-2024 PHILADELPHIA 76ERS

AS WE FLIP INTO MARCH, the focus begins on the NBA's stretch run. I'll fully admit, I have been a much more passive 76ers fan this year compared to years previously. Part of the reason have been

various life commitments (work/friends etc.) to where I am not dialed into every single game. The other reasoning has been the expectations I have had for this team from the jump, and they seem to be projecting as I anticipated.

As I wrote this article, the 76ers are currently in the 5th seed in the Eastern Conference at 33-23 with 26 games remaining in the NBA regular season. Joel Embiid was seemingly cruising to the 2nd consecutive MVP until a torn Meniscus in

his left knee derailed that campaign in late January. They expect Joel to return in late March-early April, but have been floating in

the water without him going 4-6 since he officially was ruled out on January 30th. They may be in 5th in the standings, but the Boston Celtics are 8 games ahead of everyone, with 2-8 very much in a tight pack.

Although there are things that are now different including a new coach, some better shooters and nobody completely sabotaging the team this year (James Harden, Ben Simmons etc.) the story seems to remain the same. When Joel Embiid is off the floor, the team can only survive for so long. Another story that has been a tale as old as time is the efficiency of the starting 5. The starting 5 had the best efficiency in entire league up until Joel went down.

Not to be the negative Nancy, but my expectations remain the same with this team. They are solid, but solid isn't going to win them a championship. I love Joel Embiid and Tyrese Maxey with all of my heart, but this team isn't good enough or deep enough

> to win in June. They still are on a good trajectory for the future, will have Joel Embiid locked up under contract for the next 2 seasons, and Maxey extended for 4 more years after this season wraps up. They'll have a ton of cap space and really have one last chance to get a star to complement Joel and Tyrese, and finally have a coach who can help them win the close games. However, I don't think all of the pieces will come together in this campaign. If they can get out of the 2nd round

(something that the 76ers have failed to do since 2001), that would be a huge win for this campaign.

MY NAME IS BARBRA BY BARBRA STREISAND

SHARYN POLSKY, BOOK REVIEWER


MY NAME IS BARBRA is a long awaited autobiography which chronicles the life of Barbra Streisand from her childhood in Brooklyn to her international acclaim as a singer, actor, director, producer, writer as well as being an activist and philanthropist. She tells the story of her life through anecdotes and recollections in a humorous and chatty style. She credits the people in the entertainment business who furthered her career and does not hold back from naming the people who were not supportive of her.

When she was in "Funny Girl" on Broadway her co-star Sidney Chaplin (son of Charlie Chaplin) wanted to have an affair with her. He gave her diamond and emerald earrings. When she did not return his affection, he would whisper negative epithets to distract her while she was saying her lines.

It takes 970 pages to tell her story because she includes reviews of her

performances as well as mentioning all of the people she dealt with in the entertainment business throughout her long career.

She never knew her father as he died when she was a toddler. Her mother never complimented on her talents because as she said she didn't want Barbra to get a "swelled head". She did not come to one of her concerts because she was "too nervous." Her mother



was envious of Barbra because her career as a singer never came to fruition.

Although she really wanted to be an actor, her early success came from singing. She started out in a small club in Greenwich Village and now has millions of fans.

Her first marriage to Elliot Gould only lasted eight years. They met when both of them were in the Broadway show "I Can Get It for You Wholesale." She never explains why the marriage failed.

She had long term relationships with Jon Peters, her former hairdresser, turned film producer and Richard Baskin, film composer and producer, but Jim Brolin is the love of her life. They have been married for 24 years.

When Barbra sets her mind to something she never waivers until her vision is fulfilled. She wanted to create the movie "Yentl." She persisted even though she was told it could not be a financial success. The film went on to win a Golden Globe for Best Motion Picture—Musical or Comedy. The film was chosen by *Time* magazine and the National Board of Review as one of the top 10 movies of 1983. Barbara was the cowriter, co-producer, and director of "Yentl."

She belongs to the elite group of entertainers (E.G.O.T.) who have won Emmys, Grammies, Oscars and Tonys. Barbra has won eight Grammies, and an Oscars for Best Actress in "Funny Girl" and Best Original Song, "Evergreen," the love theme from "A Star is Born."

Even though it is a very long book, it is well worth reading and gets many positive reviews.

THE ENGINEER'S WIFE TUESDAY NIGHT VFP BOOK CLUB SELECTION



THIS HISTORICAL FICTION BOOK is about the building of the Brooklyn Bridge and the people who had that dream.

The story tells of a woman of the 1800's i nvolvement in creating the bridge. Emily Roebling was a woman whose choice in life was to marry, raise a family and follow her husband's path in life as was the custom for young women at that time.

Her father-in-law, John Roebling, immigrated from Germany, trained in infrastructure and obtained his wealth through his creation of cable wire. It was his dream to build suspension bridges and, in particular, link Brooklyn and Manhattan Boroughs in New York City,

The project starts, but a freak accident to John causes him a foot injury—and when it was was improperly cared for—causes his death.



