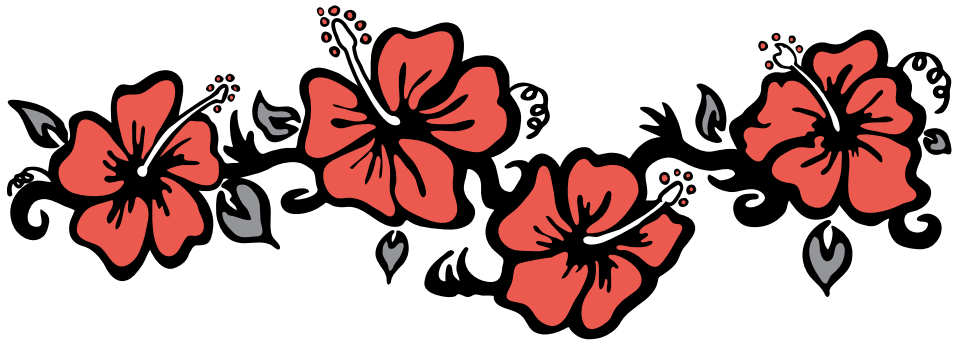

Potentate Bob, who has been riding for over 10 years, HAS AGREED to do a demonstration on his biking skills from the pier so everyone can watch.

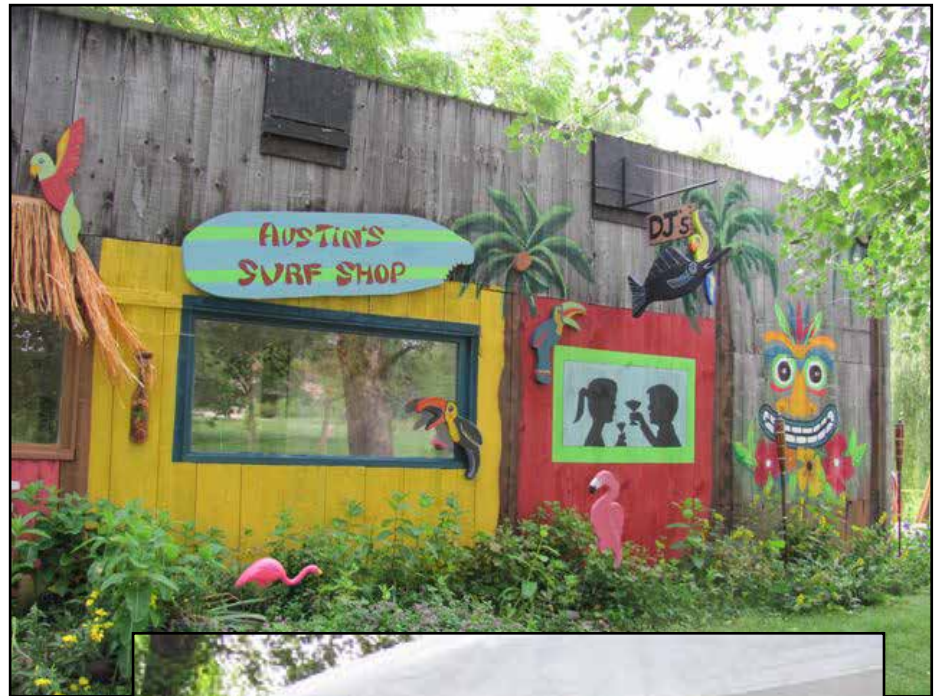

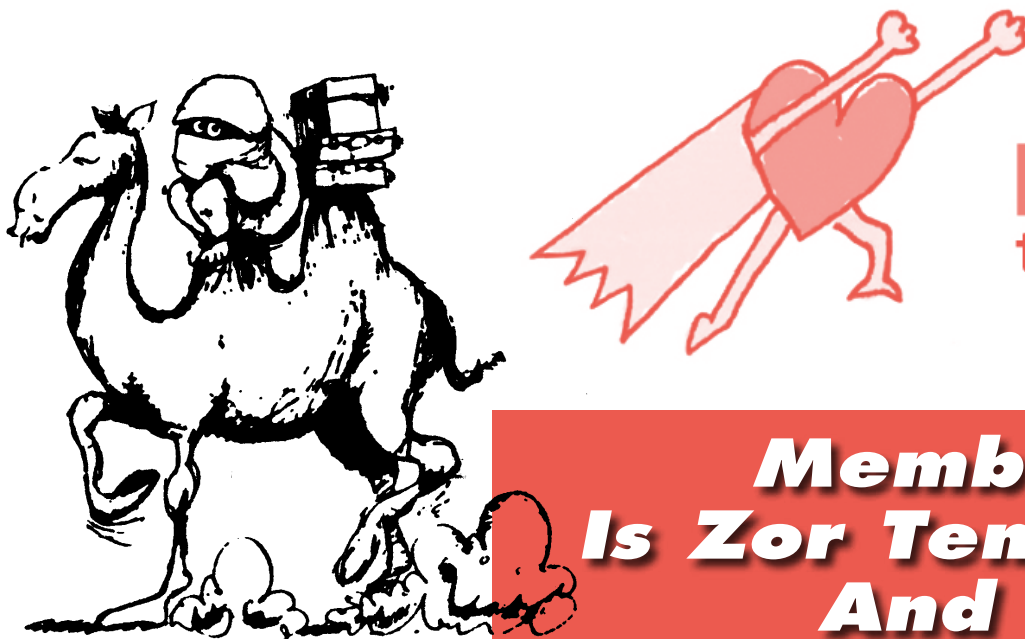

ZOR SHRINERS QUARTERLY MEETING MINUTES

April 27, 2013 – Wausau Recorded by Dale Olson, Treasurer

Potentate B. Gorsuch called the meeting to order at 2:30 pm. - 38 Nobles present.

K. Gant gave the opening prayer and all present joined in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Potentate R. Gorsuch appointed D. Olson to act as Recorder for the meeting.

Potentate R. Gorsuch asked for a motion to approve the agenda as distributed, Motion by M. Severson, second by G. Cuskey to approve the agenda – carried. Potentate R. Gorsuch asked for a motion to minutes of the Quarterly Meeting of October 9, 2012 as printed in the Zephyr. Motion by M. Severson, second by J. Harker to approve the minutes – carried.

Treasurers Report: D. Olson presented abbreviated financial report as of March 31, 2013 shows Total Revenues YTD \$203,392, Total Expenses \$103,720 for a gain of \$99,672, with unrealized Wells Fargo gain of \$28,071. Net Operational income less Depreciation \$127,744 less Depreciation of (\$15,448), leaving a net surplus of \$112,296. As of March 31, 2013 end of the month balances show Checking Accounts \$178,185, Membership Account \$35,293, less bills to be paid in 30 days \$28,465. Cash Reserves, Hospital Patient Transportation Account \$161,001, Hospital Transportation Account Tampa \$250,058, Building Improvement Accounts \$429,513, Long Term Investment Accounts \$974,770 and Perpetual Membership \$29,714. Motion by D. Bomkamp, second by T. Nelson that the report be accepted – carried.

Membership Report: B. Calverley reported as of March 31, 2013 there were 1,617 members and 13 Associate members for a total membership of 1,630 compared to a total of 1,706 as of September 30, 2012. As of April 24, 2013, 163 Nobles had not yet paid their 2013 Dues. Motion by T. Nelson, second by W. Trouten that the report be accepted – carried.

