Total attendance for the 6 shows was 30,816, with the largest show on Saturday afternoon at 6863, and the smallest crowd Saturday night at 3678. The colder weather (no snow or freezing rain) seemed to bring out more spectators.

Lots of positive comments on this year's George Carden - William Cunningham produced show. Several new acts: horses, clowns, high wire walkers, and the quick-change clothes artists. The 2 biggest returning acts must be the Windy City Tumblers and David Smith Jr. -The Human Cannonball.

Unfortunately, we had to rebill 17 people for used and unpaid tickets totaling \$1093.00,

Explanation of Zor dues

Every Shriner must pay these dues annually (unless they're a perpetual member)

- Zor's annual membership dues are **\$70.00** per year based on following:
 - **\$50.00** Temple dues (Zor's dues) are
 - (This amount may vary from Temple to Temple)
 - **\$5.00** Hospital (Dues are the same for each Temple)
 - \$15.00 Imperial per capita (The same for each Temple)
- Associate dues for Zor are **\$50.00**
- Perpetual members may make a one-time payment for life.
- Perpetual dues for 2015 would total **\$1600.00** based on the following:
 - \$1000.00 Zor's annual dues (20 years times \$50.00)
 - \$150.00 Hospital (30 years x \$5.00)
 - \$450.00- Imperial per capita (30 years x \$15.00)
- A noble cannot be in arrears to pay the \$1600.00
- Nobles that owe for this year are in arrears \$70.00
- Therefore they would need to remit \$1670.00

A Noble may pay any or all perpetual amounts. Example: Per capita dues may increase and you have paid the perpetual amount, \$450, you would experience a saving over that of an annual dues payer.
