

The latest update on unpaid members is about 160 unpaid compared to last year's 200 but keep in mind we have about 100 less members than we had a year ago.



Shriners from all over the upper Midwest gathered at the Shriners Hospital for Children® on Saturday, May 17th for their annual Shrine Hospital Day.

The day featured music during registration and lunch, followed by special guided tours of the hospital which is the primary focus of the international fraternal charity.

In his remarks during his official welcome, Raymond G. McCabe, the chairman of the board of governors of the

Hospital noted the new relationship just formed with Mayo Clinics in Rochester on March 27 of this year. McCabe said this will open many new opportunities for patients as well as more patient care connectivity.

This will also mean 8 Mayo doctors will attend patients at the Hospital, giving the staff another dimension of service.

McCabe also mentioned the recent decision to accept insurance, which has added an additional \$5 million to the operating budget. During the year 2007, the Shriners

Hospitals for Children® suffered a decline in funding. The acceptance of insurance will go a long way in supporting the philanthropy of Shriners nationwide.

The assembled Shriners also heard reports from the Shriners Hospital® Chief of Staff Dr. Cary H. Mielke, Women's Auxiliary chair Marjorie Park, and Daughters of the Nile Queen of Mat Sha Temple #62, Sara Malewitz. Current and past patients and parents also gave their stories.




3rd Annual Cycle and Classic Car Ride





Specialty care beyond the burn

Shriners Hospitals for Children Referral Cards are Working!

Shriners Hospitals for Children - Cincinnati doesn't always know who their patients will be or what type of injuries they will have, but one thing is for sure, the new referral cards the Shriners are distributing are definitely bringing these patients to our hospital. Shriners across the map are busy taking every opportunity to pass out the new referral cards to families, directing patients to Shriners Hospitals for Children for treatment and specialty care.

As we enter the summer season and outside activities increase, the need to reach out to patients and families becomes even greater. The summer months bring thoughts of pool safety, bike helmets and sunscreen; but also a host of other safety concerns. Parents should be aware of; lawnmower accidents, dog bites and other traumatic injuries that can cause devastating injuries to children; wounds and disfigurements that can have an impact on children for the rest of their lives. All of these injuries can be treated at Shriners Hospitals for Children – Cincinnati and the Shriners' referral cards are helping our hospital to connect with these patients.

The referral cards are working to highlight the specialty work being done at Shriners and are also helping to build a level of patient satisfaction. 
