

In between the parades, Shriners and their Ladies had the opportunity to participate in site-seeing tours, Ladies Brunch and Luncheon, enjoy a concert by the Yelduz Shrine Chanters from Aberdeen, SD, shopping in the Shrine Marketplace, dinners, cookouts and a block party with great music. 

USA EDUCATION DIRECTOR 2016



My unit director, Robert "Barrels" Neelan, was researching the origin of the Syrian Shrine Clown unit. He found out that our unit dates back to around 1946. That started a whole new research discussion. We were wondering if our unit was the oldest and first Shrine Clown unit. I went to the ISCA Face book page and put the question out there. Sorry to

disappoint you Barrels. Thanks to Lyle "Foxxy" Fox I found a unit that predates ours by about 8 vears.

So how did Shrine Clowning get started? Who started it? Where did it start? Here is their story.

yes that's right Madison Wisconsin. Zor Temple had the first Shrine Clown unit started in 1938. geographic area 4 other Clown units were formed The crowds increased at their Circus and children got bored waiting for the show. The wife of Noble suggested why don't some Nobles dress Sawdusters, Eau Claire WI.1976, Zor Flambeau up as Clowns and entertain the children for Clowns, Park Falls 1983. Crowd control. Yes guys it was a Ladies idea. Noble Wells persuaded his friend Noble Sverre Brathen, a circus buff who headed the International Circus Fans' Association, to have Association was the Early ISCA. some of the members make up as Clowns. The Zor Shrine Clown unit was about to be born!

Noble Brathen organized a group of nine Nobles in May of 1938. Can you say first of Mays? Publication. We would love to hear from you. This was the first Shrine Clowns used in a Shrine activity. This group, due to a cautious Divan did not become an official Unit with a charter until 1945.By then the Zor Unit had 40 members.

The original group of nine organized in 1938 were, Swerre Brathen, Carl Danhouser, Otto Gilbertson, D. John Leigh, Clyde Wilson, James McDonald, Olaf Strand, Frank Moore, and Richard Widman. This was a very respectable group of prominent attorneys, business men, a bakery owner, the treasurer of the city of Madison, and Madison Fire Chief.



The original unit comprised of mostly solemn The first Shrine Clowns were in Badger Country; White Faced clowns, the Aguste and tramp clowns. Because the Zor Temple covers a large Zor Temple. The Funsters, Rapids WI. a 1963, Firehouse Jesters 1972, Lacrosse WI.

tal had done for them, so they were very pleased to have their son receive treatment at Shriners.




Grand Marshal
