The total raised, in the past 20 years, is over \$260,800 for Shriners Hospitals. Fantastic!!

On Saturday January 24th, the Divan had a planning meeting and training session that was held at the Sparta Lodge. There are a number of items the Divan will be working on this year in addition to membership. Two years ago, the Long Range Planning Committee prepared a survey that was sent to the Nobles to fill out and return. Thank you to the committee for their dedication and hard work in compiling the information. The Divan will be working on some of the top issues identified in that survey. One goal is to improve the communication between the Divan and the Nobility. In order to do that, we need accurate information on each Noble's address, email, and phone numbers. reviewing and making any recommended changes in our investment policies. In future issues of the Zephyr, I will report on other projects and policies the Divan is working on.

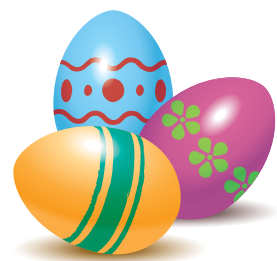