His son, Washington Roebling, and Emily's husband take over the job of building the bridge.

John also develops health issues connected to his on-site-involvement descending to great depths underwater and becomes incapacitated. It is here where Emily becomes vital to the building process. She is prepared due to her knowledge and intelligence. She becomes the messenger for her husband to the site and also vital in obtaining financial help which, at times, was an issue.

Most of the information in the book is factual but the author chose to introduce P.T. Barnum as a person involved with Emily. This is total fiction.

What is important is that Emily Roebling received recognition for her achievement. She went on to be involved in women's rights and the book leaves you with insight as to how it must have been for a woman to be in a man's world at that time frame.

It is an interesting read and can be supplemented with a *Youtube* video produced by the Brooklyn Bridge historical society.



FIRE SAFETY: DO YOU HAVE FAMILY

INSURANCE? ■ Ed Pfeiffer, Firefighters Preventing Fires, LLC

NOTE: Ed Pfeiffer has been a member of the Hartsville Fire Co. for 56 years. He served as Fire Chief for 16 and presently serves as President. He was the Fire Marshal in Warwick Township for 25 years. He began updating smoke detectors and created Firefighters Preventing Fires, LLC 3 years ago. All detectors have a 10 year life. Pushing the test button only tests the detectors ability to make noise. It doesn't test the detector's ability to sense smoke. EVERY HOMEOWNER BUYS FIRE INSURANCE in response to the possibility of a fire. None of that money provides any level of protection for the family. Family Insurance is described as a series of smoke detectors that sound the alarm whenever one of the detectors in the series senses smoke. The earliest warning of smoke in the house provides the greatest amount of time to escape. Not knowing there is smoke in the house can lead to a fire.

Adequate Family insurance requires all detectors to be interconnected, and that they be less than 10 years old. Manufacturers of smoke detector only warranty their products for 10 years. Any detectors over 10 years old are subject to failure at the most critical time.

How much have you spent on Fire Insurance in the past 10 years? How much have you spent on Family Insurance in the past 10 years?

Family Insurance is often overlooked and not given the attention it deserves. The costs of Fire Insurance and Family Insurance are not equal, and they are not all financial. For example, how do you put a price on a lost family member?

Wireless, Interconnected smoke detectors cost approximately \$50. each, and every room in the house needs one, excluding bathrooms and closets. A typical 4-bedroom home requires 7 detectors; one in each bedroom, one on each floor (including the basement). If the basement has divided into rooms, finished or unfinished, an interconnected detectors is required for each room. Finally, to complete the requirements for Family Insurance, a single carbon monoxide/smoke detector is added at an additional cost of approximately \$40. The price of Family Insurance is approximately 5% of your annual fire insurance premium, when you compare the once every 10-year purchase of detectors (with 10-year batteries, no battery changes for 10 years) vs 10 years of Fire Insurance premiums.

All new homes are required, by fire codes, to be built with interconnected smoke detectors in every bedroom and on each level of the home. If you live in a home built before the adoption of these codes, wireless smoke detectors provide a cost-effective way to upgrade the fire safety of your home to match the safety of a newly-built home. If you presently have a hard-wired smoke detection system, many options are available to expand your system using wireless detectors. Choosing the correct detectors for your home may require professional help.

Smoke is nature's way of providing a pre-fire warning. Smoke must always have a clear path to a detector. Doors block that path. Typical kitchen, dining room and living room areas only require one detector (no doors). When you are asleep, knowing your bedroom detector will alert you of smoke's presence somewhere in your home, provides a great deal of comfort.

Wireless interconnected technology provides you the ability to install Family Insurance to your home. Why buy Fire Insurance and fail to provide Family Insurance? Protect your investment and your family.

ity of the Association "supplying better mulch in our mulch beds"

When a certified landscaper is asked about supplying "better mulch", they equate that to, mulch that has a bolder and richer color, versus "natural mulch", which what is presently used here at the Villas at Five Ponds.


The Villas at Five Ponds has always stayed away from bolder richer color mulch, for three reasons, because of the way it is produced, it is far less "pet friendly" than natural mulch, it does not do a better job of retaining moisture to facilitate healthy growth of the shrubs planted in the mulch beds and finally it costs more.

However, to some of our residents the term "better mulch" means, mulch that is in some way treated to decrease or eliminate weeds in the home mulch beds. That too would bring significant extra cost to our Association members.

In addition, our by-laws clearly state that "weeding of the home

mulch beds" is the responsibility of the Homeowner, not the Association. Therefore; The Villas at Five Ponds Board has concluded it alone doesn't have the authority to authorize the expense of in essence "weeding the home mulch beds", that change would require a vote, following the procedures laid in our by-laws, in order to change the by-laws by vote of Association members.
