



- The City, in conjunction with NYS, undertook leveling the facility and environmental remediation between the years 2011-2012.

Site Characteristics

- "Kellogg Pond" filled in between approximately 1935 and 1965 with materials from unknown sources.
- Shopping plaza constructed in 1965 and was in use until ca. 2010, at which point the Site became vacant.
- ► 3.4 Acres
- 32,000 sq/ft Shopping Plaza
- Montgomery County EPA Community Wide Assessment Grant
 - ▶ \$300,000 Phase 1 & Phase 2 complete.
 - Fill material at the Site is approximately 13-18 ft thick, consisting of glass, bricks, ceramics, wood, and burnt garbage.
 - Soil throughout the Site is impacted by various Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs), Semi-volatile Organic Compounds (SVOCs), metals, pesticides, and PCBs exceeding regulatory criteria.