Departed Nobles: Chaplain K. Gant

read the names of our departed Nobles that were reported in the first quarter, and gave a prayer for the 34 departed Nobles.

Committee Reports: Trustees Report: D. Jones of the Trustees, reported the front lobby remodeling was 99% complete. Minor housekeeping and maintenance projects continue. Analysis of the heating and air conditioning equipment and requirements is in process, with projected presentation of recommendations in the second quarter. But along with this time of year comes an extra dose of responsibility for parents. FIREWORKS SAFETY

- Fireworks that are thought to be safe, like sparklers, can reach temperatures above 1000 degrees and can burn users and bystanders
- Mishandled fireworks can result in severe burns, scars and disfigurements that can last a lifetime
- Families should attend community fireworks displays handled by professionals rather than using fireworks at home



LAWNMOWER SAFETY

- Only use a mower with a control that stops the mower blade from moving if the handle is let go
- Children younger than 16 years old should not be allowed to use ride-on mower. Children under 12 years old should not use walk-behind mowers
- Wear appropriate shoes and clothing
- Never smoke or use any type of flame around gasoline
- Gasoline has one purpose – to fuel an engine



DOG SAFETY

- Consult with a professional to learn what breeds of dogs are the best fit for your household
- Dogs with histories of aggression are not suitable for households with children
- Be sensitive to cues that a child is fearful or apprehensive about a dog. If a child seems frightened by dogs, wait before bringing a dog into your household
- Spend time with a dog before buying or adopting it. Use caution when bringing a dog into a household with an infant or toddler.
